# Cobalt budget committee to reconvene

COBALT - "We're on a slippery slope right now with our finances," said Cobalt Councillor Harry Cooper.

He was speaking at Cobalt council's committee-of-the-whole meeting August 1 and noted council has been recently warned by its auditor about the long-range picture for the town's finances, and he is concerned.

He said he has compiled a list of 16 suggestions to help Cobalt either save or bring in money.

Cooper proposed presenting his ideas to Cobalt council at its next meeting, but acknowledged that "some of (the suggestions) would have to require going into closed session." Closed sessions can be held by a council when identifiable individuals or properties are being discussed, and also for legal matters.


A few examples he put forward were to charge rent for the use of the Classic Theatre, and to reduce town staff. He also suggested the town could do its own garbage collection. The town could also partner with Coleman Township for some services, he also believes.

Cooper agreed to email his list to town manager Steven Dalley before the next council meeting.

Councillor Doug Wilcox requested a financial report from town staff to learn whether the town is on track with its budget which has already been set out for the year.

Mayor Angela Adshead acknowledged that the town has experienced some costs this year that were unexpected.

Dalley said the budget committee will be reconvening, "hopefully later this month," to discuss the unexpected costs and the impact on the 2023 budget.

Sell or

keep it?

The City of Temiskaming Shores has revealed their intentions to sell off a section of public lands in New Liskeard near Lake Temiskaming.

The deadline to submit comments about the move to sell the public lands is August 25.

The 3.4-acre waterfront property is east of Riverside Place and includes two buildings in need of repair, says the city.

The city is perhaps balking at the costs of repairs to the building and looking at ways to profit from the sale of the waterfront property.

But the city must understand those lands are used by a variety of user groups, like the Temiskaming Pleasure Horse Club, The New Liskeard Fall Fair and the recent Village Noel, which moved its location last year from the downtown core of New Liskeard.

The sale of the property to a private group could drastically affect the way the waterfront is used in that location.

That section of the New Liskeard waterfront has been beautifully developed over many years.

Selling the property could affect the ambience, character and functionality of the waterfront for residents and visitors alike.

The New Liskeard waterfront is considered one of the most important amenities for public use that the city owns.

Commercial development without public input could change the entire landscape of the waterfront area in that location.

Once the property is sold, the public (the taxpayer) might have no say as to what can be developed in that location and that could be dangerous.

What if a developer decided to build a large condominium building at that location?

Not only would you risk the health of nearby Lake Temiskaming from such development, but what would be the esthetics of a large housing unit in that location?

Plenty of public input and thought needs to go into a major decision to sell off any public land that borders Lake Temiskaming.

# The fight for online access

Well, we knew it was going to happen, and it finally has.

Meta, the parent company of Facebook and Instagram, has started blocking Canadian news from its social media platforms.

Why did one of the world's richest companies decide to take this drastic step? In short, it doesn't like the fact that after making money from the hard work of Canadian journalists for almost 17 years that they're now required to fairly compensate the content creators. It basically wants to have its cake and eat it too - Facebook wants to make money from news, but is unwilling to provide the financial resources to ensure that reliable, trustworthy news can be created.

But wait a minute, don't newspapers choose to post their content on Facebook and Instagram? Why should they be able to make use of the social media tools for free and then expect payment for items that they themselves chose to share? Isn't this just a case of newspapers not adapting to the times?

Hogwash.

What newspapers are doing on social media is the same thing that's been done for decades with print editions. Many titles have long histories of distributing copies, often free of charge, to local coffee shops, libraries and seniors' residences in order to improve access to their content and to keep locals informed of the important community news of the week. Now, imagine that those coffee shops, libraries and seniors' residences turned around and sold or rented those copies to patrons and residents and kept all the money for themselves. That doesn't seem right, does it? Well, that's exactly what Facebook, Instagram and Google

are doing when they sell ads based on the traffic that quality community journalism brings to their sites.

So, rather than helping to promote democracy and civic inclusion, as well as preventing the growth of unchecked misinformation on their platforms, the online giants have decided to place their bottom lines ahead of what's best for their users. However, despite protests to the contrary, I think they're going to discover just how important the presence of local news content on their sites is to them. Several large advertisers have already pledged to stop advertising on the platforms, and, if I were a betting man, I'd wager that the amount of time that Canadians spend actively engaging Facebook (one of the company's key success metrics) will also go down as readers look elsewhere for the news and information they crave.

Fortunately, since Facebook, Instagram and Google don't create news, the news they're



especially the retinas, and can increase your risk of conditions like cataracts. To prevent these unfortunate — and sometimes irreversible — consequences,

And of course, you can always get your news from the print edition.

Those of us who have chosen to make a career in jour-


nalism and newspapers understand the duty we have to keep our communities informed, to ensure that those with power don't abuse it and to help promote a sense of belonging and pride in the places we call home. However, we can't do it for free and we shouldn't have to sit by while others earn money from our passion and efforts while contributing nothing to the cost of its creation. It's like believing that as long as we're paying the grocery stores, the farmers can get



nothing.

In that world, we'd all starve. In the world that Facebook, Instagram and Google seem to want to create, we'd all be starved for credible, reliable local news.







#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION **CITY OF TEMISKAMING SHORES MARINA DEVELOPMENT**

#### THE BASICS

The City of Temiskaming Shores is initiating a process to investigate the potential sale and development of the New Liskeard Marina property. The property is located at 199 Riverside Drive in New Liskeard. It is approximately 3.57 acres in size, is zoned C1 in the City's zoning by-law and designated Recreation Area in the City's official plan.

The property has been underutilized by the City while the building is also in need of \$270,000 in renovations in the near future to maintain current service levels. To best understand the community's desires, City Council has directed staff to open a public consultation asking for input on the property's potential development by the private sector to better inform an Expression-of-Interest (EOI) process.

Regardless of any development, the City intends to maintain ownership of the boardwalk along the water's edge and any submissions from developers must have provisions for maintaining public access to the marina docks and boat launch.

#### THE PROCESS

The City is first gathering the public's input on the property to better inform potential developers about the needs and desires of residents. Following the public consultation process, City staff will create a report summarizing all the public comments received and release the EOI.

The EOI process is expected to conclude in late October with Council ultimately deciding if the City will then enter into negotiations with any potential developer. The EOI process does not tie the City to the sale of this property and any potential development will still be required to complete the necessary public consultation processes for zoning and official plan changes (if required).




