Teme-Augama **Anishnabai** oppose Metis claims

TEMAGAMI - Up to 30 members of the Teme-Augama Anishnabai and the Temagami First Nation gathered outside the North Bay office of the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) on September 18.

They were there to protest the ministry's support of a cabin built on N'dakimenan, the territorial land of the Teme-Augama Anishnabai (TAA).

The cabin construction is supported by the Metis Nation of Ontario (MNO), and builders of the cabin claim membership in the MNO.

The TAA and Temagami First Nation have now issued an eviction notice to the MNO and to the two men who constructed the cabin.

TAA Second Chief John Turner related in a telephone interview he is a descendant of the original occupants of the land where the cabin has been constructed at Pond Lake, south of Lake Obabika.

He said the cabin is within "our indigenous territory which we defended and went to court over."

He explained that the Teme-Augama Anishnabai have been working to identify all descendants of the original peoples of the N'dakimenan (Our Land).

Turner said he and other descendants of the original occupants of the area where the cabin is now sitting would know if there had been a Metis settlement in the area in the early 1900s.

"I understand there's other First Nations having similar issues," he noted.

The people who constructed the cabin have been contacted and asked to provide evidence that they are Anishnabai relatives, but to date that information has not been provided, he said.

He expressed the unfairness of the fact that, in the past, descendants of the people who had lived on the land prior to colonization had been jailed for fishing Continued on 9



Livability

Last weekend was absolutely beautiful for the New Liskeard Fall Fair.

The sunny warm weather and large crowds made the 121st fair a huge success.

Anyone who attended the event would have seen that the organizers were using every inch of available property surrounding the fair grounds.

Horse trailers and other vehicles were parked on or by the grounds where the City of Temiskaming Shores has just put out an Expression of Interest notice.

The Expression of Interest is a plan to gauge interest from developers on this piece of property located near Lake Temiskaming.

This is a 3.5-acre parcel of land that includes green space and the New Liskeard marina and buildings.

The City has received feedback through a survey on its website about how people feel about developing, leasing or selling that property located near Riverside Place in New Liskeard.

This process was called the Marina Public Consultation survey.

The mayor and council are going to continue to seek input about how to develop that area.

Temiskaming Shores is a group of people who have vehemently opposed the sale or development of the New Liskeard marina location.

This group of residents feels development of that property could risk the very integrity of the waterfront and how it has been developed and nurtured over the years.

They feel council is a bit tone deaf to taxpayers' concerns.

The temperature on this issue can be turned down by council reassuring taxpayers the City will not act in a hasty manner concerning this valuable green space.

There are arguments that say green spaces are good for the econ-

Development proponents for that waterfront property say inaction could lead to a financial black hole for the City.

Life cycle of a snapping turtle

The lifecycle of common snapping turtles is nothing short of miraculous.

I often see a large snapping turtle hauling itself onto a sunny log or lifting its bulky body onto a sandy beach while paddling in my canoe.

I marvel at how prehistoric they look.

Each spring I see females laying their eggs in the soft gravel shoulder of area roadways.

After having mated in April or May, a female snapping turtle will emerge from her watery home and crawl to a sandy spot to lay her eggs in June

Once she's found her spot and dug out a deep hole with her claws she may deposit upwards of 50 eggs.

She then covers the hole with sand and abandons the site.

Hopefully predators like raccoons and foxes won't find the nest and eat the eggs.

Female turtles tend to return to the same nest year after year if the laying process is successful

A female snapper has been returning to the same spot near Loon Lake for five years according to my friend Tim Moore.

He watches for her each spring and knows roughly where she will deposit her precious cargo.

Once she is done laying her eggs he covers the nest with a wooden wire protector and surrounds it with reflective cones in case a car should endanger the nest.

He is, for all intents and purposes, the snap-

ping turtle whisperer.

It takes upwards of 20 years before they are able to reproduce so when they do lay eggs it is important they be protected.

If the nest remains untouched, the baby turtles will lay dormant for 90 to 100 days.

They will eventually nose their way out of the nest when the time is right.

Last weekend the time was right for 41 baby snapping turtles to emerge from their sandy home and head for nearby Loon Lake.

Tim found some of the tiny babies on the roadway and carried them gingerly to the lake.

Can you imagine being in a dark place for 96 days and then coming out to bright sunlight and having to adjust your eyes to find your way to water?

When they were placed on the shore of Loon
Lake it took them a while before they swam off
to find a safe place to spend the upcoming winter.

They are as cute as a button and about the size of two toonies.

During the winter months they will reduce their body temperature and heart rate, requiring only a small amount of oxygen that passes through their skin during their long siesta.

Kudos to Coleman Township for installing Watch for Turtle signs on their roadways.

I had never seen baby snapping turtles emerge from the nest. It was a complete thrill!

Nature is absolutely incredible isn't it?

Cervical Cancer—What You Should Know

Each year in Canada, more than 1,300 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and over 400 die from the disease. Almost all cases of cervical cancer are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV), which is preventable through the HPV vaccine. The publicly funded vaccine is provided to male and female students in every province and territory through school-based programs. Regular screening of adult women is also vital as cervical cancer caught at an earlier stage has a high survival rate. Most cervical cancer (67%) occurs in women aged 30-59.

Rick Factors

The main risk factor for developing cervical cancer is the sexually transmitted human papilloma virus (HPV) that infects the cervix.

Other risk factors for developing cervical cancer include:

- Becoming sexually active at a young age; having many sexual partners or having a sexual partner that has had many sexual partners.
- Smoking.
- The use of birth control pills for a long period of time.
- Giving birth to many children.
- · Having taken diethylstilbestrol (DES), or being the daughter of a mother who took DES.

Who Should Be Screened:

- · Women 21 and older who are or ever have been sexually active, should be screened regularly for cervical cancer.
- A trans man, or non-binary, assigned female at birth, and registered with their primary care provider as female, will receive invitations for cervical screening
- Women who have had a hysterectomy (an operation to remove all or part of the uterus) should talk to their doctor or nurse practitioner to see if they need to continue getting Pap tests.

Based on the latest clinical evidence, most women should be screened every 3 years. Regular screening can stop at the age of 70 if a woman has had 3 or more normal tests in the previous 10 years.

If you are due or overdue for cervical cancer screening, call your primary care provider today to schedule an appointment. Screening is the only way to find the early changes that might lead to cervical cancer.



Funding will support construction of a new barn, renovation of an existing structure, and the purchase of equipment, including a milking robot, collector, bale chopper and mixer, feed pusher, and manure pump.

TEM-PRO in Haileybury is receiving a repayable investment of \$91,048 to support scaling up and expanding the business.

Work includes building upgrades and renovations, manufacturing section improvements, tools and equipment, as well as website, e-commerce, and marketing tool development.

In an email, a FedNor spokesperson explained repayable contributions are either conditionally or unconditionally repayable.

Unconditionally repayable contributions must be repaid.

When it comes to conditionally repayable contributions, factors determine if repayment is required, the amount that is to be repaid - if any - and terms of repayment.

"Strong local economies rely on the growth of local businesses," said Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota in the release.

The strategic investments made by FedNor will allow businesses "to purchase equipment, increase production and find new ways to become more energy-efficient," he said.

TAA trappers also had to register their traplines on N'dakimenan, he continued.

He said it was a humiliation to have to go before court in the past to prove that they had the right to their land, and having the judge comment that the First Nation person they were addressing had a white mother.

"By today's standards that was very racist," said Turner.

"Today the Metis say 'I'm Indigenous,' and the MNRF say

'Okay, build.' It looks like the was created in 1993 as an On-MNO and the MNRF are in cahoots, honestly."

Temagami First Nation Chief Shelly Moore-Frappier stated in a press release that "N'dakimenan is the recognized homeland of the Teme-Augama Anishnabai. We are the only Indigenous People of N'dakimenan and the only bearer of inherent rights. Our established inherent rights come from continuous occupation over thousands of years. These are recognized facts. By contrast, the MNO

tario corporation and looks to the Governments of Canada and Ontario for recognition."

"This is our land and the MNO has no business building a cabin and hunting on our land. There are no Metis and there never was a Metis settlement here in N'dakimenan," said Teme-Augama Anishnabai Chief Michael Paul in the release.

"We are Teme-Augama Anishnabai. N'dakimenan is our homeland. I know I am right and those so-called Metis are squatters here," he said.

Turner said in the release that "In the case of the Teme-Augama Anishnabai and later the Temagami First Nation, we have thoroughly documented our history through oral tradition and early trade and church records. Further, anyone who could be described as 'Metis' was naturalized and adopted by the Teme-Augama Anishnabai exercising inherent jurisdiction. The MNO is riding on the coattails of colonial law to assert false claims to land rights

and manufactured Indigenous identity, with the backing of Ontario and Canada."

The Teme-Augama Anishnabai and Temagami First Nation say they have applied to join the Wabun Tribal Council's court challenge "to stop Canada's Bill C-53, an Act respecting the recognition of certain Métis governments in Alberta, Ontario and Saskatchewan, to give effect to treaties with those governments and to make consequential amendments to other Acts."


