MP Anthony Rota resigns House **Speaker position**

OTTAWA - Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota, who has held the position of Speaker of the House of Commons during the 43rd and 44th Parliaments, has stepped down from the position effective at the end of the day Wednesday, September 27.

Rota resigned after it was revealed that a resident of his constituency, who Rota had invited to attend when Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy addressed Parliament Friday, September 22, had previously served in a Nazi unit during World War II, along with other military duties, also fighting for Ukraine in later years. Rota had introduced the 98-year-old resident in Parliament as a former Ukrainian soldier and a war hero. The Members of Parliament, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, and Zelenskyy all applauded the former soldier.

It was later learned that the Nipissing-Timiskaming constituent had also served during World War II with a Nazi unit.

After the information came to light publicly, Rota apologized before the House of Commons, and on Tuesday announced his resignation from the position of Speaker.

Rota's Communications Officer Matthew Sookram stated in an email that "he is staying on as the MP."

Rota is a member of the governing Liberal Party and was elected to the Speaker post through a vote of all Members of Parliament. He first became Speaker of the House of Commons on December 5, 2019, and has maintained that position to this time, having been elected to the office twice by his fellow MPs.

On Tuesday, September 26, Rota issued a prepared statement from the Speaker's Office.

Maurice Ernest Mercier

It is with heavy hearts we share that Maurice Ernest Mercier, better known as Mousy, born in Cobalt, Ontario, went to rest in the early afternoon on Saturday, August 26, 2023.

Facing and conquering illness and injury much of his life, countless times he persevered through an incredible force of will, physical strength, stubbornness, Faith, and Love for and from his family. His story is worth telling.

Born in Cobalt as one of five children, he worked hard to provide for his family, even trying to fight the 1977 fire with a garden hose from the roof of his house. No matter how busy he was, he always made sure to spend quality time with those he loved. He loved and

respected nature and instilled this in many. These values were always in practice when fishing and hunting, asking permission to hunt personal lands, generously sharing his catches and as an active and vocal member of the Temiskaming Anglers and Hunters Association.


He had a tremendous work ethic and a drive to constantly do more, working as a hardrock miner and respected timberman for 30 years with Silver Fields, Agnico Eagle, and Teck Corona, before being forced to retire due to a mining accident at Detour Lake Mine in 1996.

We have so many fond memories of him: notorious Speedster Broomball defenceman, valued hockey and baseball player and coach, successful fisherman who always knew the best spots, avid hunter, boisterous player of crib with his best friend Beeson, able to find the best areas for blueberries, and always sharing from his passionately tended-to gardens.

Mousy was a beloved husband and father, Poppa to his "Munchkin," friend, teacher, and mentor to so many. Always sharing wisdom, ideas, lending a hand and opinion, he was a man of honour who would literally give you the shirt off his back. From meticulously shovelling snow for many on Dunning Drive (even in a wheelchair), to helping a friend clear wood or ingeniously fixing something, to getting everything ready so his party could fish and hunt impeccably, he was fearless, generous, loyal, and a man of his word who helped so, so many.

Mousy was larger than life, and the strongest person we've ever known. He had the biggest heart, always thinking of his family to the very last moments. We all knew that unmistakable gruff voice and growl, which was usually softened by the twinkle in his eye or mischievous grin.

He fought many illnesses, injuries, and the effects of working in mines for 30 years, he then battled cancer and its effects for over 20 years. He fought quietly, privately, and valiantly; told he would never walk again in 1996, not only did he walk again but he went back to work succumbing shortly after to the injury and retiring as a result. He learned he had cancer in early 2000, did



not stop fighting to the end; 20 plus surgeries, countless appointments and treatments, loss of multiple organs, multiple heart surgeries, and on and on ... but always surrounded by those who loved him and always miraculously pulling through ... which is why this is a shock to

After finding out his cancer had returned in June of this year, he almost gave up, but those of you who know him know that giving up was not in his character. He fought with every ounce of his strength and as a result we, and he, are blessed to have spent nine beautiful weeks following that final diagnosis together

enjoying every moment he had with close family and friends. We laughed at past stories, went fishing on the river, had meals and treats, ate fish he caught and cooked for us, played crib, had great discussions, worked in his garden, rode the four-wheeler, watched TV and were grateful ... together.

At 74 years of age, he leaves his beloved wife Emilie Mercier, son Darcy Mercier and his partner Carley Lay, daughter Rosanne Cummings and her husband Kenneth Cummings, his granddaughter Faith Cummings (aka "Munchkin"), daughter Liane Mercier and her husband Jeff Burke, and countless friends and family members all of whom will miss him dearly.

Surrounded by family and close friends in the last weeks and moments, he enjoyed a fulfilling life, and we are all richer and better for having known him.

Family first was his motto, and we continue to honour this in his memory, therefore a Celebration of Life will be announced and held at a later date, while the family processes this loss and to ensure all those from his family circle can attend in person.





EDITORIAL

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Saturday, September 30, marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a federal statutory holiday, coinciding with Orange Shirt Day. It is a day set aside to commemorate the residential school survivors and the Indigenous children who were taken from their families and who never returned home.

It is estimated over 150.000 First Nation. Metis and Inuit children were forced to leave their parents and their communities to attend residential schools.

The residential school system was operated from the 1800s until 1996, in large part by our government at that time and by the Anglican, Catholic, Methodist and Presbyterian churches.

The physical and emotional abuse that took place in those schools has scarred generations of Indigenous people.

It is estimated that 6,000 children died in the residential school system, according to Justice Murray Sinclair, who headed up the Truth and Reconciliation report.

We know there are ongoing searches at former residential schools across Canada where they are identifying suspicious sites on school grounds that may contain unmarked graves.

The Indian residential school experience is a dark time in Canada's past and hopefully we learn that we are all one song, one drum, one soul and we need each other.

Two thirds of Canadians say they knew nothing about the residential school experience from a survey completed by the Canadian Race Relations Council.

It's long past the time that we all educate ourselves on the physical, sexual and emotional abuse heaped on the children who attended those schools.

And that we come to a greater understanding of how we can live together in a respectful, harmonious way recognizing the inherent rights of all Canadians.

Prostate Cancer Awareness

Did you know?

- · Prostate cancer is the most common cancer to affect Canadian
- One in eight men will be diagnosed with the disease in their life-
- Over 90% of prostate cancer cases are curable if detected and treated in their earliest stages

Signs and Symptoms of Prostate Cancer

- · Difficulty urinating
- · Urgent need to urinate
- · Frequent urination, especially at night
- · Burning or pain when urinating
- · Inability to urinate or difficulty starting or stopping urine flow
- Painful ejaculation
- · Blood in the urine or semen

Risk Factors

While any man can develop prostate cancer, you may be at a higher risk if you are...

- Over 50: Age is the strongest risk factor for prostate cancer. Your risk increases starting at age 50, and most cases are diagnosed in men over age 65. Depending on your risk, your health care provider may recommend that you think about testing at an earlier age - as young as 40.
- Have a family history of prostate cancer: Your risk is higher if a first-degree relative (father or brother) has had prostate cancer. Your risk increases with each additional first-degree relative who has the disease.
- African or Caribbean: Prostate cancer is more common among men in these ethnic groups. (Men of Asian descent have lower risk.)

Don't Ignore Symptoms

The sooner symptoms are reported to your health care provider, the sooner testing to help diagnose and treat the problem can begin. Symptoms may be caused by prostate cancer or by another health problem.


Symptoms are not always present especially in the early stages of prostate cancer. If detected and treated in its earliest stages, the chances of survival are greatly increased. THU clearing the air on vaping and young people

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special/Staff) - The Timiskaming Health Unit wants to clear the air when it comes to vaping.

In a recent news release, the health unit said youth smoking rates are declining.

But it said that vaping – the use of e-cigarettes, battery-powered devices that turn a liquid into an aerosol that is inhaled – is on the rise.

On its website, the health unit says the heating process can expose users to harmful chemicals and contaminants.

Vaping even for a short time, it said, can cause coughing,

wheezing, shortness of breath, chest pain, mouth or throat irritation, headaches, dizziness and nausea.

The 2021 Ontario Student Drug Use and Health Survey found that 15 per cent of participating students in grades 7 through 12 reported vaping.

That's down from the 23 per cent reported in the 2019 survey, but up from the 11 per cent in the 2017 survey.

In contrast, only four per cent of respondents reported using tobacco cigarettes in 2021, and five per cent in 2019.

Nicotine continues to be

the substance most commonly vaped. In the 2021 survey, 84 per cent of e-cigarette users report vaping nicotine.

"The long-term effects of vaping are currently unknown, but we do know that nicotine addiction is real," said Dr. Glenn Corneil, the health unit's acting medical officer of health, in a media release.

"Using nicotine during the adolescent years can have harmful effects on the teen brain, which continues to develop until about age 25," Corneil said.

Keeping fire extinguishers healthy

(NC) - Fire extinguishers are an integral part of a home fire safety plan. the situation before using your extinguisher. If the fire is big or uncontrollable, evacuate your

Here are some expert-recommended tips to keep in mind:

EQUIP YOUR HOME

"Fire extinguishers should be placed on every level of your home and in common spaces like the kitchen, laundry room and garage," says Ashley Gocken, a First Alert fire safety expert with Resideo Technologies.

"Make sure to store extinguishers in easily accessible places, like under the kitchen sink or mounted on the wall."

KNOW YOUR ABCS

Fire extinguishers have specific ratings that indicate what kind of fire(s) they are designed to stop.

- Extinguishers with a Class A rating can put out fires caused by wood, paper, fabric and other common materials.
- Class B rated extinguishers are intended for fires fueled by flammable liquids such as gasoline.
- Class C rated extinguishers are meant for fires caused by electrical equipment, such as frayed cords.

For reliable protection, a multi-purpose, or ABC-rated, extinguisher is recommended, such as a rechargeable home model from First Alert.

REMEMBER TO PASS

Using a traditional fire extinguisher is simple if you remember the acronym PASS:

- Pull the pin. You hold the extinguisher with the nozzle pointing away from you and release the locking mechanism.
- Aim low. Point the nozzle of the extinguisher at the base of the fire.
- Squeeze the lever slowly and evenly.
- Sweep the nozzle from sideto-side.

ASSESS THE FIRE

In the case of a fire, assess

the situation before using your extinguisher. If the fire is big or uncontrollable, evacuate your home and call 911 immediately. If the fire is small enough for you to manage with a fire extinguisher, use the PASS technique to put it out. Remember, the most important thing is that you and others safely evacuate the home.

INSPECT EXTINGUISHERS REGULARLY

Regularly examine your fire extinguishers to help ensure they will function properly in the event of a fire emergency. Check your extinguisher's pressure gauge. If the pointer is in the green zone, your extinguisher is properly pressurized and ready for use. If the pointer is in the red zone, your fire extinguisher should be serviced or replaced. Remember, a fire extinguisher that has been discharged should never be stored without proper recharging by a certified professional.

ition to the very best of my abilities.


"I want to thank you, colleagues, for your support and collegiality during my tenure in the Chair. The work of the House is above any one of us; therefore I must step down as your Speaker.





lescence can negatively impact the parts of the brain responsible for learning, memory, concentration, and attention. It can also worsen symptoms of depression and anxiety, reduce impulse control, and cause behavioural problems."

The health unit said vaping products were originally marketed as a tool to guit smoking. But the variety of flavours has been criticized by many as encouraging vaping among young people.

The health unit is launching a "Clear the Air" campaign to educate young people and parents about the consequences of vaping and resources to help users quit.

On the consequence side,

the health unit notes that vaping on or within 20 metres of school property is illegal.


Contravening the law may mean a school suspension, a \$305 fine, and a possible court

The fine for providing vape or tobacco products to anyone under the age of 19 is \$490.

The health unit said it's working with school boards on "progressive enforcement" to keep school environments smoke-free and vape-free.

On its website, the health unit offers information about sources where youth and adults can find supports to help them quit tobacco or e-cigarettes.

They include an app known as Quash that offers customized tools to help users quit.






