Campus sculptures honouring truth and reconciliation

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff/Special) – There's a child-sized handprint at the base of a new statue at Northern College's Haileybury campus.

Visitors are invited to place their own hands on it, and reflect for a moment on the impact of residential schools in Canada, explained campus manager Tammy Mackey.

In a news release, Northern College said it commissioned the statue to honour those who survived Canada's residential school system and those who were lost to it.

The four identical bronze sculptures – located at campuses in Kirkland Lake, Moosonee and Timmins as well as Haileybury – were unveiled last month.

The college said the statues are a reminder of the innocence and sense of self that were stolen from Indigenous children and their families and communities, and the role that Canada and Canadian organizations played in that theft.

They also honour Indigenous strength survival, culture and connection.

Each bronze statue includes a young shawl dancer and grass dancer.

Sculptor Tyler Fauvelle of Lively incorporated other symbols that he hoped would resonate among First Peoples.

"The handprint on the Inuit drum, just above the Métis sash, is a mark of continuity," said Fauvelle in the release.

"Handprints are among the oldest symbols that humans, including children, have left behind for us to see, hundreds of generations later, so it was fitting to include them in these pieces."

The commissioning of the statues is part of Northern College's support for the pursuit of truth and reconciliation.

"An institution and its values are reflected in those who walk our halls and study in our classrooms," said Audrey Penner, Northern's president and CEO, in the release.

"We are truly a Northern College and thus our connection and commitment to Indigenous individuals, organizations and communities is more

Here are some October 11, 2023 stories...

- From October 17 through 19, Temiskaming Shores will become the first Northern host of an annual forum dedicated to agriculture, from a municipal, development and planning perspective.
- After reviewing public feedback, city staff are finalizing the draft of a new animal care and control bylaw for council to consider next month.

- During a recent Quilt of Valour ceremony, David McGuinness was presented with his very own Quilt of Valour by program representative Marg Harrison.
- The newly formed Temiskaming Thunder youth basketball program has received \$14,000 from the 100 Women organization.

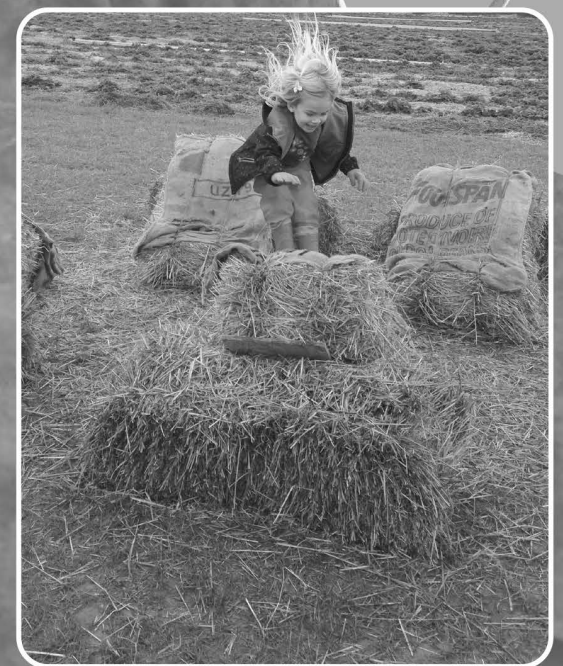

School zones

A school zone is any place, be it roadway or sidewalk, near a school.

School zones signs warn you that you are approaching a school zone so prepare to slow down and drive with extra caution.

Buses are turning onto school property and parents are dropping off or picking up their children from school.

The school zone speed limit in Ontario is between 30 and 40 kilometres per hour.

So why isn't this speed limit being enforced along Highway 11 north in front of Ecole catholique St-Michel?

This section of highway sees traffic speeding along at speeds way above the school zone limit.

There was construction on a section of roadway near the school recently and two Ministry of Transportation signs were placed at either ends of

the site. The signs had flashing lights alerting drivers to slow down for the construction taking place at that time.

The signs have since been covered up.

So it was okay to slow traffic down for construction purposes but not for the children and staff attending that school each and every day?

It is clear that large, heavy, 18-wheel trucks are speeding through that school zone and so are other vehicles, which may not be familiar with the fact there is a school in that location.

This area should have reduced speeds less than the posted 70 kilometre-per-hour signage because it is a school zone.

It does not matter that it is a major highway. The safety and security of children, staff and parents must be protected at all times.

I've been a reader all my life.

Nothing made me happier as a child than reading a book that transported my mind across continents and cultures.

When I climbed the steps to our Cobalt Public Library, located at that time above the Cobalt Post Office, I was eager to learn and to know and understand the world around me.

I knew I could do that through the written word.

I've read books that have made me happy, sad, angry, outraged, inspired and bewildered.

I read anything I could get my hands - cereal boxes, magazines, books and yes, newspapers.

But I've never read a single book or article that I thought should be banned.

When I saw that the American poet Amanda Gorman's brilliant poem, "The Hill We Climb," read at president Joe Biden's inauguration, was banned in a Florida school I was disappointed.

A parent complained that the poem had indirect hate messages contained therein.

Book bans are not something new but they are on the rise.

In a world where literacy rates are on the decline, banning books is not a good move.

The continued censorship from religious groups, right wing politicians and even some parents has largely been directed at people of color, the LGBTQ2 plus community and left wing politicians.

It seems to me that book banning may be a

slippery slope to banning public libraries altogether.

The idea to choke off tax dollars from libraries is a sure way to endorse a censorship mindset.

Every tax dollar invested in a public library is money well spent helping to promote literacy rates.

We know that, sadly, schools are divesting themselves of books in favour of technology-filled maker spaces.

Book banning is essentially limiting free speech, the cornerstone of democracy.

We should be doubly concerned about Facebook banning Canadian newspaper content, which is just as terrible as book banning, if not worse.

Remember when J. K. Rowling's books were under attack because people thought they encouraged witchcraft and the occult?

Those books were singlehandedly responsible for encouraging an entire generation of kids to read books, my daughter being one of them.

One of the most thought provoking books I have ever read was Ray Bradbury's *Fahrenheit 451* about the importance of books.

Let us remember book banning goes against our Charter of Rights and Freedoms, which upholds freedom of choice, expression and thought.

Defending books, print media and libraries is a battle we must take seriously.

Osteoporosis and Bone Mineral Density Testing

Osteoporosis is a condition that causes bones to become thin and porous, decreasing bone strength and leading to broken bones, especially the hip, spine, wrist and shoulder. Osteoporosis is sometimes confused with osteoarthritis. Just to be clear, osteoporosis is a bone disease and osteoarthritis is a disease of the joints and surrounding tissue.

Fast Facts:

- Osteoporosis can strike at any age and affects both men and women
- Building strong bones during childhood and adolescence can be the best defence against developing osteoporosis later in life
- Both men and women begin to lose bone in their mid 30s. As they approach menopause, women lose bone at a greater rate, from 2-3% per year
- At least 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will suffer from an osteoporotic fracture during their lifetime
- Over 80% of all fractures in people 50+ are caused by osteoporosis

Testing

Bone Mineral Density (BMD) testing is very important. This test is safe, painless and accurately measures the density of your bones. A BMD test can tell you whether or not you have osteoporosis and how likely you are to develop it in the future. It can help you to make decisions that may prevent fractures or further bone loss.

Who Should Get a BMD test?

- all women and men 65 years or older
- postmenopausal women and men 50-64 with risk factors for fracture including:
 - low bone mass identified on x-ray
 - parental hip fracture
 - high alcohol intake
 - current smoker
 - low body weight, i.e. less than 132 lbs or 60 kg
 - rheumatoid arthritis
- younger men or women (under 50) with a disease or condition associated with low bone mass or bone loss:
 - high risk medication (steroid use, aromatase inhibitors, androgen deprivation therapy)
 - uncontrolled hyperthyroidism
 - early menopause (younger than 45)

 than abstract, it factors into our daily lived reality, our operations, our perspectives, and our decision making – taking into account the impact we can have on the learners who seek to be empowered here.”

The college said the installation of the statues is an important step, but one that also created mixed emotions.

“Each statue unveiling is a very sombre experience, yet it also provided an experience filled with hope, strength, and pride for our Indigenous culture,” said Christina Kioke, the college’s manager of Indigenous services and initiatives.

“When looking at the statues, it feels as though the children depicted are full of life, dancing and celebrating who they are. The statues will act as a constant reminder of how beautiful and resilient we truly are as Indigenous peoples, providing an atmosphere at Northern College of acceptance, of belonging, of a strong future.”

The Haileybury sculpture is located on an elevated point of land between the college residence and the RockWalk

Park. From it can be seen the canvas tipi near the college’s entrance and, in the distance, Lake Temiskaming.

Other works by the sculptor can be seen in the area. They include the Shannen Koostachin statue on the New Liskeard waterfront and a statue of a prospector and his dog at the Toburn gold mine site in Kirkland Lake.

Trades in spotlight at Board ONE high schools

TIMMINS (Special/Staff) – The first woman to win a national boilermaker apprenticeship award is wrapping up a tour of District School Board Ontario North East high schools.

Leah McIntyre, who was one of ten winners of the apprenticeship award in 2017, began her tour of 10 schools in mid-September.

Stops included Timiskaming District Secondary, Englehart High and Kirkland Lake District Composite School September 25 through 28.

In a news release, the board said McIntyre’s goal is to empower more students to get involved in the trades.

Through her interactive presentation, she offered advice on how to join the trades and made students aware of under-represented groups in the skilled trades.

The board said students had the opportunity to learn about MIG (metal inert gas) welding techniques, rigging skills and workplace safety protocols.

McIntyre’s visit was made on behalf of Local Lodge 128 of the International Brotherhood of Boilermakers, headquartered in Sarnia.

It’s part of a series of Experience the Trades seminars, which are funded in part by the provincial and federal governments.

Temagami Chamber hosting Wild Game Dinner

TEMAGAMI - The Temagami and District Chamber of Commerce is holding their thirteenth Wild Game Dinner on Saturday, November 11.

In recognition of Remembrance Day, a 50/50 draw is being held with the proceeds being directed to the Temagami Royal Canadian Legion Branch 408.

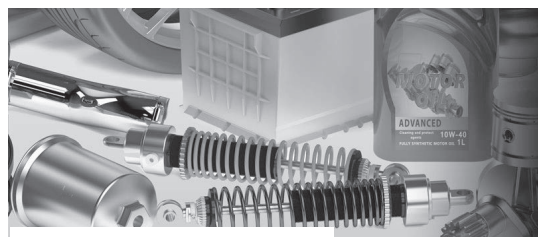

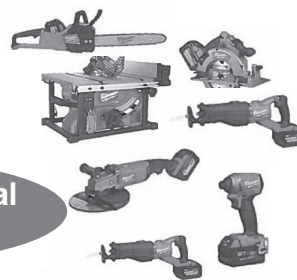

Fire extinguisher safety

A fire extinguisher is a vital safety device that can help suppress small fires before they escalate into dangerous blazes. This Fire Prevention Week, which takes place from October 8 to 14, 2023, brush up on your fire preparedness knowledge with this brief guide to fire extinguishers.

Firstly, it's important to familiarize yourself with the different types of fire extinguishers and their suitable applications:

- **Class A fire** extinguishers are suitable for ordinary combustibles like wood and paper
- **Class B** extinguishers are suitable for flammable liquids and gases
- **Class C** extinguishers are intended for use on fires involving appliances, motors and tools
- **Class D** extinguishers are designed for use on combustible metals
- **Class K** extinguishers are suitable for kitchen fires

You can also find multipurpose fire extinguishers that are suitable for more than one class, like A-B, B-C or A-B-C.

Fire extinguishers must be kept in prominent, easily accessible locations like mounted to a wall. Ideally, you should have a portable fire extinguisher on every floor of your home, especially near potential fire hazards like kitchens, garages and workshops.

The PASS technique

In the event of a fire, remember the PASS acronym:

- **Pull the pin.** Hold the extinguisher upright and pull the pin to break the tamper seal.
- **Aim low.** Point the nozzle or hose at the base of the fire.



- **Squeeze the lever.** Firmly squeeze the lever to discharge the extinguishing agent.
- **Sweep side to side.** Sweep the nozzle or hose from side to side, covering the base of the fire until it's completely extinguished.

By understanding how to properly use and store a fire extinguisher, you can enhance fire safety in your home.



Do you know the risk factors associated with breast cancer?




October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month across Canada. Even though this disease has many causes, several factors can increase the risk of contracting it. Here's an overview of some of those risk factors.


1. Previous conditions. You're more vulnerable to developing breast cancer if abnormal cells have been detected in your breasts in the past or if you've had previous abnormalities.
2. Age. More than 80 per cent of cases in Canada occur in women over the age of 50.
3. Alcohol. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), drinking one beer or one glass of wine per day is enough to increase your risk significantly.
4. Menstrual cycle. Early menstruation and late menopause are linked to the possibility of developing the disease.
5. Family history. Your risk of getting the disease is higher if your mother, sister or daughter has been diagnosed with breast cancer, especially if it was before menopause.
6. Pregnancy complications. Your risk increases if you've never carried a pregnancy to full term or if you've been pregnant after the age of 30.
7. Body weight. People who are obese have a higher statistical likelihood of getting breast cancer.
8. Taking hormones. Undergoing hormone replacement therapy for more than five years is associated with the onset of this type of cancer.
9. Physical inactivity. A sedentary lifestyle increases the likelihood of a breast cancer diagnosis.

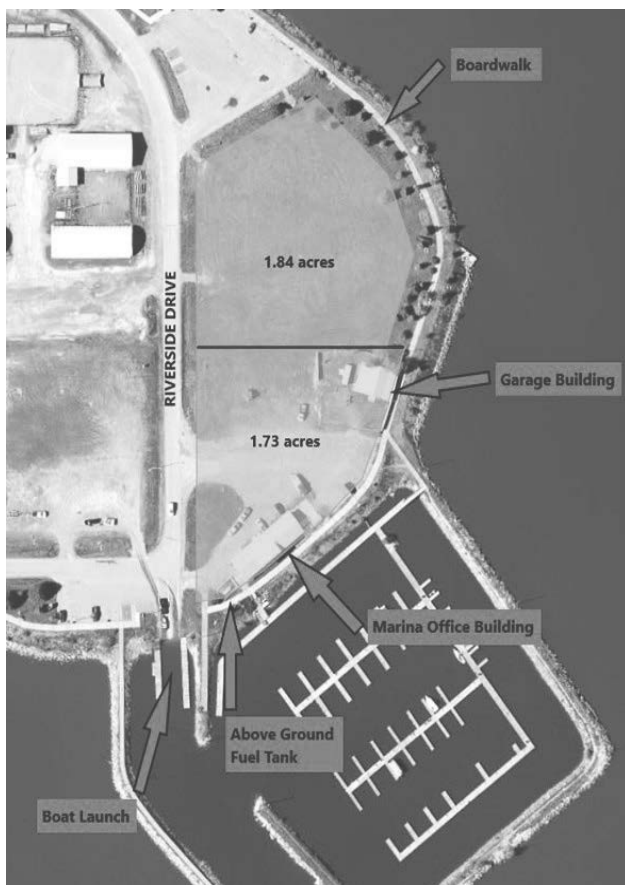

Cobalt pondering plaque replacement

created in 1926 to commemorate the contributions to the town of Willett Green Miller, the Cobalt Historical Society is now questioning whether the plaque can be replaced, and with what.

At Cobalt's committee-of-the-whole meeting October 3, Dalley commented of the vandalism, "It's not only our town. Every town seems to be being hit with it."

He said a similar replacement plaque would cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000.

"The concern is that if we get it, we put it back on, and it comes back off again."

He said the question of replacing the plaque is "a good discussion to continue with the Historical Society" until a solution is found.

The plaque disappeared from its stone mount in early September, along with a plaque from the town park where the cenotaph stands. A time capsule and the small plaque that covered it were also stolen.

The Willet Green Miller plaque was made to commemorate the "first provincial geologist of Ontario 1902-1925. To Cobalt he gave its name and a place among the great mining camps of the world. He read the secrets of the rocks and opened the portal for the outpouring of their wonderful riches. His monument is new Ontario."

The 39-inch by 24-inch plaque, one to two inches thick, was created by artist Dorothy Dick in 1926 and was commissioned by the Cobalt Kiwanis Club.
