City prepping for winter's challenges

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) - When winter will strike is unknown, but the city is trying to be ready. Temiskaming Shores council has approved its 2023-24 winter operations plan.

The plan and associated bylaws run almost 100 pages. It details how the city will handle plowing, salt and sand use, sidewalk and snowbank clearing, and schedules.

It will kick in on or about November 5, and end about five months later in early April.

"Every winter season brings new, unique and unpredictable conditions and circumstances that the Public Works Department is tasked with dealing with," wrote Mitch McCrank, the city's manager of transportation services, in a report to city council earlier this month.

"Over the past several winters, conditions have varied from relatively mild to extremely cold and from light snowfalls to extended periods of heavy snowfall."

He said the department does its very best to stay on schedule and ensure all can use the roads and sidewalks safely.

He said higher priority events can occasionally force a change in the schedule, and asked for residents' patience "as we tackle all events and know that we will get there."

He said the department is at full complement, with one staffer on leave and a temporary seasonal patrol person called in once again. More on 3





On ancient wings

Sandhill cranes (Antigone Canadensis) are migrating through our region and through Northwestern Quebec by the thousands.

These large birds have a distinctive call that you can hear from miles away.

My fascination began with these birds when on a clear spring morning three of them circled directly over my head and landed on Sharp Lake.

They were looking for a spot to rest and perhaps find food but the lake was still covered with ice.

I watched as they walked across the ice towards a small open section of the lake where beavers and otters appeared from time to time.

They drank water from the lake and then appeared to settle in for a brief rest period.

All the while I was snapping photos of these majestic birds with that special notch in their beaks, their orange eyes, red head feathers and large wingspans.

According to the Smithsonian Institution, sandhill cranes eat mostly plant materials but will snack on crayfish, minnows and snails if available.

They typically fly a mile above the ground but, according to some sources, can soar up to 20,000 feet high or more.

During migration they may travel over 200 miles in one day reaching speeds of 35 miles per hour.

Nature got it right with these birds. They are prehistoric birds having been around for over two million years. A sandhill crane fossil was found in the Macasphalt Shell Pit in Florida, estimated to be 2.5 million years old.

As I have observed these fascinating birds over the last few years I notice how they dance in the fields. This is their courtship dance where they jump up and spread their big wings, which can be up to seven feet wide.

Like common loons, sandhill cranes mate for life. The female is called a mare and the male is called a roan.

I think this must have been a good hatch year for the cranes as people in this region are seeing huge flocks of them landing in the fields this fall.

Perhaps climate change will force more of the birds to live in more northern climates like the bald eagle has done.

Not only are the sandhill cranes migrating through our area but hundreds of other species of birds are travelling to wintering grounds in the Southern United States, Mexico and South America.


Please take me with you, ha, ha.

I do not understand the relevance of this time change at all.

Until then, I shall enjoy when the sun hits a flock of cranes flying up from the fields, all golden and glowing with beauty and light.

ages that are blended together in a nearly abstract manner that softens the jarring contrasts of such diverse contents," said Greyson in his artist's statement.

"I have made beautiful paintings in a traditional manner that fully exploits the inherent qualities of oil paint. Despite their attractiveness the paintings depict the most dire interpretation of our failures but end with the obstinate invitation to keep trying."

Greyson related in a telephone interview that when he was a child living in London, Ontario, his mother frequently took the family to the London Public Library and Art Museum there. Among the gallery's collection were works by the Group of Seven. The family also attended curated art shows.

He said that in his late 20s he realized that "the Group of Seven made these iconic pictures of the Canadian landscape but they didn't really have much to say about how the landscape was changed."

He read letters and books with statements by the members of the Group of Seven and realized "they actually had a lot of sympathies with environmental ideas at that time." However paintings of the time did not tend to include that kind of content, he said.

Greyson resolved that his art would include content, and in particular content about "our dire environmental situation, particularly in the light of the past summer. We had all those fires." He said it is his understanding that the fires are "the result of the northern parts of Canada warming, and that we



can expect that kind of thing to go on until we manage to change that particular dynamic and get things to stabilize."

Greyson works in oil on hardboard, masonite, and also on canvas.

"I love oil painting," he said, and added that he enjoys going into the outdoors with his paint supplies and a thermos of coffee and spending three or four hours painting what he's seeing.

Greyson said he intends to continue exploring and documenting the region and humanity's relationship with na-


He studied painting at the Ontario College of Art (now OCAD University).

He has worked at the Isaac's Gallery in Toronto, and then as an artist working in advertising agencies and in interior decorating studios in Toronto. He has participated in a number of Toronto art shows.

Locally he has participated in a number of group exhibitions at the Temiskaming Art Gallery, and has also held a solo show at the Mezzanine Gallery at the Cobalt Classic Theatre.


Highway 11 Pilot Project - Detail Design of the 2+1 Roadway Model

THE PROJECT

The Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has retained AECOM Canada Ltd (AECOM) to undertake the Detail Design Study and Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for a 2+1 Roadway Model Pilot Project on Highway 11, between the City of North Bay and the Municipality of Temagami. A 2+1 highway is three-lane highway that typically involves a passing lane that changes directions approximately every two (2) to five (5) kilometres. The two locations selected for the Project include the following as shown on the key map:

- **GWP 5151-22-00**: Highway 11 from Sand Dam Road northerly to Ellsmere Road (13.8 km) located in the Townships of Sisk, Olive and Law in the District of Nipissing in the Electoral Riding of Temiskaming-Cochrane
- **GWP 5033-21-00**: Highway 11 from 4.6 km north of Highway 64 northerly 11.4 km to 340 m south of Jumping Caribou Road in the Townships of Merrick, Blyth, Notman and Lyman in the District of Nipissing in the Electoral Riding of Temiskaming-Cochrane.

The purpose of the Project is to reconstruct/ reconfigure and widen Highway 11 in the two locations to accommodate a 2+1 facility, rehabilitate other elements including frost heaves and pavement distress areas, and complete various operational improvements.



THE PROCESS

This study will follow the approved planning process for a Group 'B' Project under the Class Environmental Assessment for Provincial Transportation Facilities (Class EA).

Alternatives will be generated and evaluated based on technical and environmental factors and in consultation with Indigenous communities, public, stakeholders, municipalities and government agencies. A Public Information Centre (PIC) will be held during this Study to provide interested parties with the opportunity to discuss the Study and provide input to the Project Team.

Upon Study completion, a Transportation Environmental Study Report (TESR) will be prepared and made available for a 30-day public and agency comment period.

Notifications advising of the time and location of the PIC and of the availability of the TESR for comment will be published in local newspapers, mailed or e-mailed to those on the Study mailing list, and information will be made available on the Study website.



His work is in private and corporate collections across Canada, including Peterborough Regional Health Centre, SickKids Toronto and Siemens Canada, as well as in Germany, Netherlands, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States,.

Niezen stated that he is partly self taught and studied at Vrije Akademies in The Hague and Delft, Netherlands, (drawing and painting), at the Art School of Peterborough (painting), and at the Haliburton School of the Arts (printmaking). He was born in The Hague, the Netherlands, and lives and works in Douro, Ontario.

An amateur musician, local traditional music and its narratives interested him, he continued.

"The exhibition aims to connect our recent history and today's society, and the issues we face as citizens of Ontario and Canada, and invites viewers to reflect on what's happening with them and around them. Superficially things have changed, but the human conditions now seem not that different from 100 or 200 years ago.

Has life improved, or is progress only on a materialistic level? Folk songs make global issues accessible to everyone, as they are created and sung by real people telling real human stories."

He continued that "the concept for this exhibition borrows a technique from film editing to illustrate a narrative action that happens in several places at the same time, or in one place at different times, known as 'crosscutting.' Crosscutting is also a term describing cutting wood perpendicular to the wood grain. The linocuts I made for Cross Cut use both the traditional method of carving, and contemporary and experimental ways of mark making, including drilling, scratching, laser engraving and etching - going against the grain of the traditional technique, as it were. Linocuts, originating around 1900, and initially used in school art classes, invoke the era of the chosen traditional songs. By using innovative techniques, and adding contemporary elements to historical scenes, I convey the parallels and juxtapositions of then and now."

His work is on display at TAG along with the works of Haileybury artist Peter Greyson, and Englehart artist Chelsea Smith.







Do you know the risk factors associated with breast cancer?





October is Breast
Cancer Awareness
Month across Canada.
Even though this
disease has many
causes, several factors
can increase the risk of
contracting it. Here's
an overview of some of
those risk factors.

- Previous conditions. You're more vulnerable to developing breast cancer if abnormal cells have been detected in your breasts in the past or if you've had previous abnormalities.
- 2. Age. More than 80 per cent of cases in Canada occur in women over the age of 50.
- 3. Alcohol. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), drinking one beer or one glass of wine per day is enough to increase your risk significantly.
- 4. Menstrual cycle. Early menstruation and late menopause are linked to the possibility of developing the disease.
- Family history. Your risk of getting the disease is higher
 if your mother, sister or daughter has been diagnosed
 with breast cancer, especially if it was before menopause.

- 6. Pregnancy complications. Your risk increases if you've never carried a pregnancy to full term or if you've been pregnant after the age of 30.
- 7. Body weight. People who are obese have a higher statistical likelihood of getting breast cancer.
- 8. Taking hormones. Undergoing hormone replacement therapy for more than five years is associated with the onset of this type of cancer.
- Physical inactivity. A sedentary lifestyle increases the likelihood of a breast cancer diagnosis.







Although winter weather is often random and unpredictable, city snow removal efforts are not. The city is committed to providing a high level of snow removal service throughout the winter season, with consideration to safety, environmental and budget concerns. Weather Monitoring Season From October 1 to April 30, the minimum standard is to monitor the weather, both current and forecast to occur in the next 24 hours, once every shift or three times per calendar day, whichever is more frequent, at intervals determined by the municipality.

Winter Maintenance Season The City will perform winter highway maintenance commencing on or about November 1, 2023 and is completed on or about April 15, 2024.
