Many hands making warm work

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A mountain of mitts, hats, and mini blankets is headed to schools, daycares, seniors’ residences and other organizations across southern Temiskaming.

Members of the Temiskaming Shores Lioness Lions Club recently held a work bee at the home of Janet Spencer to package the items crafted by local knitters, crocheters, and seamstresses.

This year’s tally?

Spencer estimated about 500 mitt-and-hat sets, another 300 hats, 50 afghans and 50 baby-quilts will be distributed.

They’re destined for some 60 sites from Bear Island and Temagami to Englehart, and from the Kiwetin School on Timiskaming First Nation to Elk Lake.

Recipients include elementary schools and daycares, nursing homes, hospitals, food banks, the Pavilion Women’s Centre, Community Cancer Care, and organizations working in mental health, family and children’s services, and the developmentally challenged.

The initiative began about 20 years ago when the club provided afghans for nursing home residents, she said.

“It’s kind of snowballed.”

The work is not just the production of club members.

“We have probably 15 or 20 that are not Lioness members who knit and sew for us. Thank you, thank you, thank you,” she said.

One veteran knitter, she said, recently called and reported she had 112 toques ready for pick-up.

How the goods are distributed by the recipient organizations differs.

Schools, for example, keep a stock of mitts and hats on hand to replace lost or sodden items. Spencer said some organizations include them in Christmas gifts.

“Usually by January the cupboards are empty,” she said.

“And then we start fresh with our knitters.”

The initiative runs on donations – all the yarn and fabric is donated to the club, which in turn provides

the materials to nimble-fingered volunteer craftspeople.

Bomb threats prompt widespread school closures

DISTRICT (Staff) – Police are investigating what they describe as “multiple bomb threats” across Northern Ontario that prompted the abrupt closure of schools across Temiskaming and beyond November 1.

The threats targeted “multiple schools under multiple school boards” across the Northeast and Northwest, and payment was demanded, said the Ontario Provincial Police in a news release from its corporate communications headquarters.

Police said November 1 there was no evidence of actual devices.

As a precaution, police said, the majority of targeted schools were closed while the investigation continues.

In addition to local officers, the OPP’s cyber investigation team is also involved.

Schools across Temiskaming were closed.

In a Facebook posting, the Conseil scolaire catholique de district des Grandes Rivières said it had received a bomb threat overnight to all schools

across its jurisdiction.

It said it was closing all its schools November 1 “out of an abundance of caution.”

District School Board Ontario North East announced on its website that all its schools were closed due to a safety concern. The Northeastern Catholic District School Board posted a notice on its Facebook page that its schools were closed due to an emergency situation affecting student and staff safety, and that the move was made under the advisement of

the OPP.

École publique des Navigateurs in New Liskeard was also closed.

In a post on the school’s Facebook page, it said the Conseil scolaire public du Nord-Est de l’Ontario had not received a threat.

But it said police had recommended that the board close its schools in New Liskeard, Tim-

mins, Iroquois Falls, Kapuskasing and Hearst.

The OPP note that the public is always encouraged to report any suspicious activity that could pose a risk to safety.

Vaccinations available

Increased vaccinations across the Temiskaming region of late comes as good news.

Certainly we can begin to breath a sigh of relief knowing there is a lessening of the COVID-19 virus that killed millions of people around the globe and disrupted lives in the process.

With Northern Ontario and the Temiskaming region having an older, more vulnerable population and a significant Indigenous population, it is important that regular immunizations be maintained.

The Timiskaming Health Unit (THU) is now offering clinics where both shots can be obtained at the same time for convenience, and to ensure the population is well vaccinated for the fall, winter and spring months ahead.

Unlike other years, there are no booked appointments for vaccinations. You must show up at the various clinics held around the region and stand in line if need be.

There are plenty of chairs for people to sit and patiently wait until it's their turn to be vaccinated.

Please do not go to a vaccination clinic if you are feeling ill.

High dose flu and COVID-19 shots are recommended for people 65 years and over.

Let's hope this year's flu season will not been as severe as other years.

But we know the virus comes with variants and it is not yet completely annihilated, so let's not get too comfortable just yet.

Let's avoid the conspiracy theorists' manifesto that would prevent any of us from stepping into line to receive the COVID-19 vaccine and/or flu shot. And let us all remember to practice good prevention measures, which are to wash our hands, stay home when sick and practice masking in places where there are high numbers of people, and when it is known there are cases of COVID-19 in the region.

Symptoms of pancreatic cancer

Pancreatic cancer may not cause any signs or symptoms in its early stages. Signs and symptoms often appear as the tumor grows and causes changes in the body. Other health conditions can cause the same symptoms as pancreatic cancer.

See your health care provider if you have these signs or symptoms:

- yellowing of the skin and the whites of the eyes (called jaundice)
- pain in the upper abdomen or upper back
- fatty stools that are light colored, bulky and float in the toilet
- unexplained weight loss
- loss of appetite
- fatigue
- nausea and vomiting
- indigestion
- feeling full after a small meal
- bloating
- gas
- diarrhea or constipation
- itching
- dark urine
- fever and shivering
- swelling of the legs

Obesity
Diabetes
Family history of pancreatic cancer

Certain genetic conditions
Chronic pancreatitis

Two-fifths report extreme to very high level of daily stress

TORONTO (Special) - According to the 26th annual Benefits Canada Healthcare Survey, released recently: approximately two in five Canadians with a workplace health benefits plan reported extreme or very high daily stress over the previous three months. This is 11 points higher than last year and exceeds the previous high recorded in 2021 in the middle of the pandemic.

This mental-health challenge is acknowledged by the organizations that provide group health benefits for their employees. When presented with the information that those who receive quick access to mental-health counselling are more likely to recover and may not require the ongoing use of prescription medications, fewer than half said they feel their plans provide enough coverage for mental health, with one-third admitting they don't. One in five said they didn't know.

In fact, plan members who used their mental-health benefits during the last year reported paying, on average, \$1,739 beyond what's covered under their plan.

In total, members reported an average out-of-pocket spend of \$3,515 combined beyond their plan coverage for seven major benefits buckets — prescription drugs, dental services, mental-health therapy, physiotherapy, chiropractic therapy, massage therapy and other paramedical therapies such as acupuncture, naturopathy, etc.

While almost three out of four plan members agreed they appreciate their workplace group health benefits plan more today than they did before the pandemic, there are still areas of concern.

Half reported the coverage levels of at least one of the seven benefits areas limited their ability to seek necessary treatment, jumping to 84 percent among those with a major injury in the past 12 months.

When the benefits were considered separately, coverage most often fell short for dental services (25 percent), followed by massage therapy (19 percent), prescription drugs (16 percent), mental-health therapy (14 percent) and physiotherapy (13 percent).

These are just a few of the findings from the 2023 Benefits Canada Healthcare Survey, titled Benefits in a New Light: Perspectives to help crystallize and communicate the value of health benefits. The full report is available to download at www.benefitscanada.com/BCHS.

Immune system medications increase COVID outcome risks

VANCOUVER (Special) - People with arthritis often use medications that suppress or modulate their immune system. A new Arthritis Research Canada’s study aimed to understand the impact of these medications on the severity of COVID-19 consequences.

This research used British Columbia’s administrative health data and studied participants 18 years or older who had tested positive for COVID-19 and were taking medications that affected their immune system, specifically immunosuppressive and immunomodulatory medications. The goal was to explore the risk of severe COVID-19 outcomes for the participants.

The study found that people who took mycophenolate mofetil within three months before a COVID-19 infection had a 108 percent higher risk of hospitalization and a 152 percent greater risk of ICU admission than people who didn’t take this drug.

Additionally, people who took prednisone and other steroids within three months before a COVID-19 infection had a 63 percent greater risk of hospitalization, an 86 percent higher risk of ICU admission, and a 58 percent higher risk of death within 60 days of testing positive for COVID-19 than people who didn’t take this drug. This research study found that even small doses of prednisone raised the risk of hospitalization.

“These findings can guide healthcare decisions,” said Dr. Antonio Aviña-Zubieta, senior scientist at Arthritis Research Canada. “For example, prioritizing COVID booster vaccinations to protect people taking immunosuppressive and immunomodulatory medications who are at higher risk of severe COVID-19 outcomes. This is especially important during the fall and winter when COVID-19 cases tend to rise.”

Clocks will fall back one hour at 2am on November 5 and the Temiskaming Shores Fire Department is recommending residents install new batteries in their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms when they change their clocks.

In order for smoke and carbon monoxide alarms to do their job, they need to have working batteries. Once a year, old batteries should be replaced with new batteries. When you change your clocks on November 5, the Temiskaming Shores Fire Department wants everyone to take the time to install new batteries in all alarms."

In order to survive a fire, you need to be provided with an early warning and know what to do when the smoke alarms sound. Working smoke alarms are required on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas. For added protection, it is recommended to also install smoke alarms inside all bedrooms.

Carbon monoxide alarms must be installed outside all sleeping areas if your home has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage.

Tampering with or removing the batteries from your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms is against the law. Failure to comply with the Fire Code can result in a ticket for \$360 or a fine of up to \$50,000.

City of Temiskaming Shores Winter Operations Plan 2023-2024

Although winter weather is often random and unpredictable, city snow removal efforts are not. The city is committed to providing a high level of snow removal service throughout the winter season. Plowing, sanding and salting are performed with consideration to safety, environmental and budget concerns. Your cooperation in helping to keep streets clean and safe is appreciated.

Winter Highway Patrol

What

Observing the highway, either by driving on or by electronically monitoring the highway.

Who

May be performed by persons responsible for patrolling highways or by persons responsible for or performing highway maintenance activities.

When

Is carried out on a route of representative roads twice daily, 7 days a week. Between winter events a patrol of representative roads will occur during daylight hours and a second night patrol will be also be scheduled.

Winter Sidewalk Patrol

What

Visually observing the sidewalk, either by driving by the sidewalk on the adjacent roadway, or by driving or walking on the sidewalk or by electronically monitoring the sidewalk.

Who

May be performed by a person responsible for patrolling roadways or sidewalks or by persons responsible for performing highway maintenance activities.

When

Is determined by the municipality weather monitoring standards. If an indication of a substantial probability of snow accumulation in excess of 8cm or ice formation., the municipality selects its sidewalks at intervals, deemed necessary by the municipality.

Weather Monitoring Season

When

October 1 to April 30.

Why

The minimum standard is to monitor the weather, both current and forecast to occur in the next 24 hours, once every shift or three times per calendar day, whichever is more frequent, at intervals determined by the municipality.

Winter Maintenance Season

When

On or about November 1, 2023 to April 15, 2024.

Why

The City will perform winter highway maintenance.

Overnight Parking Prohibited

When

November 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024
Between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Where

Any street and City owned parking lot within the boundaries of the City of Temiskaming Shores.

Why

By-law 2012-101, to regulate traffic and parking | Section 5.9 of schedule "A"

No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on any street or City owned parking lot between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. during the period between November 1st in one year to March 31st of the next year.

By-law 2012-019, to prohibit and regulate unusual noise | Section 4.7, exemptions, snow removal

None of the provisions of this by-law shall apply to any vehicle of the Corporation or their agents working on behalf of the Corporation to perform snow removal, snow plowing or snow clearing on any Municipal Highways and properties or to private contractors or person.



Vaccine Doses and Vaccine Eligibility

COVID-19 vaccines are available free to anyone aged 6 months and older in Ontario, regardless of citizenship or immigration status, even if they do not have an Ontario Health Card.

The protection provided by your last dose may decrease over time, especially with new variants. Extra doses help restore your protection and protect you from the serious effects of the virus.

Eligibility for additional doses is based on the interval since the last dose or since a confirmed COVID-19 infection.

Recommended dose intervals are based on NACI recommendations. They are based on evidence that indicates longer intervals between doses lead to a stronger immune response and higher vaccine effectiveness that is expected to last longer.



Doses de Vaccin et Admissibilité au Vaccin

Les vaccins contre la COVID-19 sont offerts gratuitement à toute personne âgée de 6 mois et plus en Ontario, peu importe sa citoyenneté ou son statut d'immigrant, même si elle n'est pas titulaire d'une carte Santé de l'Ontario.

La protection offerte par votre dernière dose peut diminuer avec le temps, surtout en cas de nouveaux variants. Les doses supplémentaires aident à rétablir votre protection et à vous protéger contre les effets graves du virus.

L'admissibilité aux doses supplémentaires sont basées sur l'intervalle depuis la dernière dose ou depuis une infection à la COVID-19 confirmée.

Les intervalles recommandés entre les doses sont basés sur les recommandations du CCNI. Ils sont fondés sur des éléments de preuve qui indiquent que des intervalles plus longs entre les doses entraînent une réponse immunitaire plus forte et une efficacité vaccinale plus élevée qui devrait durer plus longtemps.
