Armstrong nominates six for volunteer service awards

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP - Armstrong Township council has nominated six residents of the municipality for the provincial government's 2023 Volunteer Service Awards.

Council members chose Mayor Jean-Marc Boileau, Bruno Dallaire, Debbie Demers, Caleb Fotheringham, Francois Gauthier, and Gisele Gauthier at its October 25 meeting.

Councillor Peggy Harrison, who sat on the committee with Councillor Michele Rivard, briefly outlined the volunteer services provided by each of the nominees.

Boileau was chosen for his volunteer work with the Earlton Lions Club, the recreation committee, and his strong support for the community of Earlton.

Dallaire has served as the president of the Knights of Columbus and is a member of the Camp Jeunesse en Marche board. He has participated overseas in professional development experiences for teachers. He has worked on overseas projects in underdeveloped countries, assisting children and others in housing and with other assistance. Now retired from his teaching position, he provides assistance to local people by driving them to medical appointments. He is an active member of his parish and a representative for development and peace.

Fotheringham was nominated because of his volunteer work supporting activities for children. He involves himself at all levels of baseball, coaches hockey, and "gets kids out."

Francois Gauthier has served in the past as the president of the Earlton Lions Club and is currently the chair of the Coeur du Village.

Gisele Gauthier helps with the preparation of meals at Église de Saint-Jean Baptiste and is a life-long member and supporter of the church.

The council intends to select another group of people in 2024, said Harrison.

Can you imagine living in a household where the person you love could beat, rape, choke and murder you and your children?

It's an issue that's often swept under the rug. If you look real close, you see the bruises, the heads held down low, the black eyes, the choke marks around the neck and the broken spirits.

One in three women in Canada has been assaulted, choked, beaten, raped and or violated in some form by their intimate partner. November is a month to remember the issue of violence against women and children, which is on the rise in our communities.

When I heard about the man in Sault Ste. Marie who murdered three children and his former partner and then killed himself, my heart sank and my gut ached.

Not for him because he was a coward, but for the mother and her innocent children.

Police called the killings "intimate partner violence" or domestic violence.

The Mayor of Timmins, Michelle Boileau, immediately spoke up about this incident saying intimate partner violence is an epidemic.

There are over 30 municipalities across the province that have done the same thing.

Their resolution also called for intimate partner violence to be part of the safety and well-being plan of their strategic plans.

I hope municipalities in our

regions follow suit.

When are the courts going to dish out real punishment to people that choke, beat, murder and abuse their partners?

A slap on the wrist, a promise to never do it again and house arrest are not deterrents for these crimes.

We know anger causes violence so let's see mandatory anger management counselling for anyone charged and convicted of intimate partner violence.

Anger management and conflict resolution should be taught to children and adolescents, the earlier the better.

It is long past the time to ask for a National Anger Management Strategy.

And to confront misogyny head on because this is the reason why violence of that nature flourishes unchecked in our communities.

Positive change could mean asking your local council, MP or MPP to take a stand about this type of violence.

Crohn's and Colitis Awareness

Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis are diseases that inflame the lining of the gastrointestinal tract and disrupt your body's ability to digest food, absorb nutrition and eliminate waste in a healthy way. One in every 150 Canadians is living with Crohn's or colitis.

What causes Crohn's and Colitis?

The causes are not well understood. Diet and stress may aggravate the disease, but they do not cause the disease on their own. Currently, it is believed that a genetic tendency and a trigger in the environment combined set off inflammation in the gut. The chronic (life-long) result is Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis.

What are the symptoms?

- Abdominal pain, cramping, gas

- Diarrhea (possibly bloody)
- · Rectal bleeding
- Nausea and vomiting
- · Reduced appetite and weight loss
- Fever
- Anemia
- Fatigue


