New location being assessed for Cobalt area food bank

COBALT - The Cobalt Coleman Latchford food bank volunteers are currently assessing and working to prepare a space at the former Cobalt arena as a new location for the food bank.

Volunteer Liane Mercier outlined that the food bank volunteers were forced to move from 22 Earle Street after an engineering consultant for the Town of Cobalt advised the town that the building was no longer structurally safe.

"The (food bank) was notified October 18 that the building in which they were operating was unsafe and they needed to vacate within 30 days," she said in an email interview.


"The search began immediately and we cannot be more grateful for the outpouring of support from the community, a large number of very special individuals and the towns of Cobalt, Latchford and Township of Coleman and the St. James Anglican Church," she added.

"With the help of many, we have moved from 22 Earle Street and are now working on assessing and preparing our future space for operations which will take several weeks."

She said food service has been suspended as of November 20 "until further notice. Donations of food can be directed to the Haileybury Food Bank in the interim."

She noted that the food bank "will be providing support to clients on November 29, December 6, December 13 and December 20. This service will be provided from the St. James Anglican Church on Prospect Avenue (in Cobalt) between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

"We will continue to share updates as they develop and thank everyone for their support."

Breault Family Farm store expanding stock

HARRIS – A little store is making a big difference as a family farm business in Harris Township evolves and expands.

Breault Family Farm, owned and operated by Alain Breault and Nancy Frey, began selling their beef, which is raised on pasture and finished on barley, three years ago directly to consumers. They soon added pasture-raised chicken.

Their inventory was initially stocked in eight chest freezers in their farm equipment shop.

"We never dreamed we would actually have a building on our property less than three years later," Frey told well-wishers who gathered for the farm store's grand opening October 27.

"The support of our community has been tremendous. We're excited to be working with other farmers, other food artisans, and bringing as much local food as possible to you, our customers.

"And we're just going to keep on growing, because that's what the customers want."

The store now carries not only their own beef and chicken, but pork and turkey from their daughter's farm near Callander.

Frey and Breault added laying hens in 2021 and now sell eggs when available.

"We're now at the place even with the two farms we need to bring in other farmers, other products. We can't do it all ourselves," she said.

Their store offers a growing line of food products – from meats to preserves, juices, seasoning packets and even freeze-dried candy – from some 10 producers in the Temiskaming area and beyond.

ROOTS

What's now Breault Family Farm began 30 years ago as an 18-cow/calf beef operation. Over the past 15 years, its herd expanded and meat chickens were added.

In 2019, fire destroyed the farm's century-old barn.

It forced the couple to rethink their business model, and they decided to sell their beef and then poultry – which without a barn had also switched to pasture – directly to consumers. Frey credits the Riverside Farmers' Market, which she joined in 2020, as key to building the business.

It's an invaluable tool to connect to customers, she said, "because anybody who is coming to a farmers' market wants what we are selling."

A new barn was finished in October 2020. A website enabling online ordering was launched in early 2021.

The store was completed at their Sales Barn Road farm

last summer.

The walk-in freezer was transformative, said Frey. It enabled them to easily sort the variety of meat cuts and package custom orders.

"There's a spot for everything," she said.

The store is open Fridays and Saturdays and staffed by employees. Clients can pick up online orders, and walk-in customers can also drop in.

Over the past summer, shelving was installed and

Frey began carrying more foods from other producers.

And more products are coming.

"I'm thinking bison, I'm thinking lamb, I'm thinking prepared meals, with our meat. I'm working with a restaurant now on that idea," she said.

Dida's in Earlton, she said, now uses Breault Family Farm beef in its burgers.

But despite the business' growth, she said she'll still be at the Riverside market.





EDITORIAL

The rally

The November 18 Rally To Save Thornloe Cheese at the Heritage Barn beside the Ontario Provincial Police station was well attended despite it being cold, windy and damp.

The tractors lined up along Armstrong Street North indicated the presence of the local dairy farming community, who are leading the fight to save the cheese plant.

The message from the array of speakers who took to the microphone that afternoon was one of shock in the way Gay Lea Foods Inc. had announced the closure in the first place.

On October 30 Gay Lea put a notice on the doors of the plant that it was closed effective immediately.

Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP John Vanthof said he was disappointed in the way the closure went down because he half expected Gay Lea Foods Inc. to reach out to him and let him know the extent of the closure.

He is our local government representative, a former dairy farmer, and fought the closure of the plant 16 years ago.

And he was not making nice about what Gay Lea had done with the closure of the plant.

A group of local dairy farmers also sprang into action and formed a Save Thornloe Cheese committee that has met with Gay Lea. They were assured that if a willing buyer for the plant were found, the company would sell it for a reasonable price along with the milk quota, the Thornloe Cheese brand name and the cheese recipes.

The final message from the speakers at the rally was to sign the petitions, email Gay Lea and to keep on holding the company accountable for their promise to sell the plant for a good price with the milk quota, recipes and brand name intact.

And it is grass roots people power that can make a difference in this fight.

Chewing the fat

High fat diets - everything you read says they aren't good for you.

But the birds can't read and they need a diet high in fat to survive our northern winters.

You would think I am in survival mode when it comes to my diet as it often strays to the high fat side of things.

For birds fat is fuel and if you have ever watched a black capped chickadee at a bird feeder you will know how much fuel those tiny birds need in a day.

They are relentless feeders because stored body fat is their prime energy supply that helps them to make it through the winter.

A bird expends about 60 per cent of its energy generating heat and for songbirds about 75-80 per cent of their fat reserves are needed to make it through a single winter's night.

Besides the bitter cold and winds of winter, birds have to endure long periods of darkness.

Birds will roost in trees at night and to do that they need to sustain themselves for up to 12 hours, solely by using their fat reserves for fuel.

This is an enormous challenge for birds to not only find enough food during the limited daylight hours to sustain them, but to also create enough fat stores for night time.

So this is where we come in folks.

Keeping your feeders well stocked with high fat foods is a must for area birds in order for them to survive our northern winters.

Someone said we shouldn't feed birds at our

feeders because we are making them lazy and taming them.

That's nonsense.

In the past 50 years nearly three billion birds have disappeared across North America and the European Union alone.

Can you imagine a time when we would have a "silent spring" and not hear birdsong?

The best source of fat for birds is suet, nuts and lard, which can be bought locally. Also bacon grease and or peanut butter are fats that birds love to eat.

But it is vitally important that suet be put into bags, metal cages or other partially enclosed containers.

The reason for this is if birds get oil on their feathers they can't fly and they could die, especially in winter months.

American robins like to eat fruits, while blue jays love peanuts and pine grosbeaks love black oil sunflower seeds and several species love mealworms.

The gold finches and nuthatches love the smaller Niger seeds, but they are pricey.

I have a friend who provides over 2,000 pounds of birdseed every year to our feathered friends. Way to go Tim!

Why feed birds?

Because in a world full of bombs and brutality, it is a direct connection with nature and suddenly you are reconnected with a gentler, beautiful life form.







Area rallying behind seized dog in need of surgery

TEMAGAMI/TEMISKAMING SHORES - A reader of Temagami Talk has anonymously donated \$1,700 for the veterinary care of a dog rescued from a farm in the Temiskaming Shores area.

Temagami Talk administrator John Shymko is a volunteer with Northern Animals Rescue and Sanctuary. He's also a musician and he had offered his American Stratocaster guitar to be auctioned online to raise the necessary funds for needed surgery for the dog.

However, a reader chose to donate the funds directly to the Northern Animals Rescue and Sanctuary to provide needed surgery for the great Pyrenees who has been diagnosed with an inflamed uterus (pyometra).

Shymko has decided to continue with the idea of auctioning his guitar, for which he paid \$2,500 after tax. His goal is to raise more funds for the sanctuary to pay for surgeries for other animals there.

"It's a 2020 American Stratocaster, the Cadillac of guitars, a nice guitar," he said in a telephone interview.

He is creating a Facebook page for the online auction which will continue until December 17. He noted there are other animals at the sanctuary that require surgeries.

Meanwhile, sanctuary founder and president Jennifer MacKewn said in a telephone interview that the dog, which the veterinarian named Tara because she had never had a name, was delivered into the care of the sanctuary and will be receiving the surgery it needs.


She commented that Tara was taken from a farm from which other animals have also been seized.

The dog was taken to a veterinarian and assessed and found to be in need of the surgery at a cost of \$1,700.

MacKewn said the executor in charge of the farm estate contacted her for assistance and said the sanctuary was "her last resort"

The dog had bitten the person attempting to rescue her, but MacKewn is determined to save her. "She's just terrified and exhausted. We want to give her a chance." She noted that Tara has never had a vaccine, nor been dewormed, nor had a flea tick check. She commented that, "if she doesn't find a home, she will stay here at the sanctuary with me."

The Rosborough Funny Farm in Ingram Township has received the other animals from the farm, and is now providing care for them.



Tips to Reduce the Spread of Respiratory Viruses

Everyone has a role to play to reduce the spread of respiratory viruses (such as COVID-19 and the flu). The actions you take will protect you, loved ones and those most vulnerable in your community.

We are expecting high volume pressures across our health system, now and through the winter. This is due to a combination of the usual circulating respiratory viruses, a more challenging RSV season, COVID-19 numbers that remain high, and the early arrival of the flu season.

Tips to Prevent the Spread

We can layer our protection against respiratory viruses with some simple steps:

- Stay up-to-date with your vaccinations including a fall COVID-19 booster and flu vaccine, when eligible, for the best protection against getting very sick from COVID-19 and influenza.
- Even if you have had a recent COVID-19 infection, staying up-todate with your vaccinations gives you stronger immunity.
- Socialize outdoors when possible outdoors is lower risk than indoors.
- Wear a high quality, well-fitting mask, especially indoors, and based on the setting and situation. Masks are strongly recommended in indoor public settings, and especially if you are around people who are at higher risk or have a health condition.
- Stay home if you are sick or have symptoms, even if they are
- If you have symptoms, get tested for COVID-19 and treatment if you are eligible.
- Wash or sanitize your hands often.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with your elbow or a tissue.
- · Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- · Choose well ventilated spaces when possible.
- Reduce or limit the number of people you have close contact with, especially indoors and if you are around people who are at higher risk or have a health condition.
- Keep a physical distance when possible, especially indoors.

If you are experiencing mild respiratory symptoms and want the opinion of a health care provider, please call your primary care provider's office first before going to the Emergency Room.

Armstrong receives 72 smoke and CO alarms

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP (Staff) - Enbridge Gas and the Earlton/Armstrong Fire Department have joined forces to deliver 72 combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms to the community.

The project is being carried out under the Safe Community Project Zero - a public education campaign with the Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council (FMPFSC). The campaign's objective is to provide more than 10,000 alarms to residents in 50 municipalities across Ontario.

Enbridge Gas has invested \$315,000 in the Safe Community Project Zero campaign. Over the past 15 years the program has provided more than 86,000 alarms to Ontario fire departments, Enbridge stated in a press release.

"When properly installed and maintained, combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms help provide the early warning to safely escape from a house fire or carbon monoxide exposure. Carbon monoxide is a toxic, odourless gas that is a by-product of incomplete combustion of many types of common fuels."

Enbridge Gas North Bay and area operations supervisor Jennifer Beam visited the Earlton/Armstrong Fire Department November 6 to take part in the official launch of the campaign in Armstrong.

"Properly maintaining fuel burning equipment is the best way to reduce potential exposure to carbon monoxide, and an alarm is a critical second line of defense for protection. When we implement these strategies together, we protect our loved ones from carbon monoxide poisoning, also known as the silent killer," said Beam.

Ontario Fire Marshal and FMPFSC chair Jon Pegg stated in a press release that "across Ontario there is a renewed focus on the importance of having working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in your home. The objective of Safe Community Project Zero is to deliver these alarms to areas where they are needed most. It is a program that fire departments can adopt to help educate their communities about the requirements for all Ontario homes to have a carbon monoxide alarm if they have a fuel-burning appliance or an attached garage."

Earlton/Armstrong Fire Chief Andre Robert, who was present for the launch, added, "The fire department is proud to join with Enbridge Gas and the FMPFSC to help promote safety and public education in our community. In a tragic situation, a house can be replaced but a life can't. Smoke and CO alarms save lives."


Smoking is the #1 cause of fatal home fires in Ontario. **Alcohol** is


