

TMA says "no" to passing on double solid yellow lines

EARLTON (Staff) – Temiskaming municipal representatives have supported a proposal that would make it illegal to pass a vehicle when the road is marked by two solid yellow lines.

On January 25, the Temiskaming Municipal Association supported a private member's bill by Mushkegowuk-James Bay MPP Guy Bourgouin to make the move illegal.

The New Democrat MPP introduced a bill last November known as Chad's Law (Enforcing Safe Passing).

It's named for a constituent in his riding whose vehicle was struck by a commercial vehicle that was attempting to overtake another while going uphill.

In a news release last year, Bourgouin said his constituent survived, but was left with serious injuries, including a broken neck, collarbone and sternum and a bruised heart and lungs.

The collision was followed by intensive surgery, months of rehabilitation, and ongoing struggles with chronic pain, deteriorating eyesight, and post-traumatic stress disorder.

In Northern communities around highways 11 and 17, "I've witnessed firsthand the reckless behaviour and challenging conditions these roads pose," Bourgouin said.

"There is simply no need to cross into oncoming traffic in these marked zones."

At this time, he said current legislation only cautions against crossing into oncoming lanes under specific conditions.

"We cannot allow Ontario to be the only province that fails to condemn this life-threatening manoeuvre. This government must do more to protect drivers across the entire province."



Bourgouin's bill would amend the Highway Traffic Act to prohibit passing on a highway painted with double solid yellow lines. Doing so would result in a \$400 fine and three or more demerit points on one's licence.

The bill passed first reading and was ordered for second reading.



The federal government has just capped the number of foreign students that can enter the country for postsecondary education at Canada's colleges, universities and private schools.

According to Statistics Canada, the number of foreign students entering Canada has jumped from 617,000 to more than a million over the last two years.

The government will cut the number of study permits by 35 per cent this year in Ontario.

The influx of international students is said to be a factor causing housing problems and social service issues in some of the communities where these students are residing.

That number is 1-888-495-8501.

I sure hope innocent folks are not being scammed due to this credit card trickery.

Readers, your bank is not going to call you about someone unlawfully using your credit card.

Please, as soon as a number appears on your phone you don't recognize and a voice comes on that you don't know talking about your finances, hang up the phone immediately.

If you are unsure if your cred-



it card has actually been used without your authorization, visit your local bank or call them.

Banks are not going to ask you for your personal banking information as they already have it.

For heavens sake, DO NOT give out any personal banking information, or your social security number or computer passwords. Just hang up.

It makes me sick to think innocent people could be scammed out of thousands of dollars.

A friend told me her mother had been scammed out of \$10,000 and she never got her money back.

Seniors in particular are very vulnerable to these scams.

An Ipsos Reid poll says 45 per cent of Canadians have been scammed or been a victim of fraud in their lifetime.

Those numbers may not include all the people who are too embarrassed to admit they have been scammed.

Please have those conversations with your loved ones about phone scams. Education is the key to curbing this type of fraud.

Why can't telephone companies block scam phone calls?

Don't tell me that we can't find these scammers and prosecute them. We can send spaceships to Jupiter, find Osama Bin Laden in a hole in the ground in the desert, so why not put our intelligence to work to protect innocent people from being scammed?

We should not be afraid of simply answering our phones but that's what it is coming down to these days because of scammers.

If my phone rings I check the number first to see if I know the caller before answering. If not, I let it go to voicemail.

Please be extra careful about your personal information. Keep it to yourself.

Celiac disease (CD) is a common disorder that is estimated to affect about one percent of the population. It is a condition in which the absorptive surface of the small intestine is damaged by a substance called gluten. Gluten is a group of proteins present in wheat, rye and barley and their cross bred grains. The damage to the intestine can lead to a variety of symptoms and result in an inability of the body to absorb nutrients such as protein, fat, carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals, which are necessary for good health.

Symptoms

- Common (typical) symptoms include:
- Abdominal pain
- Malabsorption
- Less common (atypical) symptoms include:
- Anemia
- Extreme fatigue
- Liver enzyme abnormalities
- Infertility

ConstipationDental enamel defects

Chronic diarrhea

Weight loss

Osteoporosis

Mouth ulcers

neurological problems

*Children can present with short stature, irritability and vomiting

Diagnosis

(1). Screening

The IgA-tissue transglutaminase (TTG) antibody is the currently recommended test for screening. You must be on a regular (gluten-containing) diet at the time of testing to make the results valid.

(2). Biopsy

The definitive diagnosis of CD is made by a small intestinal biopsy. The biopsy is performed via endoscopy. Again, it is important that gluten not be removed from the diet before the biopsy is completed as it may impair the confirmation of the diagnosis.

Treatment

At present, there is no permanent cure for CD but it can be effectively treated with a gluten-free diet. Gluten-free eating can be challenging and complicated. A consultation with a registered dietitian with expertise in gluten-free diet would be beneficial. Careful label reading each time when buying food items is important.

If you think you may have celiac disease and your primary care provider hasn't raised the possibility, don't be afraid to bring it up yourself. You are an important member of your health care team.

The application proposes to create one new lot, representing the entirety of PIN 61252-0124. The proposed severed lot would be rectangular in shape and approximately 65 hectares in size with 800 metres of frontage on Hough Lake Road. The lot is currently vacant, and the proposed use is agricultural.

The proposed retained lot would be irregular in shape and approximately 31 hectares in size, with 300 metres of frontage on Hough Lake Road. The proposed retained lot contains an existing residential dwelling, a garage, chicken coop and a barn. The retained lot is serviced with an existing septic system and well.







Notice to the Users of the Waterfront Pool Facility

Our pool cannot operate without our staff members. There have been several incidents of disrespectful behaviour from members of the public towards our staff members simply for enforcing basic safety policies. We take these verbal confrontations very seriously and, in a time when quality part-time and full-time staff are in high demand, we expect our pool users to be respectful and abide by the rules set out. If a user is unable to follow the rules, they will be denied entry and may lose their pool access for a period of time. Our City employees deserve respect when doing their jobs.

Pool Admission Policy

All children under 10 years old MUST be accompanied by an adult or guardian (14+) in the pool, regardless of swimming ability. This means adults or guardians must be in a swimsuit, in the pool, within arms reach of their children. This is the standard for pools across Ontario and is in place to ensure the safety of all our young swimmers.

Pool Capacity

The capacity of the pool depends on the number of lifeguards on duty. These numbers are stipulated by the Government of Ontario's Public Pools Regulation 565/90.

O-24 Swimmers | 1 Lifeguard (if the slide is open: 2 Lifeguards)
25-56 Swimmers | 2 Lifeguards (if the slide is open: 3 Lifeguards)
66-100 Swimmers | 3 Lifeguards (if the slide is open: 4 Lifeguards)
101-129 Swimmers | 4 Lifeguards (if the slide is open: 5 Lifeguards)


