Englehart ER closed until further notice

ENGLEHART (Special) – Staff shortages have closed the emergency department at Englehart hospital.

Blanche River Health (BRH), which oversees hospitals in Englehart and Kirkland Lake, announced the closure around 6 p.m. March 5.

In a news release, it said emergency departments at its Kirkland Lake site and at the Temiskaming Hospital in New Liskeard remain open.

In an emergency, people are advised to call 911, and they'll be transported to the best available location for care.

Registered nurses at Health 811 are also available 24/7 by dialing 811.

"Despite the success we have had in keeping the (emergency department) open at both Blanche River Health sites by increasing use of contracted services, our region is not immune to the ongoing shortage of clinicians that led to more than 150 Ontario ED closures last year," said BRH CEO Jorge VanSlyke in the release.

"We will continue to work hard to ensure full coverage is sustained over the long term."

Second-hand bus coming for transit fleet

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A second-hand bus is expected to arrive in the coming weeks and improve Temiskaming Transit service reliability.

Temiskaming Shores council will consider a bylaw later this month formally authorizing the purchase of a 2019 Elkhart Coach transit shuttle bus, at a cost of \$149,320, from Macnab Transit Sales in Ingersoll.

That's just under the sum approved by council in February as it gave transportation services manager Mitch McCrank the authority to procure a used bus. "It should be here within the next couple of weeks," Mc-Crank told council at its committee-of-the-whole meeting earlier this week.

Transit service has been disrupted in recent weeks as delays in receiving needed parts have kept existing buses off the road.

Two new buses have been ordered, but they may not be delivered by the end of this year.

"Hopefully we'll see them before the end of 2024," commented Mayor Jeff Laferriere after council's committee-ofthe-whole meeting March 5.


But the used bus "is a really

nice transition that will help us," he said.

In other transit-related news, the city will submit an application for funding to conduct a review the Temiskaming Transit system and explore rural transit options.

The review would look at the current system and examine how it could expand into smaller, rural communities of South Temiskaming that may be interested in service, explained Mc-Crank.

Council directed staff to apply to the Infrastructure Canada Rural Transit Solutions Fund for \$50,000 to conduct a review.

On the cusp of International Women's Day, celebrated on March 8, we salute all the fabulous women in the Temiskaming region and beyond.

If we think about the modern version of feminism, we might remind ourselves that women are strong and perhaps we only need to change the way people view that strength. Statistics say worldwide one in three women will be subjected to violence and one in four men over the course of their lives.

And perhaps in the Temiskaming region the stats might be even grimmer where the main call to police on a monthly basis is intimate partner violence (IPV).

Intimate Partner Violence can include physical, financial, emotional, psychological, or sexual abuse.

What inspires people to act selflessly to help others?

I recently was brought to tears when I watched a video of Ruth Gottesman, a former professor at the Bronx Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

She has donated \$1 billion to the school located in the poorest area of New York city. Her generous gift means that fouryear medical students immediately go tuition free, while other students will benefit from free tuition in the fall of 2024.

She literally changed the

lives of those students with herwonderful donation.

Astonished students in the medical school program listening to her donation speech were blown away by Gottesman's generosity. They rose to their feet to applaud her, many with tears in their eyes.

Her gift of free tuition has deeply impacted the most vulnerable students, the children of low-income immigrant families.

One student said, "Once you remove the financial barrier, anyone can dream bigger."

Officials at the school said the donation should last for perpetuity, since interest earned on the donation means the lump sum will continue to grow. All students will qualify for free tuition said the school administrators. Tuition at the school is



roughly \$63,000 per year, not including living expenses.

This story shows how people who have money can directly impact the lives of others.

You can score 50 goals in a season, or send rocket ships to the moon, but if you don't have a clue about the awareness of helping vulnerable people you had better look up the meaning of humanity in the dictionary.

Those people who help others are indeed the beloved. And we know we have many of those folks in our region too.

The Bikers Reunion provides donations to help cancer patients with financial assistance through the Community Cancer Care program and the Temiskaming Hospital Foundation.

Look at what McDonald's Restaurant has done with their Wednesday sales event.

How about the North On Tap Craft Beer Festival, the Mackey Family, the Isaac Walker-Dupont fundraiser and the 100 Women generosity?

It is a simple concept, but one I firmly maintain, we are all in this together!

What we eat matters for every aspect of our health, including our mental health.

According to the Dietitians of Canada, following a Mediterranean diet has many health benefits and may help to:

- Reduce your risk of developing heart disease
- · Lower blood cholesterol levels
- · Lower blood pressure
- · Improve blood glucose control for individuals with type 2 diabetes; and
- Early research shows that it may prevent or improve symptoms of rheumatoid arthritis, Alzheimer's, dementia, and glaucoma. It may also help maintain brain health.

Physical Activity should be part of your everyday life.

Grains - You should choose whole grains over white grain products more often.

Fruits & Vegetables - Fresh fruits and vegetables are the best, but frozen and canned are also good choices during certain seasons or if you're on a budget.

Legumes (beans, peas and lentils) are also an excellent source of fibre which helps to lower blood sugar and cholesterol.

Nuts & Seeds help reduce LDL (bad cholesterol) and increase HDL (good cholesterol). A healthy portion of nuts is 10 almonds, 5 walnuts or 15 shelled pistachios.

Olive Oil is the major source of added fat rather than butter or lard.

Cheese and Yogurt are great sources of dairy to compliment daily milk consumption. It's important to choose low fat dairy products. Try 0-2% milk, 0-3% yogurt and less than 25% cheese more often.

Fish and Seafood should be eaten 2-3 times/week

Poultry is an excellent protein source.

Eggs are not only a staple of the Mediterranean Diet, but they also play a role in weight management, muscle strength, brain function, eye health and more. Consuming up to 4 eggs per week is recommended.

Sweets & treats are okay in moderation. Limit sweets such as candies, pastries, desserts and sweetened pop or sweetened juice to two servings per week or less or save them for special occasions.

Red meats Choose red meat and processed meat less often. Include no more than two servings (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz) of red meat each week or no more than 16 oz per month. Examples of red meat include goat, beef, pork and lamb.

Alcohol in moderation — men should limit drinks to no more than 1-2 per day and women 0-1 drink per day. (1 drink =1 beer, 4 oz of wine or 1.5 oz of liquor)

The foods in a typical Mediterranean diet – fish, nuts, plant oils, fruits and vegetables – help lower inflammation in your body and improve blood vessel function. These benefits help to keep your heart healthy and your mind sharp.

Coleman receives Save Energy Program LED funding

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP -

Things will be considerably brighter in Coleman Township, as the township has received funding for new LED lighting installations.

The Township of Coleman had applied for and been successful in receiving a Save on Energy Program for small businesses, offered by the Independent Electricity System Operator (ESO).

Coleman's chief administrative officer Chris Oslund informed council of the successful funding application at the February 26 meeting of council.

"A total of \$12,000 in lighting upgrades will be funded by the Save on Energy Program with an estimated annual cost-savings of \$1,257 per year in energy costs," said Oslund.

The Save on Energy Small Business program is designed to help businesses across Ontario make equipment improvements to reduce their energy consumption, at no cost. This new and improved program offers small businesses direct-install incentives on an expanded range of equipment-both lighting and non-lighting.

Oslund says the township applied for lighting improvements, specifically for the conversion to LED lighting for the administration offices, community hall, fire hall and public works garage.

The annual half-load restrictions on Municipal roads takes effect on March 6, 2024 and will remain in place until June 31, 2024, unless indicated otherwise.

Who

When half-load restrictions are in effect, a road is off-limits to vehicles exceeding 5 tonnes per axle. However there may be alternate routes that can be taken to reach a destination.

Roads become softer and weaker during the spring thaw. Heavy vehicle traffic on these roadways can cause permanent damage. Following the half load restrictions reduces the potential for any unnecessary road repairs or reconstruction.



Time to Change your Clocks and the Batteries in all Smoke and Carbon **Monoxide Alarms**

Clocks will spring forward one hour at 2:00am on March 10, 2024 and the Temiskaming Shores Fire Department is recommending residents install new batteries in their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms when they change their clocks.

Fire Services

In order for smoke and carbon monoxide alarms to do their job, they need to have working batteries. Once a year, old batteries should be replaced with new batteries. When you change your clocks on March 10, the Temiskaming Shores Fire Department wants everyone to take the time to install new batteries in all alarms."

In order to survive a fire, you need to be provided with an early warning and know what to do when the smoke alarms sound. Working smoke alarms are required on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas. For added protection, it is recommended to also install smoke alarms inside all bedrooms.

Carbon monoxide alarms must be installed outside all sleeping areas if your home has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage.

Tampering with or removing the batteries from your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms is against the law. Failure to comply with the Fire Code can result in a ticket for \$360 or a fine of up to \$50,000

Little Free Library repaired, restocked with books

TEMISKAMING SHORES — It was the best of times and it was the worst of times.

When the Little Free Library in Dymond Township was vandalized, that wasn't the end of the story. It was just the beginning of a new chapter for the little wooden structure in the shape of a log cabin.

The Little Free Library is sponsored by the Literacy Council of South Temiskaming, offering free books to the community and also a place to leave books for others to enjoy.

On February 1 Temiskaming Shores resident Karen Watchorn had discovered the Little Free Library near the Dymond Fire Department Station had been vandalized and the door was heavily damaged. She decided to take action to fix the problem as she was a regular user of the Little Free Library in that location.

She enlisted the help of her son Rhys Watchorn and her son-in-law Austin Peddie, and between them they repaired the door of the library and have since installed it back to its original location beside the Dymond Fire Department Station.

"We put three new hinges on the door, special ones that are more durable. A fresh base was made for the library box out of two layers of plywood for strength and stability. The original bolts were used to attach it all to the original stand. And we checked to see how sturdy it is now and it is on there tight," said Watchorn in a telephone interview.

"This warms my heart that

the two young men would get involved and do something to help the community. My son said there are books in there for old ladies. I said, hey, that makes me an old lady and we all laughed about that. There is a new batch of fresh books in the library for anyone to borrow."

Watchorn said she kept all of the books that were originally in the library and put them back and "I also added some fresh titles this morning and residents will find a nice selection of books in French and English.

"This is awesome to have young people making things right in their community she said of her son and son-in-law.

The Dymond location library was built free of charge by Fred MacKewn of South Wabi Sawmill.
