Earlton Farm Show feeds a need as big crowds take it in

EARLTON — Organizers of this year's annual Earlton Farm Show are calling the event a success.

All things agriculture in the district of Temiskaming were on full display at last weekend's 2024 Earlton Farm Show, held at the Rosaire and Wilf Paiement Centre April 12-13.

People could view farm animals, take part in auctions, enjoy a breakfast and lunch, meet old friends and make new ones at the show.

According to organizing committee member Norm Koch, "everything went well, we were really pleased."

He said numbers show roughly 3,500 people attended, down slightly from 3,800 last year.

He thinks it may have been due to the soggy weather that hit the area Friday, April 12.

"The storm came quickly and left quickly," said Koch.

He didn't realize how much rain had fallen because he was inside all day at the Farm Show.

He said the 61 exhibitors provided good feedback to the Farm Show committee in terms of how pleased they were to have taken part in the event.

The show featured the latest technology and innovations used in agriculture.

Fine-tuning the annual Saturday morning memorial breakfast helped to ensure its success this year, mentioned Koch.

"Things ran a lot smoother this year at the breakfast," he said.

This year's breakfast was held to honour René Lacasse, an Earlton resident who died in 2019. He operated a farm in Armstrong Township and was part of the Earlton Co-Op team.

Admission was free but donations of non-perishable food for local food banks was appreciated.

Koch said planning has already begun for the 2025 Earlton Farm Show.

Washing your hands frequently, using hand sanitizer when you can't wash your




• Get your vaccines early

Health experts recommend specific immunizations when visiting certain countries, so check to see what you need. Give yourself plenty of time to get all your doses before you leave, as some vaccination schedules take months to complete – including for hepatitis A and B, which are present in much of the world.

• Be cautious with what you eat

Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS) Awareness

Irritable bowel syndrome or IBS is a disorder affecting the intestine. IBS involves problems with motility (movement of digested food through the intestines) and sensitivity (how the brain interprets signals from the intestinal nerves), leading to abdominal pain, changes in bowel patterns and other symptoms.

FAST FACTS:

- Canada has one of the highest rates of IBS in the world; 13-20% of Canadians (approximately 5 – 7.5 million individuals) are living with IBS
- 54% of those with IBS experience symptoms of fatigue
- 40 to 60% of those with IBS experience psychological symptoms, including anxiety disorders and depression
- the primary symptoms are what are commonly referred to as the ABCDs of IBS – Abdominal pain, Bloating, and Constipation and/or Diarrhea

Although each person has a unique IBS experience, this condition can significantly decrease a person's quality of life. Interestingly, only about 40% of people with IBS symptoms will seek help from a health care provider.

DIETARY AND LIFESTYLE MODIFICATIONS

The bowel responds to how and when a person eats, so it is important to eat regular, well-balanced, moderately sized meals rather than erratic, variable meals.

Some people find that dietary fats and the food additive monosodium glutamate (MSG) trigger symptoms. Some find symptoms worsen when consuming large quantities of liquids with meals. Others find that cooking vegetables and fruits lessens IBS symptoms, compared to when eating them raw. People with IBS might need to avoid or decrease consumption of caffeine, nicotine, and alcohol, particularly if the main symptom is diarrhea.

FIBRE

An important step in controlling the symptoms of IBS is to increase dietary fibre. Gradually increase your dietary fibre intake, allowing your body to adjust to the change, but make sure to increase the amount of water you drink as well.

It is important to note that for some IBS patients, a diet excessively high in bran fibre might trigger more frequent diarrhea, while other types of fibre could still be helpful. Consult your primary care provider or dietitian if you have any questions regarding fibre in your diet.

Stricter legislation is needed

Months after a one-armed monkey reportedly bit and injured a woman in Latchford, there seems to be no provincial legislation that clearly restricts the ownership of exotic animals.

escaped from a home in Latchford, crossed Highway 11 and bit a woman who was helping a patient into a car at the Latchford Medical Clinic.

There have been no repercussions from this terrible incident so far and municipalities across the north are trying to make the province tighten up the rules around exotic animal ownership.

The issue was discussed at a Temiskaming Municipal Association representatives where meeting, from 20 municipalities across the Temiskaming region heard the mayor of Latchford speak about the issue.

Subsequently, the mayor of Kirkland Lake, Stacy Wight, brought forward a motion at one of the town's recent council meetings asking the province to tighten up the rules concerning exotic animal ownership.

Currently, Ontario has a law to prevent wild animals that are native to the province from being kept in captivity.


But it falls short of exotic animal legislation prohibiting or restricting exotic animal possession and/or breeding of exotic animals in captivity.

The province has essentially shifted the burden to local councils whose bylaws don't have the teeth and enforcement power to protect citizens from being harmed by exotic animal interactions.

The Ontario government needs to restrict the possession, ownership and breeding of exotic animals resulting in a consistent policy across the province.

The burden for this problem has fallen on municipalities and that's not fair.

oughly and avoid food that has been sitting out. Wash produce, respect local customs and communicate allergies to staff to lower your risk of getting sick from contaminated food while abroad.

• Build in time for resting

It can be tempting to create a fully packed schedule to get the most out of your trip, but that can leave your body tired and vulnerable to catching a virus that's circulating. Take breaks on busy days and make sure you get enough hours of sleep each night.

• Don't pack restricted foods Some goods are banned from Canada to protect us and our animals. Food products can carry diseases. This includes pork, which could be contaminated with the highly contagious African swine fever. While this pig disease doesn't infect humans, it can spread to pigs in Canada and seriously harm farmers' livelihoods. If you're travelling, don't pack any pork products.

A bird's singing is a thing of beauty to the appreciative ear.

You step outside and immediately hear it, the sounds of spring birdsong is everywhere.

The dawn chorus has begun and it is a joyous sound.

The returning birds are so full of life as they migrate to the Boreal forest to nest and raise their young.

Bird song goes much deeper than the mere songs we hear each day.

They often are meant to mark territory, attract a mate or warn other birds of approaching dan-

I am of the belief birds sing for the pure pleasure of singing.

According to scientists and ornithologists, bird song produces a chemical in their brains much like an opioid.

I know this sounds horrible, but scientists gave fentanyl to starlings and they began to sing their hearts out.

Can you imagine giving American robins fentanyl? Wow, that level of sound might cause an earthquake because they sing loudly enough as it is.

I was up at 4 a.m. the other morning to let my cat outside and sure enough, the birds were singing.

Listening to birdsong and



interacting with birds is good for our mental health and wellbeing.

A study by Kings College in London, England, found that people who interacted with birds reported the sound boosted the mood of depressed people.

I know this past winter I avoided seasonal affective disorder (SAD) by visiting a friend's backyard feeder and making trips to the Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre for my bird fix, which helped with the winter doldrums.

And you know what? Hearing birdsong is far better than listening to drone raids on television, snowplows and lawnmowers any day of the week.


I wonder what the birds sound like in Gaza and Israel these days.

Are they singing mating songs or songs of impending danger?







The purpose of this program is to provide residential taxpayers the opportunity to take advantage of free tipping fees at the New Liskeard Landfill. The Free Tipping Fee Voucher Program will be replacing the bi-annual Amnesty Program.



Voucher Guidelines

- Each residence is entitled to 2 free vouchers on an annual basis
- ♦ Each voucher is valid for 2 cubic yards of waste (equivalent to one 1/2 ton truckload
 - ◆ The appropriate tipping fee will apply for all loads exceeding this amount
 - ◆ Tipping fees remain applicable for prohibited waste
 - Surcharge fee remains appliable for white goods containing freon gas or ozone depleting substance
- Vouchers are valid anytime throughout the calendar year

- Residents are to supply a copy of their tax bill or a letter of authorization from the taxpayer/landlord to obtain the vouchers

Half Load Restrictions in Effect

March 6, 2024 until June 30, 2024, unless indicated otherwise.

When half-load restrictions are in effect, a road is off-limits to vehicles exceeding 5 tonnes per axle. However, there may be alternate routes that can be taken to reach a destination.

Why

Roads become softer and weaker during the spring thaw. Heavy vehicle traffic on these roadways can cause permanent damage. Following the half-load restrictions reduces the potential for any unnecessary road repairs or reconstruction.

Street Sweeping and Spring Clean-up

The annual spring clean-up includes sweeping all paved roads and some hard surfaces, to remove debris and materials that have accumulated throughout the winter season and could pose dangers to motorists, pedestrians/cyclists as well as clogging up catch basins and inlets.

Residents are asked to help crews clean the city by not parking vehicles on the streets while street sweeping activities are being conducted in the area. Typical hours of operations are Monday to Friday, between 6:30am and 3:00pm beginning in April (weather dependent). Hours of operation may also very depending on the location that needs to be swept.

To minimize the risk of fire and burn injury, the fire service recommends the following cottage fire safety tips:

Install smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas. It's the law for all Ontario homes, cottages, cabins and seasonal homes to have working smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas.

- Test smoke alarms at least monthly or each time you return to the cottage. Pack a new smoke alarm and extra smoke alarm batteries in case they need replacement.
- Install and ensure carbon monoxide alarms in your cottage if it has a fuel-burning appliance.
- Develop and practice a home fire escape plan to ensure everyone knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.
- Know the telephone number for the local fire department and your cottage's emergency sign number, in case of emergency.
- Clean barbecues before using them. Keep an eye on lit barbecues and ensure all combustibles, as
 well as children and pets are kept well away from them. Fires can happen when barbecues are left
 unattended.
- Keep barbecue lighters and matches out of sight and reach of children.
- Remember to bring a flashlight with extra batteries.
- · Check heating appliances and chimneys before using them.
- Check with your local fire department, municipality, or Ministry of Natural Resources to
 determine whether open air burning is permitted before having a campfire or burning brush. If
 open burning is allowed, fires should be built on bare soil or on exposed rock. Remove leaves and
 twigs from around the fire to keep it from spreading. Always keep a bucket of water, sand, or
 even a shovel close by and supervise the fire at all times.
- If you must smoke, do so outside. Keep a large can with water nearby so cigarette butts can be
 safely discarded. If you drink, do so responsibly. Tobacco use and excessive alcohol consumption
 are contributing factors in many fires and can lead to serious injuries.
- Burn candles in sturdy candleholders that will not tip and are covered with a glass shade. When
 you go out, blow out!




