Heroic efforts save 130 of 140 cattle in barn fire

TEMISKAMING SHORES - A fire in the early morning hours of May 8 destroyed a barn belonging to Hillside Farms located on Armstrong Street north of New Liskeard.

The barn is part of a complex of ten buildings purchased from the University of Guelph

four years ago.

There were 140 head of cattle in the barn at the time of the fire. Ten head of cattle were lost but the remaining herd of 130 was saved by the actions of farm manager Chris Aitchison.

Herd manager Ben Belanger stated that Aitchison and six members of the Temiskaming OPP raced through the barn and opened

gates, leading most of the herd to safety in the adjacent pastures.

"What Chris and six members of the OPP did was nothing short of heroic. Luckily, no one was

hurt. Saving 130 of the 140 head of cattle was a miracle," said Belanger.

"Barns can be rebuilt, but you cannot replace people. We are grateful for the courageous

efforts of the OPP and the fire department that contained the fire and ensured it didn't spread to nearby buildings."

The property has been used over 80 years

as an experimental farm with an infamous herd of cattle dating back over 50 years.

DID YOU GET The Speaker THIS WEEK?

Here are some of the stories in our May 8, 2024 edition...

- Temiskaming Shores council agrees to provide some \$23,630 in equipment and in-kind support to the Rockin' on Canada Day event. But council turned down a request to use municipal land near École publique des Navigateurs for camping, citing concerns over safety and liability.

ics cannot be understated. Fifty years of the University of Guelph's genetic efforts were saved today, and we are so grateful that this herd will continue to flourish."

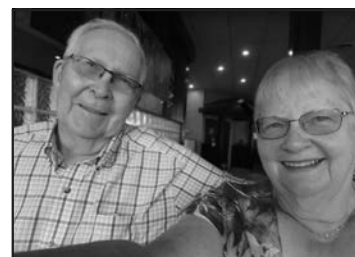
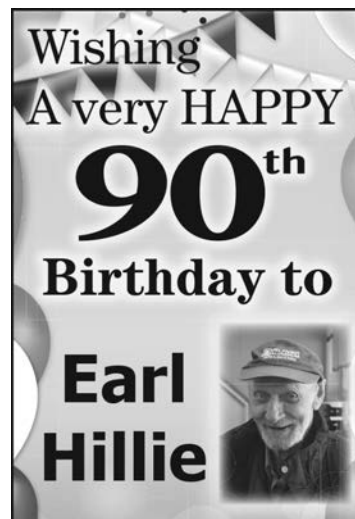

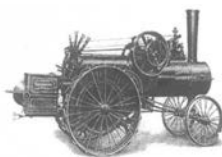

Seeing a clothesline with clothing blowing in the wind always reminds me of my dear mother.

But really, how much fun is doing laundry? Loads - if you were my mother, ha, ha.

Mom loved washing our clothes and hanging them on the line the old fashioned way and then ironing them, even the socks.

My dad used to joke saying she had his pants in the washer before they hit the floor.

Household chores are often thankless and they may feel a bit tedious at times but not to my mother, Lena Margaret Brydges.

It was her love for us, for her family and for keeping a tidy home that she did laundry with a passion.

Mom loved her clothesline and even when she had an electric dryer she still insisted on hanging bedding and other clothes on the line.

Besides, what smells better than clothes hung on the line?

There was that one cold January morning I can't quite

get out of my mind.

Mom was cooking our breakfast and had dashed outside to gather the clothes off the line.

She walked through the door with those clothes all stiff and frozen in her arms.

And then suddenly she fell to the floor in the grips of a massive stroke.

We saw our mother's face twist and she couldn't speak to tell us what was wrong so we quickly called 911.

We were all in a state of shock.

The ambulance arrived and took her to the Temiskaming Hospital. She was then air medivaced from Earlington straight to Toronto General Hospital.

Mom had severe paralysis in her throat and on the right side of her body and she had lost the ability to speak.

She spent over a month in hospital recovering.

Don't ever regret a penny of your tax dollars going to support the air ambulance service at the Earlington Regional Airport.

Lena was a fighter and had a strong will to live. She soon recovered and you would never know she had ever had a stroke.

She resumed her passion for doing laundry but used the electric dryer much more.

Mom loved doing laundry on the principles of love, care and kindness for her family.

I know she often sacrificed her health and her dreams for her children and that to me is akin to sainthood.

So if I appear to canonize my mother in this column, so be it.

She put her children first and herself last, which is sad in some ways because she sacrificed so much of her life for us.

Cherish every moment you have with your mother or caregiver because before you know it, they're gone and you have this huge hole in your heart.

Love and miss you mom.

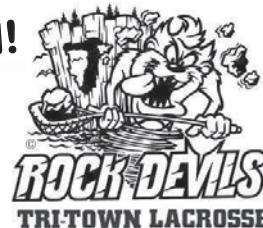

The Carolina Wren is a small, chunky, reddish-brown bird with a long tail that is often cocked up.

It has been described as having a big song for a small bird.

Pritchard first spotted the Carolina Wren in August of 2023.

"Originally I thought it was a marsh wren but the bird's song was way off," said Pritchard in an email interview.

"But I used the Merlin bird identifying app to assist and the call came up as a chickadee, clearly not. Then

deeper searching hit on the Youtube Carolina Wren video which confirmed it was a Carolina Wren."

Pritchard said the bird is very vocal for a small wren and the bird's traits are that it is generally elusive.

"Sightings are rare, photographs difficult, the song not so much and it is a joy to see any time."

He said he and his wife and the neighbours fed the wren all winter long.

"We feel that it knows we are caring for him and gives us in return some unique visits within two metres of us."

He said when the weather

turned colder they were concerned for the bird's health so they researched the best food for the wren.

"We ... started giving him the mix of high fat seed and nuts which was the main diet. Two thousand three-hundred dollars later the bird is plump, alive and singing for a mate that will not likely appear."

Pritchard said the neighbourhood families got into the habit of putting food out for the bird such as shelled sunflower seeds, nut mixes, safflower, millet and shelled peanuts "with a handful of dried mealworms for dessert."

He thinks the mild weather may have played a part in the bird staying over the winter months in his backyard area.

"The milder weather certainly helped, however the coldest night recorded here was minus-27 C and he was seen near our furnace heat outlet that morning, well adapted to the cold. We learned how clever it was several times and we did build a winter shelter to assist with winds and windchill."

UNCOMMON

The second bird to astonish the Pritchards with its appearance was a Gray catbird.

It is a medium sized, slender songbird with a long rounded black tail.

The body of the bird is gray with a black cap on the head.

They spotted the bird at the end of July near the start of the early fall migration.


Pritchard said he has spotted the Gray catbird before but that it has similar traits to the Carolina Wren, they are elusive and shy and are almost always under deep cover.

"So the bird hung on until the cold weather came and ate the same seed as the Carolina Wren."

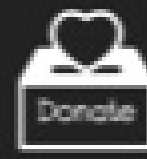

Walking in solidarity with families of MMIWG

TEMISKAMING SHORES - The fourth annual walk for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG) took place in Temiskaming Shores May 5 in company with other groups across Canada.

The walk, hosted by the Keepers of the Circle in New Liskeard, started at the Temiskaming Shores and Area Chamber of Commerce near the Highway 11 and Highway 65 intersection, and ended at the Keepers of the Circle office complex on Scott Street.

Organizer Darlene Skani said the event was amazing. Four years ago, when the first walk was held in Temiskaming Shores, seven people participated. For this year's event there were 50 people walking and the rain didn't deter them. Composed mainly of women in bright ribbon skirts, the group showed strong resolve for the walk.

Keepers of the Circle happened to have a supply of red umbrellas ordered for a previous powwow but since they had not been needed for that event they were handed out at the walk. The effect was a sea of red moving down Armstrong Street and along Whitewood Avenue to the beat of drums and the sound of singing voices, accompanied by the flashing lights of police cruisers and emergency vehicles to ensure safety.

"It's nice to see it growing and getting a little bit bigger every year," said Skani in a telephone interview.

"It's definitely good to raise awareness in the town."

She said the walks are held "to stand in solidarity with those families of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit."

Skani said it is scary for young Indigenous women who are leaving their communities and going to the cities for education or work.

RVs, Trailers and Campers: Propane and Barbecue Safety Tips

When Transporting Cylinders:

- Ensure propane cylinders are upright and secure during transport.
- Keep cylinder valves closed and protected during transport.
- Plug or cap cylinder outlets during transport.

When Using Cylinders:

- Ensure cylinders are upright and secure on a firm footing.
- Check cylinder connections and hoses for leaks by brushing a 50/50 mix of liquid soap and water onto all connections and hoses. Rising bubbles when you turn on the valve indicate a leak. Tighten connections or repair the hose until there are no bubbles.
- Keep cylinders away from flame, heat, and exits.

Using Propane in your RV or Camper:

- Keep all combustion exhaust vents on the exterior wall of your RV or camper clear of obstructions.
- Use stovetop burners or ovens only for cooking and not as a source of heat.
- Propane appliances require an adequate supply of fresh air for proper combustion. Ensure your RV or camper is properly ventilated to prevent build-up of carbon monoxide.
- Install a carbon monoxide alarm and propane leak detector.

Barbecue Safety:

- Ensure barbecues are on firm, level footing.
- Keep barbecues well away from the side of your RV, camper or tent, and other combustibles.
- Make sure igniter buttons work properly before turning the gas on. If there is no igniter, insert a long match or barbecue lighter through the side burner hole before you turn on the grill controls.
- Keep barbecues clean of grease to prevent flare-ups.
- Stay by the grill when cooking and keep kids and pets at a safe distance.
- Turn off all burner controls and tank valves after each use.

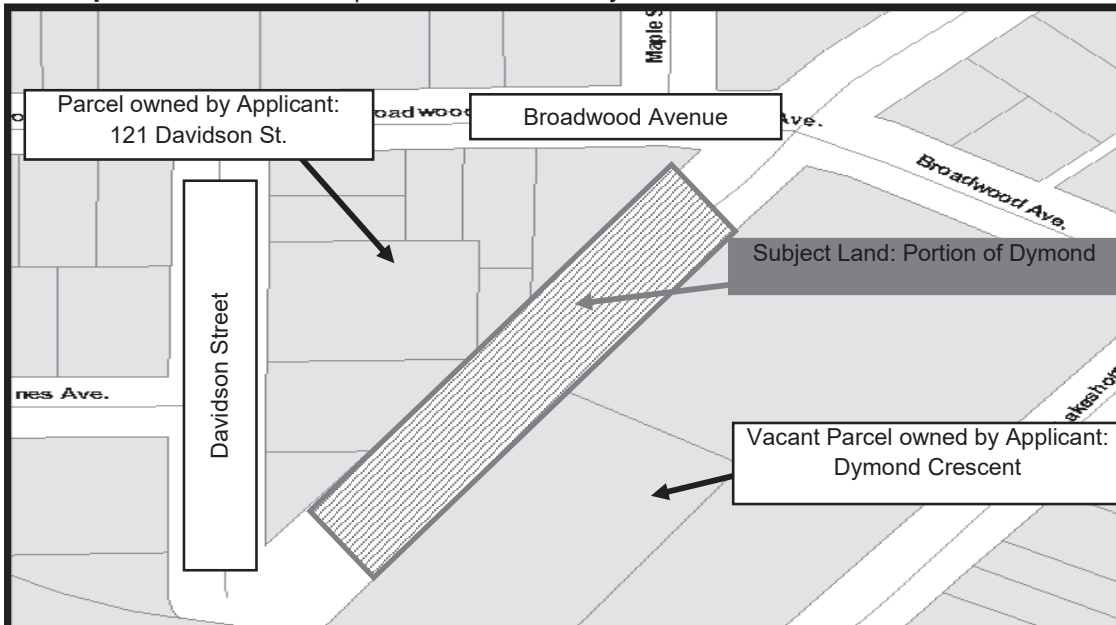

The two birds were seen together over the winter many times.

Both birds preferred to roost in sunny secluded spots to obtain the sun's warmth. "The catbird ate the suet

balls from Yves Prime Cut Meats that we put out with the high fat content. Both birds did the same on cold days."

He said the Gray catbird's plumage is changing to breeding plumage and the bird is the same size as a red winged blackbird, gray with a dark red rump patch.

"He's been calling a lot lately and we are more hopeful that it will find a mate," said Pritchard.

MARSH PERSPECTIVE

Seeing a Carolina Wren in this region, while not common, has been accomplished as they have been spotted by various birders, noted Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre (HMREC) birder Bruce Murphy in an email interview.

"They are both out of range for the winter but the catbird is very unusual. We have had a few sightings of Carolina Wrens over winter and had one at the house on Dawson Point about nine years ago, which we actually banded."

He said the range of the catbird is the gulf coast from Florida to Texas and into Central America.

"So it is very unusual to see a catbird here. There have been several Carolina Wren spottings but it is super exciting to see one up here anytime of the year. The mild winter no doubt has allowed all sorts of winter rarities across the north and the abundance of fruit bearing trees does play a role in those sightings," said Murphy.

REPORTING

If you think you have

spotted a bird that is not normally found in the Temiskaming region, a group called Ontario Rare Bird Alert monitors rare bird sightings.

There is a database of rare bird sightings in Ontario available in the archives at the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto.

A description of the bird with size, colouring, type of bill, the bird's song, the sex and number of birds and the weather patterns at the time of the sighting is needed when reporting rare bird sightings.

You can also message the HMREC Facebook page to let them know of your sighting.

A free bird identification app called Merlin ID can also be used to identify bird species.

"They really only know their own communities. They really are taking a big leap of faith going out and living away from that community."

She said there is a new awareness campaign called Am I Next. The campaign raises awareness of the fear Indigenous women feel in Temiskaming Shores or any community in which they wonder if they or their daughters might be the next to disappear or be murdered.

"It's a growing fear and a growing concern," she said.

She noted that Keepers of the Circle, besides being a day care, also is a community hub with a family services team and has many resources and connections within the area, as well as connections in other towns and cities which they are able to share with Indigenous women who could benefit from those resources.

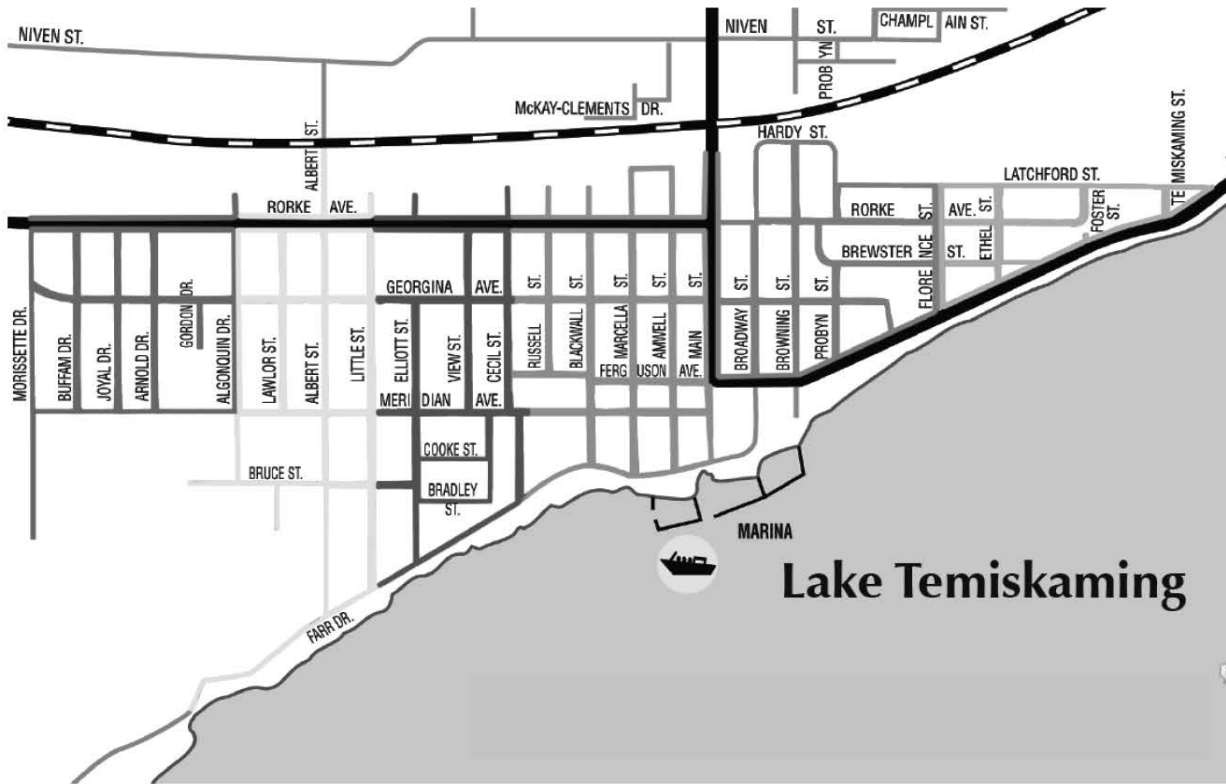
