

TEMISKAMING SHORES – Fuzzy socks, a throw, gloves, a puzzle game, a journal, lip balm and hand cream, an eye mask.

Thirty bags filled with comfort items are headed to patients at Temiskaming Hospital who are undergoing chemotherapy.

They're gifts from the English Catholic Central School community.

"We want to show our love, spread our love to the community," explained teacher Melanie Dixon-Fleury.

Each and every person in the area, she said, has been affected by cancer, whether it's struck a family member, a co-worker, or a friend.

But no one knows what cancer treatment is really like unless one goes through it, she said.

A friend told her of things she wished she'd had at the time.

It sparked the idea to do something tangible, she said.

It fit with the theme of Catholic Education Week in early May – "We are called to love."

The school called on its community, including students' families and friends, for donations to pull together bags of items to make patients' time at the hospital feel a little more like home.

"We only had a week to collect 30 bags," she said.

The donations poured in.

Dangerous Plant Species in the Area

Giant Hogweed

The stems and leaves of this plant are covered with small hairs coated with poisonous sap. Even the slightest touch can cause painful blisters and severe skin irritation. The symptoms can take a couple of days to develop with the skin becoming highly photosensitive producing large watery blisters; however the effects can be long lasting, with contact resulting in recurrent dermatitis. This is a particular concern for small children who may use the stems as pea-shooters or pretend telescopes resulting in horrific injuries.

What does Hogweed Look Like?

- very tall, 8-14 feet
- · Stems have rigid hairs, purple blotches and are hollow
- Flower clusters up to 2 ft across occurring from mid-June to late July
- · Has a reddish-purple stem with fine spines that make it appear furry

Wild Parsnip

Is another weed that should also be avoided. The effects are similar to those associated with Giant Hog Weed. Irritation can occur if your skin contacts the plant's fluids and is then exposed to sunlight. Contact with the eyes can cause temporary blindness and in rare cases permanent blindness.

Wild parsnip can be found within uncultivated land, roadside ditches, parklands, nature trails and sports fields as well as on and around residential properties.

What Does Wild Parsnip Look Like?

- smells like parsnip
- stands 20-60 inches high, branched, hollow stem
- small yellow clustered flowers
- flowers from late June into late fall (resembles dill)

Being able to readily identify wild parsnip and giant hogweed will minimize accidental exposure to these plants and the painful results that follow.

Anyone having information on specific locations where these weeds are posing a public risk should contact the Invading Species Hotline at 1-800-563-7711. You will be asked to send in photos for identification. **DO NOT** touch, cut or collect parts of the plant.

As the warmer weather approaches, moose and other wildlife will cross area roads, perhaps with young calves by their side.

The bugs are driving the moose, deer and bears out of the bush onto area roadways.

While some collisions are going to happen, especially at night, there are some common sense steps we can take to prevent these tragic incidents.

Moose are hard to see at night because their dark fur blends in with the surroundings. Because they are so tall their eyes may not reflect in headlights when they are most active at dawn or dusk.

Keep your speed low, especially where you see those big yellow Ministry of Transportation moose warning signs along the highway.


Continuously look on the sides of the road for signs of wildlife and be prepared to stop to avoid encoun-

When driving at night use your high beams to spot animals at a distance, but remember to dim them for oncoming traffic.


Stay especially vigilant at dawn or dusk when moose, bear and deer are most active.

Birds of a feather

What a gorgeous long weekend it was.

I took my shoes and socks off and strolled through the cool dew-soaked grass to my canoe.

Getting in and out of the canoe is challenging because the water is so high this year and there is no beach.

The water is cool but normal for this time of year. It felt terrific to dig my bare feet into the lake sand.

I headed out around Taylor's Point on my favourite lake and heard a bird chirping high above me in the tall red pines.

All of a sudden an eagle flew out of the top branches, swooped down and flew away across the lake toward the Montreal River.

It must have had its keen eye on the white suckers spawning just below it on the east side of the lake.

As it flew away, a white tail feather drifted slowly down and landed softly on the water. The eagle is known among some Indigenous people as Migizi, the one that flies the highest and speaks with the creator.

I love the stories of Indigenous culture and if there are people who respect and steward the land it is our First Nations brothers and sisters.

Miigwetch.

I paddled over and scooped up the feather with my paddle. I considered it a good omen to begin my day.

I felt like that feather, free and liberated as I made my way around the lake.

I considered it an unexpected gift from such a majestic bird.

A gift to cherish over the buzzing sounds around my ears coming from the hoards of black flies following me. Ugh.

In First Nation culture, an eagle feather represents the highest honour one can bestow on another person.

Eagle feathers are gifted in honour, never taken or asked for or bought.

So it was with this thought in mind that I returned the eagle feather to the waters of the lake.

I gifted it to the lake because I felt what better way to honour the element of water and its importance in my life. It's often difficult to express the spirituality I feel when in my canoe.

I have read that the eagle feather is also a symbol of connection, and there I was connected with the doorway to the temple - the lake.

The morning's glory cloaked in nature's gifts.

So many people these days are weighed down with anguish about their lives.

Sometimes I wish my words could be like the flight of the eagle, bold and uplifting.

But hey, I can't make everyone happy, I'm not pizza.

Let us remember, we stand neither above nor below anyone, but directly equal to all people on this beautiful planet.

As Indigenous culture teaches us, all things posses inherent power and beauty.

Emergency situations Call 911 or your local police if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety and exhibits threatening or aggressive behaviour, such as:

- enters a school yard when school is in session
- stalks people and lingers at the site
- enters or tries to enter a residence
- · wanders into a public gathering
- kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site

Non-emergency encounters Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 or TTY 705-945-7641 if a bear:

- roams around or checks garbage cans
- breaks into a shed where garbage is stored
- is in a tree
- pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
- moves through a backyard or field but does not



Keeping kids safe on the farm

needs to be done to keep kids safe on the farm, says a national initiative tracking farm safety.

In a recent news release, the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association said the latest statistics about child and youth deaths related to agriculture are concerning.

It oversees the Canadian

WINNIPEG (Special) – More Agricultural Injury Report- the ages of one and four. ing (CAIR) system, a national surveillance program coordinated by the Injury Prevention Centre at the University of Alberta.

> According to CAIR data, from 1990 to 2020, 435 children and youth lost their lives due to agriculture-related incidents. The most fatalities were recorded among children between

The association notes that farms and ranches are not just workplaces, but also areas where people live and play.

What's contributing to so many agriculture-related fatalities among children and youth?

CAIR found the majority 65 per cent – of deaths were caused by machin-

ery, and most of those incidents involved a tractor.

Tractor runovers accounted for 32 per cent of child and youth deaths, followed by rollovers, at 15 per cent, and drownings, which represented 11 per cent.

But the second-largest category for mechanisms of injury were described as "other."





The initiative may be repeated next year.

With more lead time, Dixon-Fleury said the number of care packages could be increased.

And she's already thinking of additional items that could be included.

Spring COVID-19 Vaccine Program: May to June 2024 La campagne de vaccination contre la COVID-19 du printemps: mai à juin 2024

The Ministry of Health recommends the following groups receive an additional vaccine dose this spring:

- Adults aged 65 and older,
- Adult residents of long-term care homes and other senior living communities,
- Individuals aged 6 months and up, who are moderately to severely immunocompromised due to an underlying condition or treatment, or
- Individuals aged 55 and older who are First Nations, Inuit or Metis, and their non-Indigenous household members who are 55 years and older.

The spring booster is particularly important for those at higher risk of severe illness, especially if they missed the fall 2023 vaccine.

If you do not fall into the above categories, stay tuned for further guidance from the Ministry of Heath.





That underscores, said the association, the various hazards on the farm that can cause injury.

Most of these victims – 67 per cent – were not working at the time of the fatal incidents but were in the area of farm work.

Children of farm owners/operators made up the for growing up quickly belargest number of victims.

What can you do to keep kids safe on the farm?

While farm kids are known cause of the environment they are brought up in, the association stresses that it must be remembered that they're still children.

It advises that any tasks assigned to children be age-appropriate.

While kids might be living and playing on the farm, it's also a workplace with plenty of hazards.

Take time to create a designated play area, put barriers where possible around areas kids shouldn't access (such as bodies of water or heights), and always provide adequate supervision.

Discuss safety regularly with your kids, making it a routine part of conversations, and lead by example by demonstrating safe practices in your own actions.

CASA hosted a new public awareness campaign, Kids FarmSafe Week, in May to promote the safety and wellness of children and youth on Canadian farms.






