Bike exchange program encourages healthy lifestyles

Since June is Bike Month in TEMISKAMING SHORES — If Ontario, it was a fitting way to

spin into the month with last weekend's Bike Exchange event, held June 15 at Haileybury HarbourPlace. There were plenty of

spokes for folks to check out including 75 bikes available for children, youth and adults to obtain on the day.

There was also a riding course set up where volunteers provided input to children on stopping, turning and the importance of wearing helmets.

A craft table was set up for children to enjoy themselves while siblings tried out bikes.

It was the first year the City of Temiskaming Shores, in partnership with Temiskaming Shores Bike Club and the Timiskaming Health Unit, held the event in Haileybury at the waterfront.

"We are still looking for a permanent home to house the bikes and repair them over the winter months," said Bike Exchange lead organizer Linda St. Cyr.

Bikes for all ages are donated by the community and made available on a first-come, firstserved basis. People wishing to have a bike must attend the event

in person and be fitted properly for a bike.

You don't pay for bikes and you don't have to donate one to receive one.

People were encouraged to bring helmets and they were also instructed on how to properly wear a helmet on the day.

St. Cyr said the group needs a rent-free place that is mildly heated with decent space and lighting so that their dedicated volunteers can work on bikes to prepare them for the annual exchange.

"We are very thankful to the City for allowing the volunteers to operate out of the Haileybury garage the last few months."

City of Temiskaming Shores director of recreation Mathew Bahm was pleased with the turnout.

"It didn't take us long to bring the bikes here from the garage. I think we made two trips and it has all worked out well. We are pleased to

Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes.

A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

the fur trade, this region was inhabited by First Nation people.

Indigenous people have inhabited this region for 6,000 years. Those people include the Temagami First Nation, the Timiskaming First Nation and the Beaverhouse First Nation in Matachewan.

The region was populated mainly by the Algonquin Anishnabai and Ojibwa Cree.

It might be safe to say that our Indigenous brothers and sisters have been here since "time immemorial."

It was Indigenous people who knew the story of the Temiskaming landscape, not the European settlers.

In Cobalt at the turn of the 20th century, silver was being mined which led to

much of the north being opened up.

So let's set the record straight. In his latest book called Cobalt, Timmins-James Bay MP Charlie Angus said, "In fact, a complex Indigenous silver mining trade in the region reached back thousands of years. Ceremonial panpipes made from Cobalt silver have been found in burial mounds in Ohio, Georgia, and Mississippi. Silver jewellery from Cobalt has been uncovered in archaeological digs in New York State. Nuggets of pure Cobalt silver were carefully placed in Michigan burial sites. Some of these burial mounds, known as "Hopewell sites," are massive earthworks representing ingenious human endeavours that rival the construction of the great Egyptian pyramids."

Silver was discovered prior to the Cobalt silver rush by Indigenous people who traded the precious metal for items of interest at the time. We must acknowledge that the stories surrounding the history of this region are heavily dominated by the colonization of Europeans.

Meanwhile, the stories of First Nation peoples have been pushed to the background.

In the spirit of truth and reconciliation, we acknowledge the original First Nation presence in Temiskaming.

I was listening to an Anishnabai elder speak about her language recently. A language that is land based and quite beautiful.

Every time I hear the soft-spoken elder, Grandma Marilyn Chevrier-Wills, speak about her culture I learn something new and profound.

She is a cultural educator from the Timiskaming First Nation and she is such a beautiful kwe, kwe.

I have often listened to her talk about a water ceremony, explain the importance of berries to First Nation people and explain the symbolism of the medicine wheel.

Many of us have a dream catcher attached to car mirrors or hanging in our homes, but do we know the meaning behind it?

National Indigenous Peoples Day is happening this week on Friday, June 21, with a Pow Wow at Mill Creek in North Cobalt.

We know that Indigenous people have been damaged by generations of oppression, by the residential school experience, the Sixties Scoop and overt racism.

Indigenous people may be damaged but certainly not bro-

Systemic racism does exist in this region and country. One only has to look at the Indian Act for proof of that.

Under the Indian Act First Nations people were confined to the reserve through the pass system. Education was segregated with day schools and Indian Residential Schools, as was health care. These rules were enforced by the RCMP.

The Indian Act is now over 145 years old and I hope to see its abolishment in my lifetime.

What I have seen with my own two eves is Indigenous people are amazingly resilient and they have survived and thrived when life has often been cruel and oppressive towards them.

It is vitally important that our First Nation brothers and sisters speak their language and practice their cultural ceremonies. Indigenous youth are one of the fastest growing demographics in this country responsible for business startups at nine times that of other cultures.

"Indigenomics" is about economic growth and development for Indigenous communities, which is a positive antidote to historical injus-

You rarely hear about a mining or forestry project in the north that does not consult and partner with First Nations these days.

As we dance, take part in a smudge ceremony and move as one people this June 21, let us remember the words of the brilliant Indigenous writer Richard Wagamese: "The most profound truth in the universe is this: that we are all one drum, one spirit and we need each other."





TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – Resources are available locally and online to help smokers quit, says the Timiskaming Health Unit.

In a recent news release, the health unit said family health teams offer the STOP smoking cessation program, which offers free nicotine replacement therapy (NRT) to eligible participants.

And for people who are not enrolled with a family health team, it said they can participate in STOP on the Net. The online service, developed by the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, also offers free NRT to smokers aged 18 and up.

In a news release, it noted that Temiskaming's rate of adult smoking is the highest in the province.

A survey of self-reported data found 22 per cent of the district's adult population reported smoking daily. That's more than twice the 10.1 per cent reported in Ontario as a whole.

The health unit sees a community response as needed to help drive down local smoking rates.

Municipalities, it said, can adopt enhanced smoke-free bylaws to make more areas tobacco-free, including beaches, trails and municipal properties and events.

Employers can support employees to attempt to quit smoking.

Local independent events such as fall fairs, street fairs and community festivals can also choose to be smoke-free.


It said health care providers can also ask clients about their tobacco use on a regular basis and help direct them to resources. Family and friends, it continued, can also support loved ones making a quit attempt.

It noted that the theme of this year's World No Tobacco Day was protection of children from tobacco industry interference.

It said youth and young adults are targeted by such products as vapes and nicotine pouches with flavours, attractive packaging, and social media influencers.

Youth who become addicted to nicotine, it said, are more likely to smoke.






