Pilot project reducing waste lines

TEMISKAMING SHORES - A little machine has earned big praise from city residents who took part in a food waste reduction pilot project.

A total of 154 residents of Temiskaming Shores purchased FoodCycler units earlier this year.

The electricity-powered devices convert leftovers and food scraps into a dry, sterile, odourless by-product that can be added to the garden.

Over a 12-week period, participants tracked their usage.

The results were summarized by Brittany Clarke, municipal program manager at Ottawa-based Food Cycle Science, when city council met July 9.

Participants used on average 0.7 fewer bags of garbage per week.

Over the course of the year, that would translate into 37.4 fewer bags of garbage per participating household, and 40 million tonnes of food waste diverted from the landfill.

In the company's analysis, the 154 units would divert 52 metric tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalents, a measure of greenhouse gases.

That equates to the carbon that would be sequestered by almost 61 acres of forest in a year.

Seventy-four per cent of survey respondents reported they are also now more motivated to reduce their food waste.

"So the awareness that comes with this program is very important," Clarke said.

The numbers based on just 154 participants are "really impressive," commented Councillor Danny Whalen.

Given that there are more than 4,800 homes in the city, Whalen said the impact of the units on the landfill could be significant.

Participants paid \$150 or \$300 for a unit, depending on its size.

The overall cost was subsidized by the city, at \$100 per unit. The retail price for the pilot project was further offset by federal support. The city was originally going to buy only 100 units, but increased the number in light of public demand.

After the meeting, Mayor Jeff Laferriere said the scale of the project "really did give us a good sample size."

Based on the cost-benefit analysis for the city, "clearly it is having a positive impact," he said.

He said city staff will take a further look at the project and have some more discussions with the company.

The city may be able to put

Elder Abuse Awareness

Elder Abuse is one of the most underreported crimes in Canada affecting hundreds of thousands of people every year.

Elder abuse comes in many forms:

- Psychological abuse in the form of threats, insults, or humiliation
- Financial abuse in which a trusted individual steals or misuses an elderly person's money, forges their signature, or pressures them to make or change legal documents. An example might be sharing an older person's home without paying a fair share of the expenses when requested.
- Physical abuse such as hitting, pushing, or restraining an elderly person
- Sexual abuse including sexual harassment and non-consensual sexual activity
- Neglect of an elderly person who requires care.
 Seniors most vulnerable to neglect, include those who are socially isolated and those with serious health conditions.

The truth is elder abuse is any action taken by someone in a relationship of trust with an elderly person that causes harm or distress.

People can engage in abusive behaviour without realizing it. Sometimes seemingly innocent or well-meaning actions cross the line. For example, someone might open an older relative's mail to save them stress of bill-paying, but if done without the elderly person's permission, that breach of privacy could be a form of psychological abuse. A caregiver who gives more than the prescribed dosage of medication to keep an elderly patient calm could be engaging in physical abuse.

There is no definitive list of everything elder abuse is and is not. We must be mindful of how elder abuse can take on different forms and be cautious of how our actions could cause harm.

Make sure to listen to your elderly parents, friends, or other family members and take their concerns seriously. If you suspect abuse, report it immediately to health care providers, social services, police, legal professionals and/or members of faith communities.

If you are an elder who is being abused, neglected, or exploited, tell at least one person. Tell your doctor, a friend, or a family member whom you trust. Other people care and can help you.

There is no excuse for abuse!

While schools need fixing and many people can't afford rent and food, Ford's priority is booze.



Family secrets

For years she was a Canadian literary icon, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 2013.

We all boasted about her, we loved her, worshipped her wit and adored her skill at writing short stories.

We read what she wrote about ordinary women but we didn't know she had a daughter who had been sexually abused by her stepfather, the writer's husband.

Alice Munro's daughter, Andrea Robin Skinner, recently came out with stunning allegations of sexual assault against her stepfather.

And apparently, according to Skinner, when she told the adults in her life, her father and mother, they ignored her.

So in effect, they enabled a pedophile to abuse her.

This is why children need to be believed when they tell stories of sexual abuse.

When people don't believe children about sexual abuse the perpetrators are given a free pass to continue their evil ways.

The pressure on children to keep quiet about the abuse can and has ruined lives.

It is every adult's duty to protect children from harm.

The majority of abusers are people who are known to the victim.

The important takeaway from this horrible story is: when your child tells you someone has sexually abused them, believe them. Then call police.

The shock of knowing your partner or family member has done something like that can be devastating.

There may come feelings of denial, but for the sake of

the child, believe their stories and protect them from further abuse.

I will not open the pages of an Alice Munro book again.

This is where ethics come into play because I feel it is unethical to support people who have abused children or looked the other way when it was being carried out.

When Woody Allen became involved with his stepdaughter, I could not watch a single movie he had been in after that.

And when rapper Chris Brown beat up his then girlfriend, singer Rihanna, I knew I would never purchase or listen to another Chris Brown song ever again.

My moral compass stays steady when I hear about people who abuse children and women.

But isn't society complicit in the abuse of children? "Oh, she's lying, she's crazy, she dressed provocatively." Meanwhile, Munro's daughter was a nine-year-old girl.

I think we all need to take a long hard look at how we treat victims in this country. And if we are silent about sexual assault, we are complicit.

We often downplay the harshness of these acts by saying "oh he was a good guy but he made a mistake."

Parents and caregivers must do everything in their power to nurture and protect children.

- roams around or checks garbage cans
- breaks into a shed where garbage is stored
- is in a tree
- pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
- moves through a backyard or field but does not

First 3D printing contest makes an impression

TIMMINS (Special) – What can schools, from Temiskaming you make with a 3D printer? Shores to Hearst, took part in

Winning creations from high school students in Temiskaming and Cochrane included an action figure and a swivelling desk clamp.

Students from 10 high

Schools, from Temiskaming Shores to Hearst, took part in Northern College's first-ever 3D printing competition.

The contest began in March when students submitted project concept descriptions to Northern College for evaluation. Prototypes were then printed at each high school using Bambu Lab P1S 3D printers donated by the college.

In May, final prototypes were produced at the 3D printing lab at Northern's Timmins campus. Entries were evaluated based on originality, complexity, and functionality or artistic expression.

The winner in the creative category was Andrew Cull of Timiskaming District Secondary School.

Cull created an articulated hydra dragon model with moveable knees, legs and hands.

The model can "dynamically move and be posed as desired," said Cull in a media release.

The winner in the functional category was James Buller of Englehart High School, who designed a clamp that can be affixed to a desk and used to hide a garbage can.

"It can swivel to bring the garbage can out to throw out trash on your desk easily," said Buller.

"I made this clamp because my desk is dirty, and this would make it super easy to keep it clean."

The winners each received a Bambu Lab A1 Mini 3D printer.

Englehart High School students also figured among the eight students named runners-up. Each received a custom-engraved Yeti mug.


Englehart recipients in the creative category were Nicholas Sikkema (an '80s-style beach), Hailey Field (ocean scene) and Devon Hayes (camper).


Englehart High School recipients in the functional category were Aaron Mowbray (drawers) and Madison Heavens (black projector).







Sticking to tick protection

TORONTO (Special) – As the hot summer continues, the Ontario government is encouraging people to take precautions to prevent tick bites and reduce the risk of contracting Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases.

In a news release, it warned that being bitten by an infected blacklegged tick, commonly called a deer tick, can lead to potentially serious infections, including Lyme disease and other diseases.

If you have any symptoms such as fever, headache, chills, muscle and joint pain, fatigue and an expanding circular rash that resembles a bullseye, consult a health care provider as soon as possible.

Since 2021, there have been almost 5,000 cases of Lyme disease, 17 cases of anaplasmosis, and 10 cases of babesiosis in Ontario.

"Blacklegged ticks are continuing to spread to new areas of the province, but by being proactive, we can combat the risk they pose and safely enjoy the beauty of Ontario over the coming months," said Deputy Premier and Health Minister Sylvia Jones.

If you are living, working, visiting, or enjoying outdoor activities in a wooded area, or an area with tall grass and bushes (including city gardens and parks) you are at greater risk of being bitten by a tick.

You can protect yourself from tick bites by:

- Wearing light-coloured clothing, so it's easier to spot ticks.
- Wearing long-sleeved shirts, long pants tucked into your socks, closed-toed shoes, or any special clothing designed to repel ticks.
- Applying insect repellent containing DEET or icaridin on your exposed skin and your clothes.
- Checking yourself, your children, and your pets for ticks after being outdoors. Any ticks found should be removed promptly.
- Putting your clothes on high heat in a dryer for at least 10 minutes before washing them, after spending time outdoors.

Ticks are very small and hard to see.

When found a tick should be

removed immediately using finetipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin as possible without crushing it.

Once you have removed a tick, wash your skin with soap and water and then disinfect your skin and your hands with rubbing alcohol or an iodine swab.

Before disposing of the tick, call or check the website of your local public health unit to get advice on how to identify the tick.

You can also submit a photo of the tick to etick.ca for identification.

"As areas where ticks can be found continue to grow, so too do the risks of tick bites and tick-borne diseases," said Dr. Kieran Moore, Ontario's chief medical officer of health.

"By being vigilant, wearing appropriate clothing and doing routine tick checks, we can avoid tick bites and ensure our trips outside are safe and healthy, in the months ahead."

If you have any health concerns after a tick bite, consult a health care provider as soon as possible.

Most cases of Lyme disease can be treated successfully with antibiotics, and pharmacists have been able to prescribe medication to treat tick bites to prevent Lyme disease since January 1, 2023.
