Tentative agreement reached on sale of Thornloe Cheese

MISSISSAUGA – A tentative agreement has been reached that would see the sale of Thornloe Cheese to a Mississauga-based cheese maker.

In a July 3 news release, plant owner Gay Lea Foods announced that it has entered into a letter of intent to sell Thornloe Cheese to Triple "A" Cheese.

Gay Lea explained that a letter of intent is a non-binding, tentative agreement giving Triple

"A" Cheese the opportunity to secure financing to construct a new cheese making plant near the current location.

Under the proposed terms of sale, Triple "A" Cheese would acquire all Thornloe Cheese assets, including the existing plant, brand, cheese recipes and plant supply quota.

Gay Lea states, "While this is a private sale and financial terms will not be disclosed, the organizations have agreed to a significantly advantaged sale price for the buyer, as well as deferred payment terms."

It stressed that all aspects of the sale are

Elder Abuse Awareness

Elder Abuse is one of the most underreported crimes in Canada affecting hundreds of thousands of people every year.

Elder abuse comes in many forms:

- **Psychological abuse** in the form of threats, insults, or humiliation
- **Financial abuse** in which a trusted individual steals or misuses an elderly person's money, forges their signature, or pressures them to make or change legal documents. An example might be sharing an older person's home without paying a fair share of the expenses when requested.
- **Physical abuse** such as hitting, pushing, or restraining an elderly person
- **Sexual abuse** including sexual harassment and non-consensual sexual activity
- **Neglect** of an elderly person who requires care. Seniors most vulnerable to neglect, include those who are socially isolated and those with serious health conditions.

The truth is **elder abuse is any action taken by someone in a relationship of trust with an elderly person that causes harm or distress.**

People can engage in abusive behaviour without realizing it. Sometimes seemingly innocent or well-meaning actions cross the line. For example, someone might open an older relative's mail to save them stress of bill-paying, but if done without the elderly person's permission, that breach of privacy could be a form of psychological abuse. A caregiver who gives more than the prescribed dosage of medication to keep an elderly patient calm could be engaging in physical abuse.

There is no definitive list of everything elder abuse is and is not. **We must be mindful of how elder abuse can take on different forms and be cautious of how our actions could cause harm.**

Make sure to listen to your elderly parents, friends, or other family members and take their concerns seriously. If you suspect abuse, report it immediately to health care providers, social services, police, legal professionals and/or members of faith communities.

If you are an elder who is being abused, neglected, or exploited, tell at least one person. Tell your doctor, a friend, or a family member whom you trust. Other people care and can help you.

The Swiss Army knife of their community, municipal clerks and CAOs keep the wheels of government moving.

They deal with incredibly complex issues to help sup-

port city and rural councils.

A good working relationship between councils, clerks and CAOs brings stability to a municipality.

High-level municipal employees can act as shape-shifters for municipal councils when trust is developed between the two entities.

We have seen a number of municipalities in the Temiskaming region deal with the loss of CAOs and clerks, and it has been challenging to find qualified people to replace them.

If you do find good ones, you do everything in your power to keep them.

- enters a school yard when school is in session
- stalks people and lingers at the site
- enters or tries to enter a residence
- wanders into a public gathering
- kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site

Non-emergency encounters Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 or TTY 705-945-7641 if a bear:

- roams around or checks garbage cans
- breaks into a shed where garbage is stored
- is in a tree
- pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
- moves through a backyard or field but does not linger

New trail honours rock collector who loved Cobalt area

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP - A dramatic setting at the Little Silver Vein on the Heritage Silver Trail, punctuated with bird song, the gentle fall of rain, and the occasional interested mosquito, helped illustrate many of the reasons that John Calder loved the Cobalt area.

Another of those reasons was the two dozen people who turned out for the ribbon cutting for the new John Calder Memorial Trail.

Hikers and local history enthusiasts will enjoy the new 0.6 kilometre trail that has now been added to the Heritage Silver Trail.

The John Calder Memorial Trail has been made possible through a donation by the Calder Foundation to the Cobalt Historical Society. The Foundation has also made possible the repair of the relief statue on Silver Street in downtown Cobalt, carried out in 2023.

An enthusiastic rock and mineral collector, Calder (1932-2022) lived in Port Perry in his retirement years, and had a great love for the Cobalt area, and visited frequently with his friend Bob Beckett of Stouffville. His son Keith, who spearheaded the funding of the project, attended the Haileybury School of Mines, and Calder also visited the area on fishing trips with his son Chris.

Daughter Dulande Joaquin of Kingston and her husband Scott were in attendance at the ribbon-cutting ceremony

June 29 along with Beckett and his wife Brenda and about two dozen other volunteers and supporters.

Cobalt Historical Society chair Maggie Wilson also thanked Reiner Mielke, who is the trail manager for the Cobalt Historical Society and who helped bring the project into being.

She also thanked Agnico Eagle who she explained first suggested such a project years ago, and allow access onto the mines which Agnico owns.

Coleman Township Mayor Dan Cleroux and Cobalt

Deputy Mayor Pat Anderson (who is a local history enthusiast and a member of the Cobalt Historical Society) were also present for the ribbon-cutting ceremony.

Wilson explained that the Heritage Silver Trail is "a self-guided tour of the remains of the industrial mining structures that are still around in the area."

She said that during the study of the maps in the Coleman Township archives, it was discovered that the road which has been used as the base for the trail was the original road which

"connected the Town of Cobalt to the McKinley Darrah mine and the mines further south in Coleman Township, including the Little Silver Vein, and those at Giroux Lake and Kerr Lake."

It is a switchback trail, called by neighbours "the corkscrew," constructed that way to enable horse-drawn wagonloads of material to more easily travel the hilly terrain. Along the way, hikers will also see a portion of the iron compressed air pipe which was installed in 1910.

Beckett told the gathering that he and Calder collected

minerals together primarily in Ontario, but also travelled into Quebec and made longer trips to Nova Scotia.

"John loved this area. There's no question about it. He loved to walk the sites and remember the history and look at old photographs."

Calder was a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force for 20 years, and when he retired from the military he worked as an electronics technician and electrician, and upon his retirement from that he turned to rock and mineral collecting as his passion.

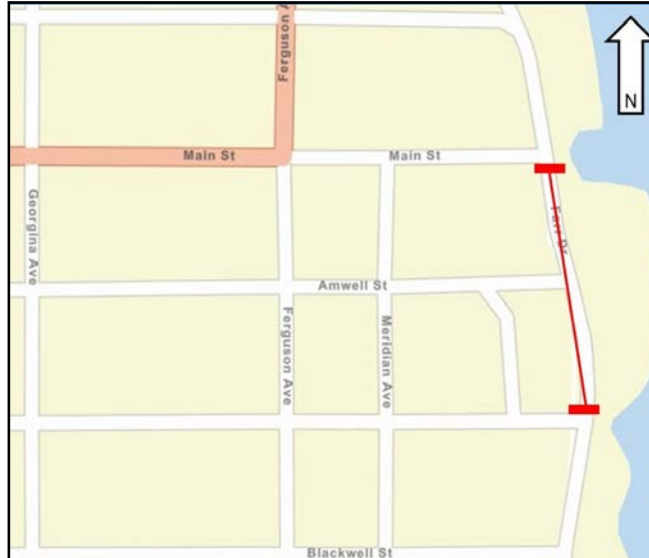

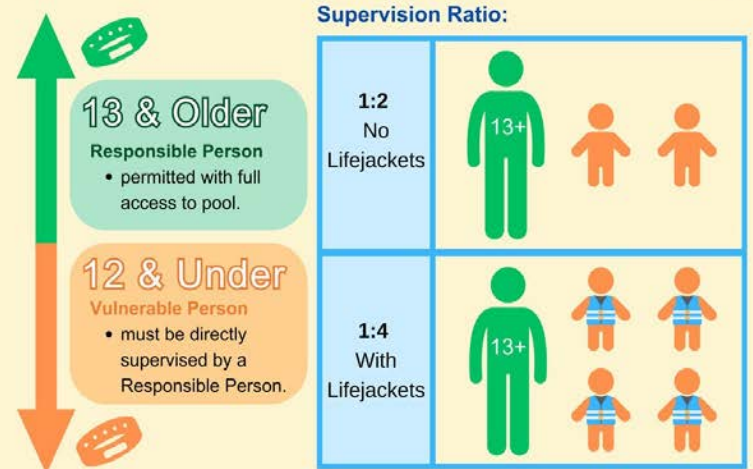

Tentative agreement reached on sale of Thornloe Cheese

contingent on Triple "A" Cheese securing funding to build a new dairy plant near the current Thornloe Cheese location.

In a statement, Gay Lea president and CEO Suzanne Dalrymple said Gay Lea is pleased "to have found a buyer with an innovative vision for Thornloe Cheese."

Dalrymple said the current plant requires "significant investment and is no longer financially viable."

"We believe a different concept, and a new facility, are needed for the brand to thrive in Northern Ontario – and we're hopeful the considerable effort invested in this project – by both organizations – will deliver that outcome."

The news was welcomed by James Franks, Temiskaming Shores' economic development officer.

"This has the potential to be a huge economic and tourism boost for our community," said Franks in an email.

Gay Lea abruptly closed Thornloe Cheese eight months ago. It cited the need for some \$10 million in upgrades and no prospect of a return on that investment. About 35 employees were affected by the closure.

VISION

Triple "A" Cheese describes itself as a family-owned business and one of Canada's largest feta cheese makers and a top producer of quality dairy products.

It has outlined a new vision for the operation.

The manufacturing plant itself would be relocated to what's described as "a more suitable local property" serviced by municipal water and wastewater treatment.

It would be a tourist and local destination, offering fresh foods, a coffee shop or deli restaurant, party rooms, and a patio and outdoor space.

The existing plant would be repurposed into a cold storage facility.

Triple "A" projects that the new operation would eventually employ more than 100.

"All of us at Triple "A" Cheese are excited by the prospect of turning this beloved, local brand into a destination that serves the community and attracts tourism to Northern Ontario," said Stefano Camaiani, the company's president and CEO, in the release.

"We must caution, however, that this is an ambitious project and there are no shortcuts. A new facility is needed and comes with significant funding requirements. There remains much work to be done."

Securing financing to purchase land and build the new facility is described as a key priority.

Gay Lea said it's supporting Triple "A" in discussions with financiers, including government agencies, to gauge their interest in investing in the new concept.

If financing efforts are successful, the companies expect the sale would close in 2025, with the new plant to open in 2027 or 2028.

Triple "A" Cheese will also explore the possibility of restarting limited interim cheese making at the existing plant, using equipment repurposed from its operations.

GRASS-FED

Since the closure, the Thornloe plant has continued

to accept local grass-fed milk. The premium product was skimmed off and shipped to a Southern Ontario plant to be churned into grass-fed butter.

The Thornloe plant will stop receiving grass-fed milk

in October. Gay Lea said producers, however, will continue receiving the grass-fed premium until March 31, 2025.

In the press release, the two companies said they will

provide updates as more is known about the sale.

But they also encouraged patience, "as funding such an ambitious project takes time, and the outcome is inherently uncertain."

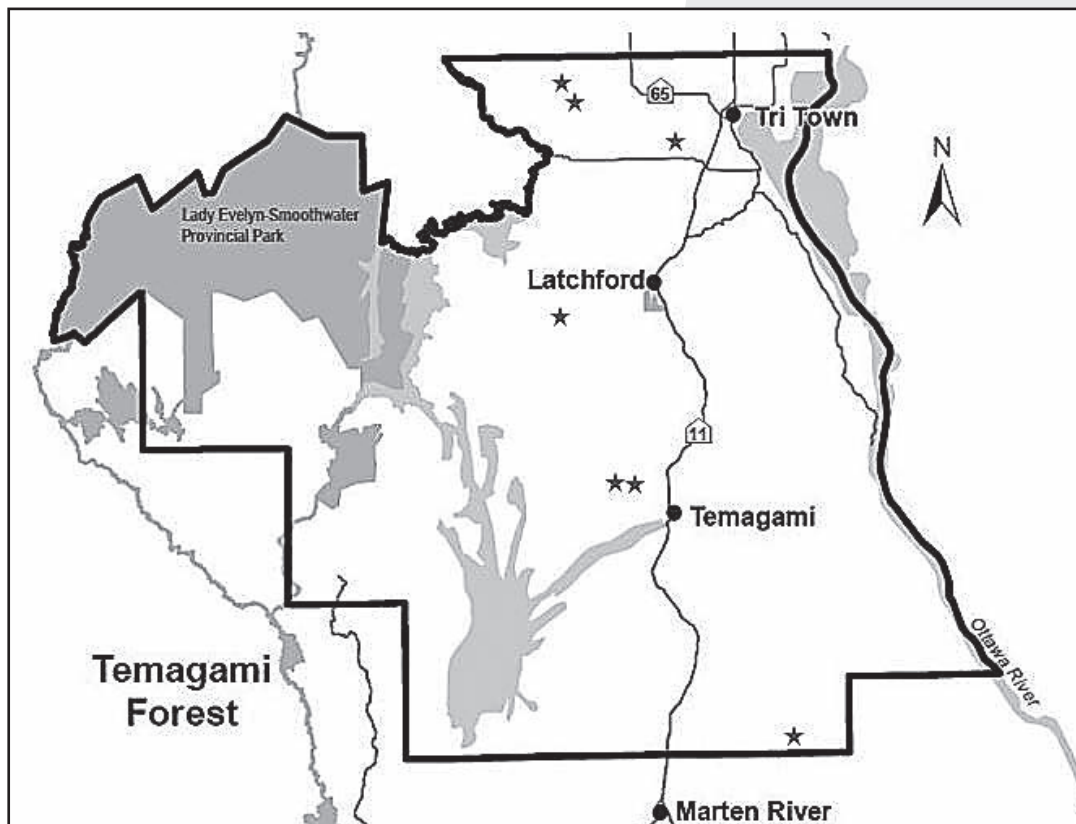

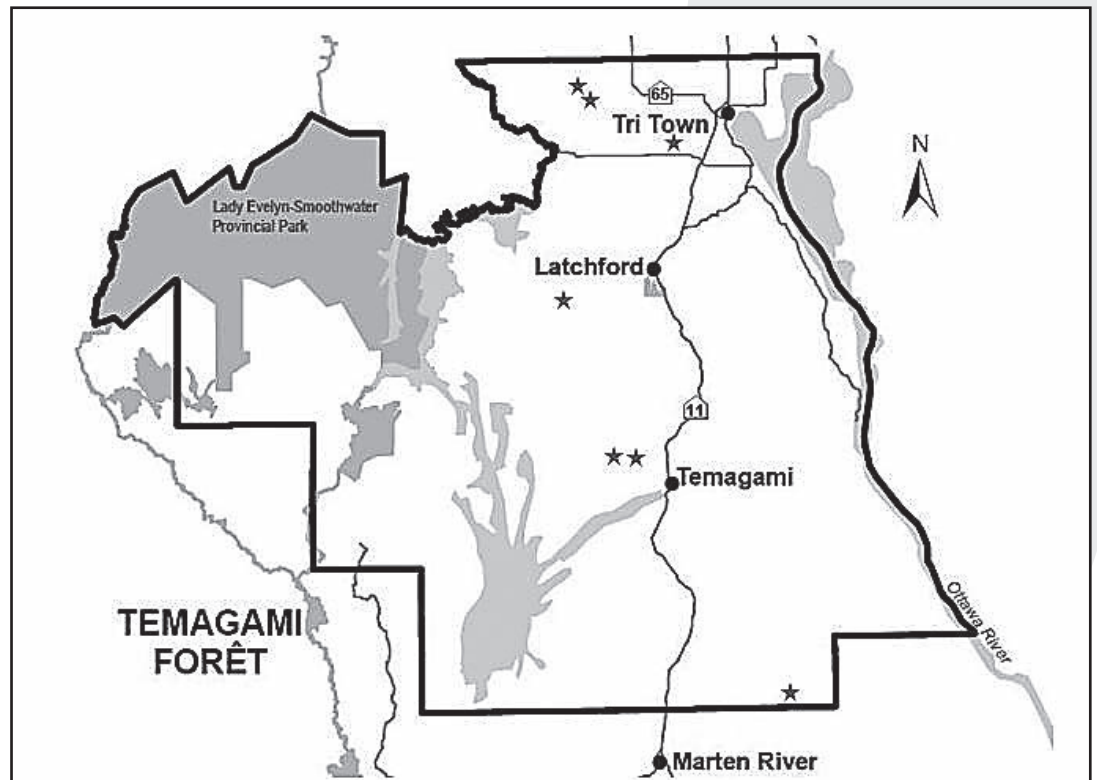
“We hope that offering enriching experiences for
