## Temagami eyeing redistribution of cameras

TEMAGAMI - Temagami's new chief administrative officer is looking for permission from council to review the placement of the CCTV cameras the municipality has in its possession.

Her objective is to make the best use of the cameras, and relocate them to places where they are most needed, she explained. The municipality has 18 cameras, three of which are broken.

CAO Laala Jahanshahloo outlined that the goal of

the project will be to effectively use what is available, and to ensure the cost is kept within the approved budget.

She was speaking at the municipality's August 8 council meeting.

exists to post signs in areas where the cameras are located.

"I don't know if that's been done in all locations and I wanted to make sure that would be added to ensure that it is covered," she said, referring to privacy regulations.

Jahanshahloo assured that she would reach out for legal advice regarding the kind of signs needed.

There are some specific locations within the municipality where visual recordings are needed, she commented.

"We need to make sure we are protected."

She noted that it is highly recommended that the municipality have CCTV security camera coverage for its drinking water

system

"It's a very, very high recommendation," she said, adding the recommendation came from a lawyer.

She said the method of accessing the video footage and sharing it would

depend on the protocol the council would put in place.

Jahanshahloo emphasized that she wants to focus on the municipality's "critical areas" for the placement of the available cameras.

Malcolm Alfred "Buddy" Marriott passed away at the Temiskaming Lodge July 13, 2024, surrounded by his family Margaret-Rose Hearn, Doreen and Bert Marshall, Brian Marriott (Rozanne) and Tony Hearn. Malcolm was 74.

Malcolm was born December 13, 1949, to Margaret (nee Jackson) and Percy Marriott.

Malcolm worked on a surveying crew for many years with Sutcliffe Surveyors. Malcolm endured many health issues such as polio at the age of eight. He had two brain surgeries at the age of 30 in 1980 and again in 2012. He also had diabetes and several bouts with cancer on his nose and eye area. Malcolm passed as a result of cancer.

Malcolm was a kind and mild-mannered person who loved to sing and play the guitar. He also liked to play bingo, crib and he enjoyed watching TV, especially wrestling. He had two devastating house fires that were life-changing events for him in 1995 and in 2011.

Malcolm was predeceased by his father in 2001 and his mother in 2006, his brother Delbert Marriott in 1991 and his sister Helena McCaig in 2018 and brother-in-law Wilfred Hearn.

He is also survived by two other siblings, Irvin Marriott and Wanita (Kenny) Baker and brother-in-law Donald McCaig.

#### **Practise Self-Care**

Most people are fairly healthy, but as we age, we are faced with challenges, choices and risks specifically in relation to food, alcohol, tobacco and inactive lifestyles. Unfortunately, the common result of making bad choices is obesity, physical inactivity, tobacco use, alcohol abuse and unhealthy diets. All of these things contribute to today's epidemic of heart attacks and strokes, cancers, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease and other diseases.

The good news is that it's possible to reduce your risk by adjusting your lifestyle and taking better care of yourself.

#### Self-Care includes:

- Knowledge & Health Literacy the ability to get, process and understand basic health information and services needed to make the right decisions about your health.
- Mental wellbeing, self-awareness and prevention

   being more aware of the present moment, including your thoughts and feelings, your body and the world around you (also known as mindfulness), can positively change the way you feel about life and how you approach challenges; In terms of prevention, know your body mass index (BMI), cholesterol level, blood pressure and participate in health screening.
- Physical Activity –Adults aged 18-64 should try to do at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity throughout the week.
- Risk avoidance quitting tobacco, limiting alcohol use, getting immunized, practicing safe sex and using sunscreen.
- Good Hygiene hand washing, brushing your teeth and washing your food, e.g. fruits and vegetables
- Rational and responsible use of products and services (diagnostic testing and medication) – being aware of dangers and using as prescribed.

Is self-care hard to do? Absolutely – some elements definitely are, such as quitting smoking. Small steps in a positive direction are the best way to achieve long-lasting results.

The Town of Jasper, Alberta, has been devastated by fires with half the town burned to the ground.

If we think about our communities and how to protect them from forest fires perhaps a proactive approach is necessary.

Is a broader Temiskaming Wild Fire strategy needed?

Property and people need to be protected from wildfire damage.

This would involve the removal of dead trees and brush around towns to create a safe buffer zone.

And anywhere large brush piles are present, those could be removed as well so as not to provide fuel for a potential fire.

In our region we see evidence of the pine beetle who has been hard at work decimating pine trees, thus causing a fire hazard.

Perhaps the harvesting of these trees and their removal near homes and businesses could be included in a three- to fiveyear strategic wild fire prevention plan?


Do the citizens in your community know what to do in case of an emergency when a fire evacuation notice goes out?

### Aquatic inspiration

The 2024 Paris Olympics are now over.

What an amazing sporting experience we witnessed for two and a half weeks this summer.

The magical city of love, architecture, food and art pulled off a spectacular summer games.

There were seven marriage proposals during the games, which reflected the aura of love felt around this mega event.

After seeing our Canadian swimmers win medal after medal, I was inspired not to clean my house, but to dive into a clean, clear Northern lake and swim my heart out.

Canadian swimmer Summer McIntosh, 17, wowed us by winning four of Canada's eight swimming medals at the Olympics - three gold and a silver.

If we think the sport of swimming isn't big in Canada, think again.

And our rowers, including the women's eight team with Kristen Siermachesky ready to row at a moment's notice, won a silver medal representing Canada.

There are so many sports that involve water here in Canada, we have that aquatic presence in spades.

Rowing, kayaking, water polo, sailing, canoeing, surfing, diving and swimming.

I admire the efforts of the local Northern Loons Swim Club, who are producing the next generation of swimmers.

And when you live in a land with thousands of lakes and rivers, learning to swim should be a mandatory skill taught in childhood.

I recently watched a child of about four go underwater for the first time.

He and his mother had quite

a nice time swimming together.

When he came up after his first dive, his eyes were wide open as if he had just experienced something truly awesome.

I think we still need to experience awe, through sports, nature, books and more importantly through the eyes of a child.

As kids in Cobalt, we took swimming lessons at Bass Lake, boarding the bus every morning to stay all day at the lake with our friends.

I recall at times being fearful of swimming and going underwater when I was a kid, but after taking swimming lessons, my fear went away.

An older kid, a bully, had cannonballed me when I was

just learning to go underwater and that scared the crap out of me.

But since then I have learned to swim with confidence as an adult

Learning to swim is a critical life skill, which is the first defence against drowning.

Parents, don't force your kids to go underwater or to swim before they are ready, though.

Always hire a qualified lifeguard to teach your kids to swim or enrol them in swimming lessons.

Ontario has 250,000 lakes and at some point you are going to be near one of them.

The power of water is to be respected at all times.

#### **WISE ABOUT BEAR - Who to contact**

Not every bear sighting is an emergency situation. Here is who to call if you encounter a bear.

**Emergency situations** Call 911 or your local police if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety and exhibits threatening or aggressive behaviour, such as:

- enters a school yard when school is in session
- stalks people and lingers at the site
- enters or tries to enter a residence
- · wanders into a public gathering
- kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site

**Non-emergency encounters** Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 or TTY 705-945-7641 if a bear:

- · roams around or checks garbage cans
- breaks into a shed where garbage is stored
- is in a tree
- pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
- moves through a backyard or field but does not linger

## Gardens growing glowing health

ENGLEHART (Special) – Quiet outdoor nooks at Englehart and Kirkland Lake hospitals are a prescription for health and wellness.

Healing gardens have been built at the two Blanche River Health (BRH) sites.

They feature wooden planter boxes constructed and donated by students at Englehart High and Kirkland Lake District Composite School.

The planters provide "the finishing touches" to the new gardens, said John Sullivan, chair of the BRH Foundation, in a news release.

Sullivan said the gardens give patients and visitors at the two sites "an outdoor space to visit and enjoy nature."

The foundation, which is supported by community donations, provided \$20,000 for the project.

It notes that gardens are increasingly popular at hospitals because they've been shown to improve well-being, reduce stress and promote faster recovery.

It cites studies touting nature itself as a therapy, with benefits for the brain as well as the nervous, immune and endocrine systems.

Evidence points, it said, to positive impacts on a wide range of conditions, from depression, anxiety, and attention deficit disorder to diabetes, respiratory illnesses, migraines, obesity, and infectious, cardiovascular and musculoskeletal diseases.

The Englehart garden is located at the rear of the hospital near the in-patient units. It offers outdoor furniture and a gazebo as well as the planters.

The Kirkland Lake garden is east of the main parking lot. It features two gazebos, including a wooden structure donated by Norm Koch, as well as landscaping, outdoor furniture and the student-built planters.

## Keeping summer safe outdoors

OTTAWA (Special) – There's intended purpose. still lots of summery weather left to enjoy the backyard and the outdoors.

To do it safely, Health Canada has some tips.

When doing yard work, it is important to know how to safely use your power tools and equipment. You can avoid injury by properly maintaining and using these items.

• Read, understand, and follow the manufacturer's instructions before using a power tool. Equipment should only be used for its

- · Inspect equipment before use to make sure that it is in good working order and safety guards are in place.
- Remove rocks, sticks, toys and tools from the lawn before using power equipment.
- Before plugging in any power equipment, make sure the power switch is turned off.
- · Never operate power tools with frayed cords.
- Keep children away from the mowing area and

never allow them to operate or ride a lawnmower.

Always wear protective gear when using power tools, such as closed-toe shoes, workboots and safety glasses.

Hearing protection is also a must, because loud noise from power garden equipment can gradually cause permanent hearing loss and the inability to hear warning sounds.

Decorative, refillable outdoor torches are great to sit by on a warm summer night. Continued on page 7



## Trailer coming for firefighters' remote access vehicle

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A new off-road vehicle that can access remote locations for firefighting and other emergencies will soon have its own custom ride.

An enclosed trailer to transport the off-road unit will be purchased for just under \$26,000.

A \$20,000 donation from TC Energy's Building Strong program will cover the bulk of the cost. The balance will be raised by the Haileybury Firefighters Association.

The work by the city's volunteer firefighters in spearheading the project is "incredible," commented Councillor lan Graydon as Temiskaming Shores council approved the purchase July 9.

The city's fire department acquired a 2023 Kubota off-road vehicle last fall.

It's based at the Haileybury fire station and is prepared to respond to wildland fires, assist with search and rescue, and support paramedics if needed to access remote locations.

The four-seat off-road vehicle, which also has room to transport equipment, has a set of tracks so it can be converted for winter use.

Donations covered its \$42,000 purchase cost.





## Enjoy the outdoors - without a tick

DISTRICT (Special) - You can enjoy the warm weather and outdoor activities by preventing tick bites that can cause Lyme disease and other infections like anaplasmosis.

Before your outdoor activity, you can take the following precautions to prevent tick bites:

- · Wear light-coloured long-sleeved shirts and pants to spot ticks more
- Tuck your shirt into your pants, and under the arms

pull your socks over your pant legs;

- Use bug spray containing DEET or Icaridin on your skin and clothing (always follow the directions on the label);
- Walk on cleared paths or walkways. When you return, take time to specifically inspect these 10 areas of your body (favorite tick hiding spots):
- · head and hair
- in and around the ears

- around the chest
- back (use a mirror or ask for help)
- waist
- belly button
- around the groin
- legs and behind the knees
- · between the toes

What to look for: You may not notice a tick bite because ticks are tiny and their bites are usually painless. Feel your skin for bumps and see if there are any tiny black dots. Most people get Lyme disease after being bitten by:

- · a nymph, which is about the size of a poppy seed (1.15 millimetres)
- an adult female tick, which is about the size of a sesame seed (3mm)

Found a tick? Remove it immediately to reduce the risk of infection. To do this properly, watch the Lyme disease video: How to properly remove a tick. Don't forget to also check your pets.




