City ends chief building official agreement with Temagami

TEMISKAMING SHORES — The City of Temiskaming Shores is a busy municipality and in light of this they are ending an agreement with the Town of Temagami with regards to the services of their chief building official (CBO).

Temiskaming Shores Mayor Jeff Laferriere said in a telephone interview that the City has found itself in a position where the building inspector, Melvin Bursey, finds his time limited with city business and therefore the agreement with Temagami will end.

"We have had a nice partnership with Temagami but with the success that we are seeing in our own community we are finding it more and more of a challenge to support Temagami with that project. It is a good thing for us but an unfortunate thing for them that we cannot support another partner. We have notified them that the agreement will end on October 31 of this year."

The mayor said there is a great deal of growth happening in the city so they need to focus on the resources that the city does have. If at some point in the future they are able to expand those resources they would reach out again.

"We want to make sure we can provide the services that our community needs first," he said.

Temagami is in a unique situation with its building inspector and it relies on other municipalities who are willing to share those services.

"We are going to put out a notice of interest to find a chief building official," said Temagami municipal clerk Sabrina Pandolfo in a telephone interview earlier in the week.

"We are going to reach out to other municipalities in the coming weeks to see what's out there."

A number of municipalities in the Temiskaming region have access to a CBO through the Temiskaming Municipal Services Association, but Temagami is not one of them.

Practise Self-Care

Most people are fairly healthy, but as we age, we are faced with challenges, choices and risks specifically in relation to food, alcohol, tobacco and inactive lifestyles. Unfortunately, the common result of making bad choices is obesity, physical inactivity, tobacco use, alcohol abuse and unhealthy diets. All of these things contribute to today's epidemic of heart attacks and strokes, cancers, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease and other diseases.

The good news is that it's possible to reduce your risk by adjusting your lifestyle and taking better care of yourself.

Self-Care includes:

- Knowledge & Health Literacy – the ability to get, process and understand basic health information and services needed to make the right decisions about your health.
- Mental wellbeing, self-awareness and prevention – being more aware of the present moment, including your thoughts and feelings, your body and the world around you (also known as mindfulness), can positively change the way you feel about life and how you approach challenges; In terms of prevention, know your body mass index (BMI), cholesterol level, blood pressure and participate in health screening.
- Physical Activity – Adults aged 18-64 should try to do at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity throughout the week.
- Risk avoidance – quitting tobacco, limiting alcohol use, getting immunized, practicing safe sex and using sunscreen.
- Good Hygiene – hand washing, brushing your teeth and washing your food, e.g. fruits and vegetables
- Rational and responsible use of products and services (diagnostic testing and medication) – being aware of dangers and using as prescribed.

Is self-care hard to do? Absolutely – some elements definitely are, such as quitting smoking. Small steps in a positive direction are the best way to achieve long-lasting results.

with the number of abandoned pets left at their doorstep in need of food, medical care and love.

For some people their circumstances may have changed and they are moving, or are ill or cannot afford to feed and look after their pets.

This is totally understandable, but the responsibility of pet ownership must be taken on by pet owners.

Please spay and neuter your pets when you have them and vaccinate them.

If your pet does end up at one of the local shelters at least those costs won't be placed on the dedicated and compassionate

volunteers who keep these places open.

Our local animal shelters are dealing with a high volume of abandoned and surrendered animals due to an ongoing re-homing crisis.

Certainly inflation has made pet ownership challenging having to do with costs such as food and vet bills.

The animal rescue volunteers always try to find a solution to a pet owner's problem, provided they have the resources available to them and that is the problem - resources are in short supply.

The goal of animal rescue

places is to keep pets out of kill shelters.

Almost eight million pets land in shelters each year in Canada and 11,000 of those pets are euthanized daily, says a Pet Smart study.

Despite the challenges of compassion fatigue, the shelter volunteers continue to save countless lives to give our furry friends a helping hand and hopefully a new beginning.

Thank you to all the animal shelter volunteers in our region. We truly appreciate your dedication and hard work.

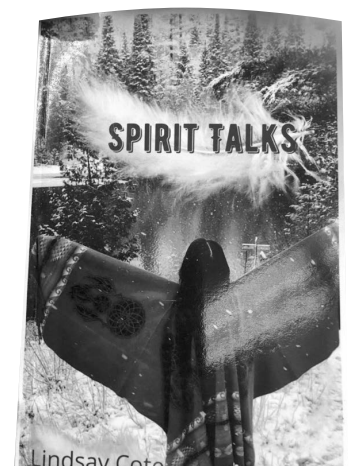
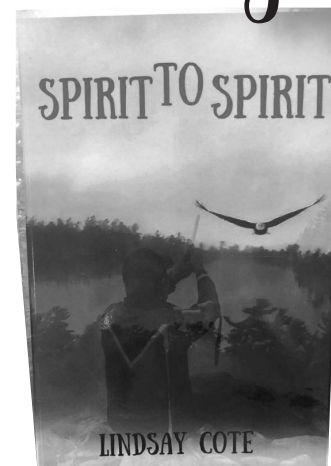

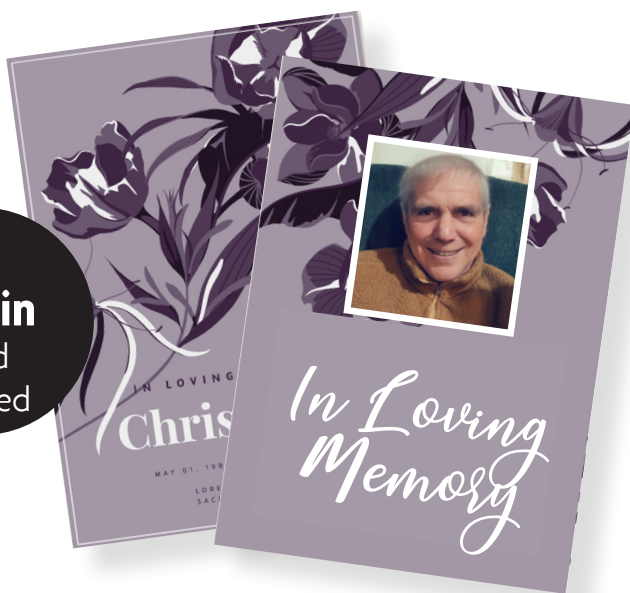

Temiskaming Foundation shows heart

ENGLEHART (Special) – A campaign to improve cardiac care services for Blanche River Health patients has reached 90 per cent of its goal, thanks to a donation from The Temiskaming Foundation.

The foundation recently donated \$36,930 to purchase a new heart monitor at the Blanche River Health (BRH) Englehart site.

The foundation wishes the campaign “every success as it nears its \$146,000 goal,” said Brigid Wilkinson, executive director of The Temiskaming Foundation, in a media release.

The BRH Foundation launched the cardiac fund campaign last year to purchase new and improved equipment at both the Englehart and Kirkland Lake sites.

“Local businesses, individuals and organizations have stepped up to support our fundraising efforts, and I’m proud to say the new equipment is on order,” said BRH Foundation chair John Sullivan.

The cardiac fund was launched to buy:

- One automatic compression machine, which provides cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) when the heart has stopped beating. The machine would be for the Kirkland Lake site, because the Englehart site already has one.

- Replacement of seven cardiac monitors used at both sites by clinicians to ensure they’re aware of any changes in heart activity.

- Two automatic emergency defibrillators (AEDs) to help restart a patient’s heart when it has suddenly stopped beating.

“Heart disease is one of the main causes of death and hospitalization in Canada, which means there are a lot of people we serve who are likely to require immediate medical intervention,” said Sullivan.

“That’s why equipping our clinicians with the tools they need to save lives has been our focus, and we are very grateful for the generosity and support we have received.”




Participants walk or ride along the STATO trail in New Liskeard, where they will have to find hidden Pokémon cut-outs.

Finding oral health-care that's right for you

(NC) - When we think of oral health-care, we tend to think of dentists.

However, the oral health field includes several other trained professionals. The new Canadian Dental Care

Plan (CDCP) helps reduce the cost of dental care from a wide range of oral health providers, including dentists, dental hygienists, denturists and dental specialists. Here's how each of these

oral health providers can be part of your oral health-care team.

DENTAL HYGIENISTS

If you regularly go to dental clinics, you probably know that the dental

hygienists on staff do much of the preventive work. They perform oral cancer screenings, assess your head, neck and jaw, clean your teeth, take your X-rays and may apply fluoride to prevent tooth decay, among other services. But you don't need to necessarily visit a dentist clinic or receive a referral to see a dental hygienist.

Independent dental hygienists can work from their own or a shared office space, or work in places like schools and long-term care facilities. Some are even mobile, visiting clients in their homes or, in some cases, even in remote parts of the country.

DENTURISTS

Denturists are oral health providers who specialize in dentures.

You do not need a referral from a dentist to see a denturist. They work with patients who are missing some or all of their teeth and can design, fabricate and repair removable dentures.

DENTAL SPECIALISTS

Dental specialists cover several different areas of specialization and can also provide oral health-care under the CDCP. These can include pediatric dentists specializing in children, and oral and maxillofacial surgeons treating facial injuries, deformities, and tumours or infections in your mouth. If you need to see any of these specialists, your oral health professional can provide a referral.

CANADIAN DENTAL CARE PLAN

Oral health is an essential part of our overall health. Yet, according to Statistics Canada, one in four Canadians avoid visiting an oral health professional due to the cost. Are you among them? If so, you should be aware of a new plan that may be available to help lower the cost of your oral health-care services.

If you're a Canadian resident who does not have access to dental insurance and you have a family income under \$90,000, you might be eligible. This federal government plan helps reduce the cost of a wide range of oral health services, such as examinations, teeth cleaning, X-rays, fillings, dentures, root canals and oral surgeries.

Removing online accessibility barriers for people with disabilities

(NC) March of Dimes Canada is integrating an online accessibility tool into its national operations that allows people with disabilities to personalize their online experiences according to their accessibility needs.

The TD Accessibility Adapter is a browser plug-in designed to co-exist with other assistive technologies and helps address accessibility barriers by enabling users with disabilities such as dyslexia, epilepsy and ADHD to make the websites they visit more user-friendly.

"Our vision is to create an inclusive, barrier-free society for people with disabilities. But, as technology moves at an increasingly rapid pace, we're seeing more and more barriers like cost and accessibility concerns appear," says the March of Dimes Canada's Lesley Smith.

"The TD Accessibility Adapter helps address some of those barriers, which is why we're so excited to leverage the tool with our network – including our employees – to help level the playing field."

Only three per cent of the internet is currently accessible for people with disabilities, according to WebAIM. And at a time when everyday experiences continue to shift online, people with disabilities are three times more likely than those without to never use the internet, according to a 2021 Pew Research Center survey.

For users with dyslexia, the tool can swap out all the text online and replace it with text that is more spaced out and easily identifiable.

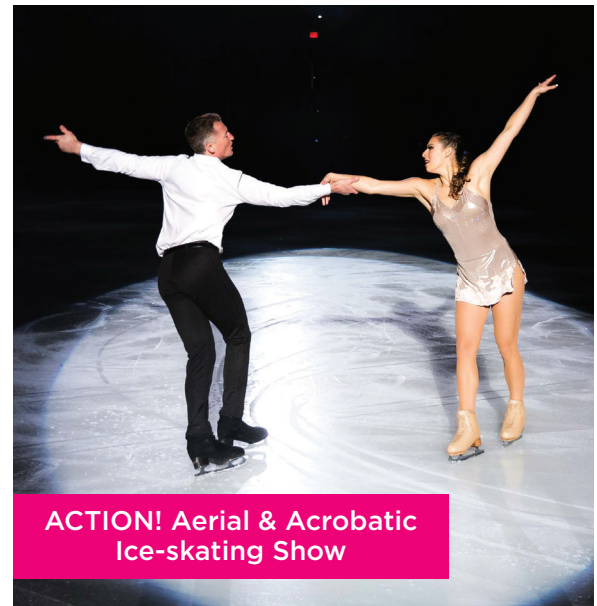
