

Overdose Awareness

An overdose means having more of a drug (or combination of drugs) than your body can handle. All drugs can cause an overdose, including prescription medication. It's important to know the right amount and the right time to take your medication. It's also extremely important to know what drugs should not be mixed, and to get help if you feel you are not in control of your drug use.

Depressants and Opioids

A depressant is a drug that slows the vital activities of the body including breathing and heart rate. Depressants may also be known as sedatives. Opioids (such as heroin and pharmaceutical opioids like hydrocodone), medications like Xanax or Valium and alcohol all slow the central nervous system to produce a calming effect. When taken in large amounts or in combination with other medications and/or alcohol, these medications can weaken normal functions like breathing and lower heart rate until breathing and heart rate eventually stop, resulting in death.

Alcohol

Usually people don't think of alcohol when they think of an overdose, but alcohol is a depressant and it is possible to overdose on it. Acute alcohol poisoning, usually a result of binge drinking, is an example.

If you drink a large amount of alcohol quickly, the level of alcohol in your bloodstream can become dangerously high. Alcohol poisoning could stop you from breathing, stop your heart or cause you to choke on your own vomit.

Stimulants

It is possible to overdose on amphetamines. Adderall and Dexedrine are both examples of prescription stimulants. Amphetamine overdose increases the risk of heart attack, stroke, seizure or drug-induced psychotic episodes.

When to Call an Ambulance

Seeking emergency help isn't just for when someone is unconscious. You should also seek help when someone is:

- Having a seizure
- Experiencing severe headache
- Experiencing chest pain
- Having a hard time breathing
- Extremely paranoid, agitated and/or confused

It is not necessary for someone to have all of these signs or symptoms for them to be overdosing. Showing signs of one or more could still mean they are in trouble and need emergency help.

> Always call an ambulance if you suspect someone has overdosed!!

It seems like the town

museum open at a cost of over \$200,000 per year and the building is aging and in need of repairs.

But a committee of local residents has stepped forward, willing to keep lobbying the Ontario Heritage Trust entity to keep the museum viable.

In Cobalt, the Cobalt and Northern Ontario Fire Museum building was torn down a few weeks ago as it was in need of repairs and the town was not in the position to afford those repairs.

It was the former home of the Cobalt Coleman Latchford and Area Food Bank.

In Englehart, the town's museum, located at 67 Sixth Avenue, could close soon in favour of a new plan to bring history out into the community.

Having a building of that size with provincial accessibility requirements looming for 2025 is challenging the municipality to rethink the viability of the struc-

Citizens in both those communities were outraged that the history of their towns was going to be lost in the shuffle.

The preservation of the North's history is nothing to sneeze at. As communities find themselves in financial trouble and resources are in short supply, museums are likely the first things a council will look at when trimming municipal budgets.

But in reality, they should be the last because what happens when our history has been lost to the wrecking ball?

Let us remember, local museums hold the memory of our towns, preserving the personal history of its residents.



A few years ago I was literally living hand to mouth working five jobs to support my daughter and myself.


Here's to all the friends who helped me along the way, who had my back when I didn't even have it and who fed me big servings of kindness.



Tips to power up for winter

DISTRICT (Special) – It may be tough to accept, but winter is coming.

Now's the time to prep spring and summer outdoor power equipment like lawn mowers, leaf blowers and trimmers away for storage, and to ready snowblowers and generators for the coming season.

How and when you prepare your equipment for seasonal changes can save you time and money later, says the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI).

"Readying your equipment for winter needs is important as the weather changes," said OPEI president and CEO Kris Kiser in a news release.

"It's also important to put your fall equipment away correctly. What you do now when you put away your equipment sets you up for an easier start in the spring."

The OPEI offers the following tips:

Review owner's manuals.

Re-familiarize yourself with how to handle equipment safely. Lost manuals can be found online. Save a copy on your computer if possible, so it can be consulted when needed.

Be familiar with your equipment, and all its features, including how to turn it off quickly and safely.

• Service all equipment.

Before storing spring and summer equipment, clean and service it or take it to a small engine repair shop. Change engine oil and safely dispose of the old oil. Service the air filter, and do other maintenance as directed by the owner's manual.

Check winter equipment and see if any maintenance and repairs are required.

• Handle fuel properly.

Unused fuel left in gas tanks over the winter can go stale and even damage equipment.



Before storing equipment, add fuel stabilizer to the gas tank, then run the equipment to distribute it. Turn the engine off, allow the machine to cool, then restart and run until the gas tank is empty.

the recommended type of fuel no more than 30 days before use. Use fuel with no more than 10 per cent ethanol in outdoor power equipment.

Charge batteries.

Remove and fully charge batteries before storing. Don't store batteries on metal shelves or allow them to touch metal objects. Store

them on a plastic or wood shelf in a climate-controlled structure.

· Shelter equipment from winter weather.

Store spring and summer equipment in a clean, dry place such as a garage, barn or shed. Winter equipment

should be kept away from the elements, but be easily available for use.

• Prepare, prepare, prepare. Make space in the garage or basement before the weather changes so there is room to store larger yard items.

Appeal Rights under the Planning Act

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Minister in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Minister at the above address. Appeal of a decision of the Minister in respect of this consent, and/or any condition imposed by the Minister, may be made by a specified person or any public body not later than 20 days after notice of the decision is given. If a person or public body has the ability to appeal the decision of the Minister in respect of the proposed consent to the Ontario Land Tribunal but does not make written submissions to the Minister before the Minister gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

Additional Appeal Rights under the Environmental Bill of Rights






