



History and nature meet at Marten River Provincial Park.

The park offers up a glimpse into the logging history of the region, as well as examples of old-growth pine that still stand.

Trails and beaches, along with extensive boating opportunities for exploring the region, make Marten River a great destination.

Fishing, hunting, nature photography, ATVing, or just relaxing in the sun are all available to visitors.

The winter fun continues with access to area snowmobile trails.

The opportunities are extensive as the trails, lakes and rivers of the region can be reached from the beginning point of Marten River.






An abundance of beauty

For a camping experience that merges the natural beauty of Temagami with the accessibility of stores and other amenities, Finlayson Point Provincial Park sits just south of the village of Temagami. Lake Temagami bounds the park and towering pine trees add the Temagami spirit to the experience.

The park contains a plaque which is a tribute to famed conservationist and author Grey Owl who made a life in the Temagami forest living and adopting the identity of an Indigenous man. Local galleries feature the works of Indigenous and non-Indigenous artists. The Temagami Train Station, the White Pine Art Gallery, and the Welcome Centre are locations where the works of local artists can be viewed.

The Bunny Miller Theatre is often the venue for performances and, through the course of the year, there are regular festivals, carnivals, and markets featuring the many talents of the people who live in Temagami and call it home.



Temagami





Towering trees and ancient trails


The expansive and varied landscape of Temagami can be appreciated by hiking to a lookout platform on the west side of Caribou Mountain.

Camping, fishing and also snowmobiling are part of the many outdoor experiences that attract people to this region to enjoy the forests that surround the beautiful lakes of Temagami, Cassels, Net, Rabbit and their tributaries and smaller adjoining lakes.

The White Bear Forest boasts a network of trails that make excellent outings for day trip walks and picnics. Temagami Island also offers three different trails through old-growth forest, as well as a welcoming dock for tying up a boat on the northeast side of the island. There are also camping spots available on Temagami Island.

The Caribou Mountain also offers a system of trails that reach Cassels and Snake Lakes.

At the top of Caribou Mountain a fire tower provides an opportunity for visitors to take in the view of the nearby town and the surrounding forest and lakes as far away as 40 kilometres.







History and recreation

The Latchford waterfront features a good swimming area and playground. Venturing onto the lake provides good fishing opportunities or the pleasure of wide open spaces for boating or canoeing up Bay Lake to the Montreal River and from there launch into the Lady Evelyn Smoothwater Provincial Park.

Latchford has had an active role in the logging industry of the region, and at one time was home to so many sawmills that it became known as Sawdust City.







Something for every season

Coleman Township features a large portion of the internationally famed Cobalt Mining Camp, and is closely linked with the Town of Cobalt in its history.
Silver from this region changed the world in the early 1900s.

The geology of the region is still debated, but major veins of silver have been discovered throughout the complex rock structure. At one time an ancient sea covered the region, and glaciers crossed the land. These and other geological events can be recognized at many of the 20 sites on the Heritage Silver Trail.

A brochure providing a written guide of the trail can be obtained at the Cobalt Mining Museum in Cobalt.

During the winter months, the Temiskaming Nordic Ski Club Chalet is open for the comfort of visitors. Along with memberships, day passes and ski rentals are available.

The summer months also offer visitors an opportunity to enjoy the beautiful Bass Lake Park. The municipally owned and operated park offers visitors a chance to swim in a clear spring-fed lake and lie in the sunshine on the well tended

The park offers a playground and other entertainment to while away a summer day, week or month, with available rental units, trailer lots and campground.







The site, located in Temiskaming Shores, is accessible from two locations. One trail can be accessed from Bucke Park, and the other, shorter trail can be accessed off Silver Centre Road. There is a sign indicating the opening of the trail.

Along with the view, the site is a place of legends. One, included in the area's Indigenous stories gathered by anthropologist Frank Speck in the late 1800s and early 1900s, is that the area was once inhabited by small primate-type creatures who frequently stole items and food from the Indigenous people who entered the area. However, most awe-inspiring is a massive face of rock gazing out sternly for all time from the side of the granite cliff.

Waterfront attracts visitors

Visitors will travel across the region in the summer to get to Haileybury's waterfront.

The unique enclosed and cleaned swimming area on the shore of Lake Temiskaming offers an opportunity for people of all ages to enjoy swimming in a slightly warmer and cleaner area of lake water, while also being sheltered from the sometimes wind-swept open areas of the lake.

The beach area also includes a waterslide, a large fountain out in the enclosed swim area and dock, and a sand beach where children are often seen building sandcastles and parents are basking in the sun. There is also a smaller fountain area nearby where children can play and just a short distance beyond that there is a playground.

The waterfront is situated beside a well-used marina and the area is frequented by sailboats and motorboats through the non-winter months.

As with other parts of the waterfront through Temiskaming Shores, Haileybury's shore can be enjoyed by walkers and bikers who wish to use the STATO trail. A short distance to the south of the marina is the Waterfront Pavilion where many activities are regularly held throughout the summer months, along with the Temiskaming Art Gallery's weekly Art in the Park.

A nearby playground makes this an ideal spot for family gatherings.

The history of the place is always present, and the story of Haileybury, which rose from the ashes of the Great Fire of 1922, is commemorated through a nearby statue by sculptor Ernie Fauvelle.

Further to the south the beautiful Temiskaming Shores city hall is located and is home to the Temiskaming Art Gallery which is open throughout the week and features exceptional artworks by outstanding local artists and others from across Ontario and Canada.

The waterfront, which attracted founder C.C. Farr to these shores in the late 1800s, remains active throughout the year and annually welcomes area ice fishers to set up a small village of ice huts, adding to the overall picturesque quality of the historic town.





The view wins at Haileybury Golf Club
















Haileybury Heritage Museum filled with stories

The Haileybury Heritage Museum, located off Main Street in Haileybury, west of the overpass, tells the colourful story of Haileybury.

Beginning with the First Nations people who used the area as a portage point, the location was seen by Hudson Bay agent Charles Cobbold Farr as a potential site for a town.

He purchased land and named it Haileybury in honour of his hometown school in England. Farr dedicated himself to promoting the town, particularly to his fellow Englishmen.

Through strong efforts of Haileybury representatives, the town was named as the district town, and came to house the Haileybury Court House and the jail.

The town benefitted from the wealth generated by the neighbouring town of Cobalt during the silver boom of the early 20th century.


It served as an inspiration for famed ghostwriter Leslie McFarlane who grew up in Haileybury and, under the name of Franklin W. Dixon, wrote many of the world-renowned Hardy Boys stories and more.

In 1922 a fire swept through the entire region and destroyed three-quarters of the town of Haileybury. But the town rebuilt.

This grand, rambling story is housed in the Haileybury Heritage Museum.

An adjoining miniature golf facility is also an enjoyable activity for families and friends.

There are two playground sites along the beach for children to enjoy a variety of climbing apparatus, swings and slides. During the summer days the waterfront is teeming with people enjoying a dip along the sandy beach. The northeasterly end of the park is the site of the annual New Liskeard Fall Fair, and in late November the Village Noel Christmas village with a New France theme lights up the night. The waterfront is also the scene of fireworks displays set off July 1 and at New Year's. Throughout the non-winter months there is often a horse show taking place at the northeast end of the waterfront, and every Saturday through the spring, summer and fall there is a farmers' market at Riverside Place. Further to the south along the beach is the New Liskeard marina which is a busy site year-round as it provides a ramp for boats in the summer and ice-huts in the winter. Throughout the year, the New Liskeard waterfront is a major attraction for visitors and residents alike.



The story of the settlers

The Little Claybelt Homesteaders Museum tells the story of Temiskaming's settlement. From the time of early settlers William Murray and Irvin Heard in the late 1800s, the men and women who followed took up tools to break the land and establish homes and towns. In the earliest days, before the arrival of trains and cars, settlers arrived by boat at the mouth of the Wabi River bringing with them as much as they could of what they needed to build homes and businesses here. Their early mode of transportation was by horse, by foot, by snowshoe, ski and boat. Through the years of hard work, ingenuity and cooperation, they built up the area into a major farming district. Their artifacts and stories are now carefully preserved through the Little Claybelt Homesteaders

The building itself is a replica of the Shepherdson Basket and Pump Works that operated in New Liskeard from the 1930s to the 1950s.

The museum sits near Highway 11 and is backed by the famed Ms. Claybelt, a fibreglass, larger-than-life Holstein that sits on the side of the highway to beckon people in to explore

Visitors dropping by the Little Claybelt Homesteaders Museum can learn about the hardware stores that literally built the communities. The museum located in the shadow of the giant Holstein features the stories of local hardware stores and samples of their goods. 




The Great Pumpkin rises in Hudson


Ride through a bison herd

Locally grown bison meat can be found at outlets across the region including on the farm of Bison du Nord in Armstrong Township.



Tracking history

Train enthusiasts will enjoy a drive into the heart of Englehart where the 701 steam locomotive sits proudly by the Ontario Northland station.

The last Ontario Northland steam locomotive made its final run in July 1957 due to the introduction of diesel fuel. The locomotive, now a reminder of an earlier era of rail transportation, was donated by Ontario Northland to the town, and a concerted effort by Englehart and area residents and by train enthusiasts across the country culminated in a major refurbishing project, along with the construction of a shelter to preserve it from the weather.

The locomotive sits by the town's Centennial Park.

The town was established as a train centre during the opening of the region at the turn of the 20th century. Since that time the community has grown as a centre for the surrounding rural communities.

Its Englehart and Area Community Arena Complex includes a rink, fitness room and indoor walking track.







Hatching up something interesting

The Hill's Lake Fish Culture Station provides a deeper look at the lives of fish, and the process of stocking area lakes with healthy fish populations.

The facility, which is one of the largest hatcheries in Ontario, manages fish from the egg stage through to adulthood when they can be introduced into area water bodies. Area lakes may be restocked with fish including trout and pickerel. Located off Highway 560 on Hill's Lake Road south of Charlton, the facility offers public tours. Call two weeks ahead to book a time and to be sure the fish hatchery will be open to the public at your preferred

time.

Plunge into nature and science with an exploration along three planned trails through terrain which contains 29 lakes created when glaciers passed about 10,000 years ago.




Bring a canoe or kayak and set out to explore the waterways, perhaps accompanied by a lone loon, or encounter a busy beaver, or browsing moose.

Mount Cheminis and glacial erratics

Mount Cheminis, located at the border between Ontario and Quebec, near the small community of Kearns, is a visual highpoint on the region's landscape, both from land and air.

The rounded mountain, created during the advance of glaciers over the land, is said to have spiritual significance to the Indigenous people of the area.

Glacial erratics can be found on the northeast shore of Larder Lake.

Evidence of the passage of glaciers abound in the area.

There are also numerous sites used by Indigenous peoples of the area for several thousand years.

Learn about hydroelectric power




Connecting through the arts





