## **City names** liaison team to work with Rockin' organizers

TEMISKAMING SHORES - A city staffer and Temiskaming Shores Councillor Danny Whalen will serve as liaison with Rockin' on Canada Day organizers as planning for the 2025 event continues.

Temiskaming Shores council approved the appointments at its committee-of-the-whole meeting earlier this week.

The November 5 resolution states the city liaison team will work with organizers "to ensure open communication between parties."

Whalen noted that the city has the benefit of Mayor Jeff Laferriere being an ex officio member of any city committee by virtue of his position as mayor.

The original draft resolution proposed that the city manager be appointed to the city liaison team. Recreation director Matt Bahm has been acting in that capacity until the new city manager, Sandra Lee, begins work November 18.

Because Lee will be unfamiliar with discussions to date, council amended the resolution to appoint the city manager "or designate" to the city team.

The 2025 event will be the second consecutive year for revived Canada Day weekend festivities in New Liskeard.

Here are some of the stories in our November 6 edition...

- An 18-year-old male was charged with attempted murder after a 16-year-old female suffered life-threatening injuries in Cobalt November 3. The 18-year-old was also charged with aggravated assault, possession of weapon for a dangerous purpose, and breach of a conditional sentence order.
- The Teme-Augama Anishnabai (TAA) says it needs more time to study the municipality of Temagami's draft official plan. It's "just looking for some level of consultation," said TAA Second Chief John Turner.
- · A pilot project looking into the collection and repurposing of agricultural plastics in Northern Ontario has received funding to continue for three years.
- The Family Fun Day hosted by Breault Family Farm in September collected \$6,900 as well as 18 crates of food for food banks serving the New Liskeard, Haileybury, and Cobalt, Coleman and Latchford areas.
- · Coleman Township is seeking a few more households to try counter-top units that transform food waste into soil additives.
- Six students from the Kirkland Lake, Englehart and Earlton areas have begun first-year studies at Northern Ontario School of Medicine University.
- Englehart High Spartans senior girls basketball team won the South North Eastern Ontario Athletic Association championships, and will host the regionals November 12.

The first Rockin' on Canada Day event was held on the July 1 weekend, staged by the Liskeard. Bikers Reunion committee.

It was held on the grounds of the former agricultural college. City council's refusal to permit camping on property on the other side of Armstrong Street, citing safety and liability concerns, left organizers disappointed and proved controversial.

Next year's event, howev-

er, will be held in a different location. Activities are slated to return to downtown New

Early in October, city council agreed in principle to the event's use of the Don Shepherdson Memorial Arena and parking lot, the fall fairgrounds, and some land for RV parking.

Council also agreed in principle to the loan of a small stage and fencing and approved a parade.

At the same time, it directed staff to prepare a strategic alliance agreement between the city and event organizers. The municipality had a similar agreement with the former Bikers Reunion.

In a report to council earlier this week, Bahm said the city liaison team would be responsible for negotiating details of the strategic alliance agreement with event organizers.

#### **Tips to Avoid Seasonal Depression**

Many people feel a little sad when summer comes to an end and a long season of cold weather is approaching. Seasonal depression or seasonal affective disorder (otherwise known as SAD) is a type of depression that happens at certain times of the year, usually in the fall and winter.

The symptoms of SAD:

- · Depressed mood
- Negative thoughts
- Fatigue
- Hypersomnia (Sleeping too much)
- Increased intake of carbohydrates/weight gain
- Social withdrawal/hibernating

There are a few things you can do to prevent SAD from getting worse and make yourself feel better.

#### **Get Plenty of Exercise**

Exercise not only helps to improve your physical health and reduce your risks for a number of chronic diseases, but it's been shown to be a great mood booster.

#### **Try Light Therapy**

This has been tested as an effective treatment for SAD because it tricks the body into thinking the days are longer and brighter than they really are. It involves sitting under a special bright light for a certain amount of time each day. You could ask your health care provider about this or just try to get as much sunlight as you can outdoors every day (20 to 30 minutes a day as a minimum) and keep your curtains and blinds open to let the light in.

#### Socialize

A common treatment for depression is to engage in social activities and spend time with friends or family. If you tend to make excuses for not going out in the fall and winter, you need to get yourself out of that habit. Keeping to yourself will only make you feel lonely and that's what you're trying to avoid so pick up the phone and call a friend or family member – make plans to go out for lunch and/or for a nice walk.

If you think you're experiencing SAD and it's affecting your ability to get through your day, focus on work and maintain relationships, you should follow up with your primary care provider. If you're a patient of the Temagami Family Health Team and would like to schedule some time for light therapy, please call the office at (705) 569-3244 to make arrangements to use our SAD light.

## Prevention is the key

November has the dubious distinction of being Woman Abuse Prevention Month in Canada.

We began the month with

a horrible incident in Cobalt where a young woman was badly injured last weekend.

Our prayers are with the young woman and her family at this time.

Violence and abuse of mostly women and girls can happen anywhere and at anytime.

The most prevalent call to police in the Temiskaming region from month to month remains domestic violence-related where women are abused, beaten, choked, held captive, stalked, raped, murdered and manipulated, most often by someone they

About one in four women will be abused by someone they know, says the Canadian Mental Health Association.

Every six days in Canada a woman is murdered by her intimate partner, according to a Statistics Canada Centre for Justice report.

That same report says women are four times more

likely to fear their partners compared to men in intimate relationships.

And if you are a woman who identifies with a minority such as being Indigenous or LGBTQ+ or handicapped you face elevated levels of violence.

Most often violence against women fails to include prevention strategies but rather large amounts of money are being doled out to deal with post-violence issues.

There certainly is a need for greater investment and action to end this violence in our communities.

But thank goodness we have programs to assist vic-

The narrative should always be about prevention of the shameful violence that is affecting grandmothers, mothers, daughters, sisters,

aunts, nieces, friends and coworkers.

In this region, this province and this country, we have to start addressing the root causes of violence, the misogyny against women and girls.

And couple that with real consequences such as jail time for the perpetrators instead of house arrest and probation.

Otherwise, women are going to continue being numbers on some Statistics Canada report or other domestic violence reports.

Let's support, educate, and advocate for change to ensure a safer future for all women.

## The lay of the land

I try to keep myself connected to nature, despite the fact that it is November and we have less daylight.

I am not an expert by any means on the natural world that I find so incredibly fascinating.

I see American robins and cedar waxwings foraging for winterberry, wild grapes and other fruit-bearing trees and shrubs in our area.

The sound of woodpeckers tapping on trees floats through the forest as they uncover insects harbouring from the approach of cold weather.

I watched my favourite little marsh changing from bright green to yellow to an earthen brown.

The snakes, beavers, otters, American bitterns, yellow warblers, red winged blackbirds and grackles have all migrated away from that tiny oasis of life.

I love sitting silently nearby watching the colourful grackles feeding their young mouthfuls of insects.

The skunks are busy making deep holes in the ground foraging for grubs and earthworms.

We will have a full moon on the 14th of November and then the Leonids, one of the most active meteor showers, begins around the 17th.

The Leonids are known for fireballs, explosions of colour that streak close to the horizon and have long tails of white light.

I am seeing the arrival of purple finches which some describe as "fire in the forest"

because of their bright red colouring.

Beavers are busy building up their feedlots in front of their lodges for the long winter ahead.

A family of majestic trumpeter swans landed on the small pond at the north end of Cobalt last week.

I watched the three of them, the parents and the grey-coloured baby cygnet turning upside down in the pond with their rear ends up in the air feeding on aquatic life.

Snowy owls may be arriving in this region any day now and will stay until April.

I hope I get to photograph

The soft-eyed snow buntings may have also arrived from the high Arctic as they search for seeds on grasses and in trees.

the feeders stocking up for the long winter ahead.

the opportunity to see tracks of squirrels, rabbits, foxes and even deer and moose.

The lakes are nearing freeze up and when the winds of November die down, the lake is glasslike and dark.

Earlier there were two juvenile loons on my favourite lake. I hope a strong north wind helps them fly away on their journey south.

November brings a silence and a calm to the forest that one can see, hear and feel as everything is preparing for the big sleep.

That beautiful silence allows for much reflection and thoughtfulness.

The Township of Coleman is seeking interest in a "Food Waste Recycling Program" that reduces food waste to nutrient rich soil that can be added to plants or gardens. The goal is to reduce the amount of food waste that is deposited in the landfill.

You can sign up for a FoodCycler unit by contacting the Township Office. There are two sizes available; a 2.5 litre model for \$150 and a 5 litre model for \$300 plus applicable taxes.

Participants will be asked to track their weekly usage for a period of 12 weeks. At the end of the pilot program there will be a survey to assist the Township with the collection of waste management data.




