Crohn's and Colitis Awareness (Irritable Bowel Disease)

Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis are diseases that inflame the lining of the gastrointestinal tract and disrupt your body's ability to digest food, absorb nutrition and eliminate waste in a healthy way. In 2021, more than 300,000 Canadians were believed to be living with IBD. By 2030, this figure is expected to reach 403,000 (or 1 in 100 people).

The causes of irritable bowel disease (IBD) are very complex. They are believed to be due to a **genetic tendency** (predisposition) and an environmental trigger that combine to cause intestinal inflammation.

What are the symptoms?

- Abdominal pain and cramping
- Diarrhea (severe and bloody stools with colitis)
- · Rectal bleeding (common with colitis)
- Nausea and vomiting
- · Diminished appetite and weight loss
- · Gas or flatulence
- Bloating
- Fever
- Anemia
- Fatigue

Fast Facts:

- Canada has among the highest rates in the world.
- · Crohn's and colitis can be diagnosed at any age, but people are more often diagnosed before the age of 30.
- The number of new cases of Crohn's disease in Canadian children has almost doubled since 1995.

Political will is needed

ing with an out of control opioid epidemic where there is rarely a community not af-

Northern Ontario is deal- fected by addiction issues, homelessness and crime from drug addiction.

According to a report on

CBC, Northern Ontario had five communities that experienced the highest rates of opioid-related deaths compared to the rest of the province, the highest rates of opioid usage in the province and likely the least amount of services available to treat this problem.

The Canadian Mental Health Association says 2.5 million people say they can't get the care they need.

Fifty seven per cent of people between 18 and 24 years old say they can't get the services they need or afford them.

The reality is that too many northerners are not getting the support they need in the form of mental health and addiction counselling.

However, in rural and re-

mote places in Alberta and British Columbia, there are virtual models of online counselling and addiction treatment available.

This online tool is available no matter where people live, so they can access treatment options.

The program connects people struggling with addiction and mental health issues with trained specialists.

This virtual form of treatment is perfect for rural places such as Northern Ontario, where wait lists are long for mental health and addiction treatment programs.

These online programs delivered by professionals support patients with depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder and more.

The Ford government should adopt this virtual service for northerners and perhaps lives will be saved.

No one, no matter where they live in Ontario, should have to fight for life saving treatment options.

Recovery from addiction is possible and putting the tools into the hands of those suffering so they can get their lives back on track is a matter of political will.

Connecting people with online virtual health care services is a no brainer.

Where the government comes in is covering the costs of the programs and investing in access to highspeed internet for rural and remote communities outside of the GTA.



It was nothing to sneeze at being out on a lake of that immensity in the middle of a major summer storm in canoes.

All of a sudden the hail stopped, the wind died down and the sun broke through the clouds as if divine magic had been sent from above.

We sat there and stared at the sky because this change happened so fast.

One minute we feared for our lives and the next we were in awe of the beautiful changing sky.

When we got to our campsite we happily stepped out of our canoes onto solid ground.

All around us we saw dozens of blueberry bushes loaded with ripe fruit.

We reached down and scooped up handfuls of the berries stuffing them into our mouths and laughing like kids.

It was much needed nourishment for our weary bodies as well as our souls.

You would think we had discovered gold - well maybe blue gold.

You rarely go into the backcountry in a canoe and not come away with a life lesson or two. In this world of information overload, it is easy to become overwhelmed with negativity. From that trip my life lesson was that nothing is permanent and things can change in an instant. Keep on paddling and you quickly realize you had a brush with wonder and amazement.

Before you know it you are standing at the door to the temple where nature's God shakes us and says "look, listen, smell, taste and touch this sacred world" and you know you are blessed and ever so grateful.





Staying safe at home during the holidays

OTTAWA (Special/Staff) – Candles and fireplaces can create that holiday ambience.

But they also increase the risk of fire, and dry trees, decorations and flammable materials mean that even a small open flame can quickly escalate into a dangerous fire.

The Canada Safety Council is encouraging the public to be mindful of the hazards and ensure they enjoy a safe and joyous holiday season.

Open flame and cooking equipment are the two leading causes of residential fires, according to Statistics Canada data cited by the

Home fires accounted for three-quarters of the 202 firerelated deaths in Canada in

"A little caution goes a long way," said Gareth Jones, the council's president and CEO, in a news release.

"Taking the time to secure open flames and adopt safe practices can prevent tragedy and allow families to enjoy a safe holiday season."

The council offers the following tips to safeguard homes from fire:

 Keep candles in nonflammable holders

from combustible away items including curtains and holiday decor. Extinguish them when leaving the room or before bed.

Consider using batteryoperated candles instead of traditional ones to reduce the risk while retaining that warm glow.

• Use a fireplace screen to contain sparks, and never leave a fire unattended. Ensure the fire is fully out before going to bed.

It's also a good idea to arrange for annual chimney cleaning if using a woodburning fireplace, as creosote build-up is a common cause such as the kitchen or of chimney fires.


 A dry Christmas tree can ignite in seconds. Water it daily or consider an artificial tree if you're unable to keep it hydrated.

Place it away from heat sources like fireplaces and space heaters.

- Check holiday lighting for frayed wires or broken bulbs. Avoid overloading outlets, which can lead to electrical fires, and ensure outdoor lights are weatherproof and rated for outdoor use.
- Have a fire extinguisher near areas with open flames,

fireplace. Familiarize yourself with its use and check it regularly.

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms monthly. Replace batteries as needed and ensure that an alarm is installed on every floor and outside each sleeping area.
- · Supervise kids and pets, because they're drawn to the allure of open flames. Establish a "kid-free zone" around fireplaces, stoves and candles to prevent accidental contact.
