MADD kicks off 37th annual Red Ribbon campaign

TEMISKAMING SHORES — Mother's Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Temiskaming kicked off the 37th annual Red Ribbon Campaign against impaired driving on November 21 at the Temiskaming Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police.

The campaign runs from November 21 to January 6 because the risk of impaired driving is high due to the number of social events during the holiday season.

As part of the Red Ribbon campaign, MADD Temiskaming is asking members of the public to show their commitment to sober driving by displaying a red ribbon on their car, vehicles, key

chains, purses, or backpacks.

The ribbons are available from Red Ribbon boxes placed around the community.

A large number of police officers, paramedics and MADD board members were on hand for the launch along with local dignitaries.

According to OPP Community Services Officer Martin Thibault, one in three roadway fatalities involves impaired driving, one in five drivers tested positive for drugs, alcohol or both and the percentage of drivers killed while under the influence of cannabis more than doubled between 2012 and 2020 in Ontario.

The police will be conducting RIDE programs to help reduce impaired driving in the region.


"RIDE programs remain an important part of road safety as they are visible reminders of motorists to not drive impaired," said Thibault in an email interview.

"All young drivers, novice drivers, and commercial drivers are required by law to have zero presence of alcohol

and or drugs in their system instead of driving home while driving. Road safety is a collective responsibility."

The Red Ribbon campaign urges residents to make responsible choices such as having another driver who is not impaired, using a taxi, using public transit or planning to spend the night

instead of driving home while impaired. In addition to raising awareness about impaired driving, MADD offers support to victims and survivors of impaired driving. Police urge the public to call 9-1-1 to report suspected impaired drivers.

Crohn's and Colitis Awareness (Irritable Bowel Disease)

Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis are diseases that inflame the lining of the gastrointestinal tract and disrupt your body's ability to digest food, absorb nutrition and eliminate waste in a healthy way. In 2021, more than 300,000 Canadians were believed to be living with IBD. By 2030, this figure is expected to reach 403,000 (or 1 in 100 people).

The causes of irritable bowel disease (IBD) are very complex. They are believed to be due to a **genetic tendency (predisposition) and an environmental trigger that combine to cause intestinal inflammation.**

What are the symptoms?

- Abdominal pain and cramping
- Diarrhea (severe and bloody stools with colitis)
- Rectal bleeding (common with colitis)
- Nausea and vomiting
- Diminished appetite and weight loss
- Gas or flatulence
- Bloating
- Fever
- Anemia
- Fatigue

Fast Facts:

- Canada has among the highest rates in the world.
- Crohn's and colitis can be diagnosed at any age, but people are more often diagnosed before the age of 30.
- The number of new cases of Crohn's disease in Canadian children has almost doubled since 1995.
- Males and females are equally affected.
- Crohn's and colitis can affect any race or ethnic group
- There is no special diet for people with Crohn's or colitis.

It's not always possible to tell from symptoms alone whether you have Crohn's disease or colitis. That's why it's important to visit your health care provider for a diagnosis. If you're experiencing symptoms and think you may have Crohn's or colitis, schedule an appointment with your health care provider to find out for sure.

We have to eat to live.

Thank goodness for the helpers in our communities who provide nourishment to people dealing with food insecurity.

They are food bank volunteers, the newly created School Nutrition Fund at the Temiskaming Foundation, churches and local businesses doing fundraisers.

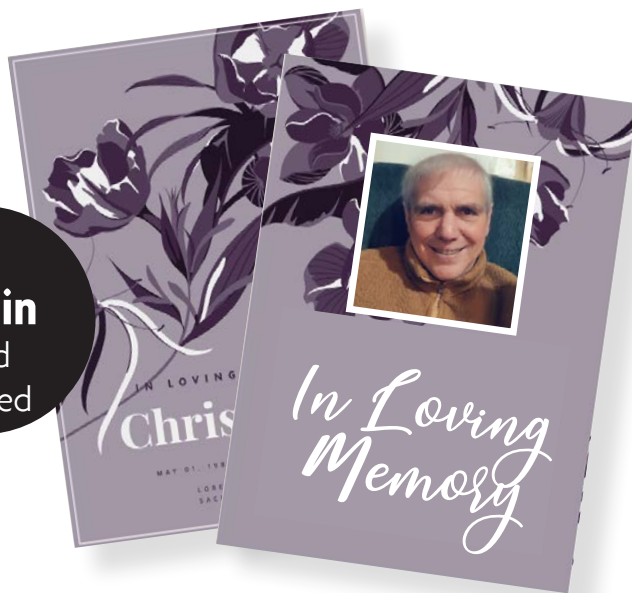

Cobalt says no to clearing debris on private property

COBALT - Cobalt council has defeated a request from a property owner asking the town clear his property where the Cobalt Public School formerly stood.

The property at 5 Dunning Drive contains rubble remaining from the former building.

The owner had offered to pay for the landfill costs if the project proceeded.

Town manager Steven Dalley said the owner has expressed an interest in

building affordable housing at the site.

Councillor Doug Wilcox expressed willingness to consider the proposal, noting that there have been instances in which municipalities support organizations where the project is "going to have a net benefit to the community."

But he also pointed out that there are contractors who can do that work.

The town would be assuming liability if it undertook the project, he added.

Councillor Pat Anderson said the project wouldn't have much cost for

the town but she questioned if the town's public works employees have time to do the project.

Councillor Rene Lafleur also expressed concern for the town employees and the possibility that one of them would be injured in the job.

Councillor Jim Starchuk agreed with the previous statements regarding possible damage to equipment and injury to employees. He also pointed out that the property is privately owned as well.

Councillor Gary Hughes added that the town does not have ex-

tra finances at this time for such a project.

Mayor Angela Adshead agreed with that perspective.

"We can't afford to do it."

She noted that if the equipment breaks down in the process or an employee gets hurt, it also leaves the town short-handed as winter begins.

"Our guys are going to be busy. We have critical infrastructure we have to take care of for all our residents."

Dalley also reminded council that the town's auditor has spoken to council about avoiding taking on extra expenses.

Health units still planning for January 1 merger

TEMISKAMING SHORES – The Timiskaming and Porcupine health units continue planning for their merger on January 1.

“That’s the direction we’re still being given to work towards,” said Dr. Glenn

Corneil, acting medical officer of health and CEO of the Timiskaming Health Unit (THU), in an interview last week.

The two health units, which cover the districts of Timiskaming and Cochrane, are waiting on provincial approvals to proceed with amalgamation.

The two health units

announced in the summer of 2023 that they were pursuing a voluntary merger to increase staff capacity to deliver public health programming, respond to surges and emergencies, and increase efficiencies.

Consideration of amalgamation dates back to the 1990s, and their merger has been proposed at various

times.

The Ontario government began discussing widespread consolidation of public health units in 2019, but any moves were put on hold by the pandemic in early 2020.

Local talks restarted, with the challenges posed by the pandemic to public health cited as a reason.

The two health units have proposed a name for the new entity – the Northeastern Health Unit/Conseil de santé de la circonscription sanitaire du Nord-Est.

They’ve also proposed a board structure. Municipal representation across the two districts would total 13.

Timmins, as the largest

municipality, would appoint three members, and Temiskaming Shores, two. Kapuskasing, Kirkland Lake, and Cochrane-Smooth Rock Falls would each name one.

The smaller and rural municipalities would share a total of five representatives.

In a recent letter to municipalities in the two districts, Corneil and Dr. Lianne Catton, his counterpart at the Porcupine Health Unit, encouraged them to consider appointments.

They’ve requested that the appointees be named, with letters of municipal endorsement, by December 13.

The municipal representatives are slated to meet January 1. They'll be joined at some point by provincial appointees.

But Corneil said health unit representatives' message to the public, the services and organizations with which they work is that, on January 2, "nothing changes."

On November 19, Temiskaming Shores council named its two current THU representatives – Mayor Jeff Laferriere and Councillor Mark Wilson – to the new board.

The Timiskaming and Porcupine health units are not the only ones contemplating merger by January 1.

Corneil said they're among nine Ontario health units proposing to amalgamate into four new organizations.

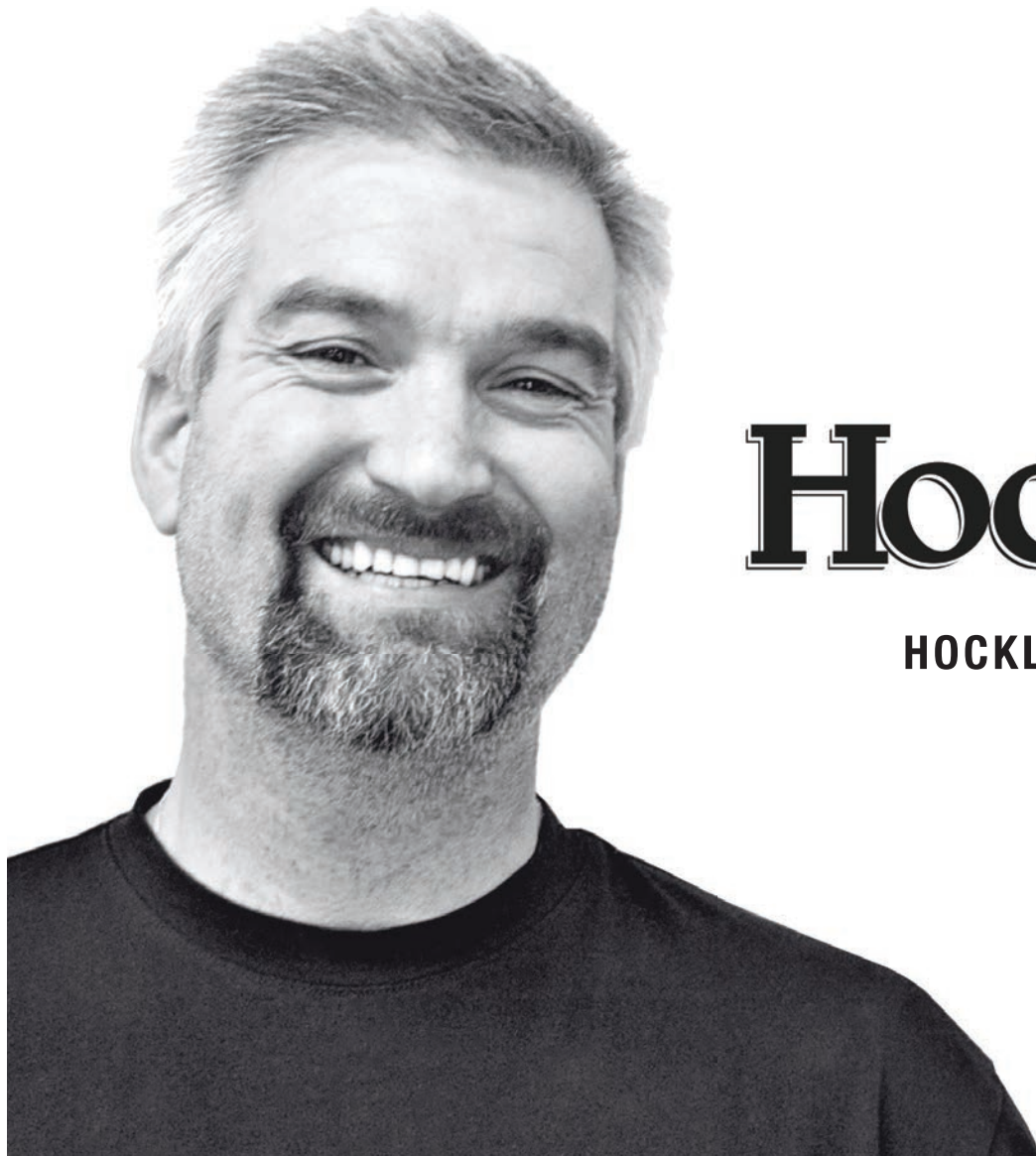
