RockWalk Park bench a family legacy

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A stone as distinctive as the RockWalk Park itself is now making the Haileybury venue a little more comfortable for visitors.

The children of Jack and Gloria Frey have donated a stone bench to the park, located on Northern College's campus, in memory of their parents.

The bench is made of black granite from River Valley Granite Quarry in the District of Nipissing.

The quarry northwest of River Valley "is the only current source of black granite in Ontario," said Graham Gambles, chair of the RockWalk Park organization.

It's commercially known as Dana black granite, and is sold internationally for panels, pavers and other stone products, explained Gambles in an email.

"It is unique in its small grain and crystal sizes, making it stronger than most granites," he said.

The bench is the latest addition to the park, which showcases almost 200 large samples of ore from across the country.

The bench also enhances the park's arboretum, Continued on page 3

a botanical garden devoted to trees that are native to the area and some that will test the limits of what can be grown in the region.

There's also a story to the bench.

Jack Frey, who died in 2002 at the age of 75, taught at the Haileybury School of Mines from 1954 through 1967. In 1968, he took over as dean, a position he held until he retired in 1989.

His wife Gloria died in 2020. From the bench, one can see the former Frey home at the corner of Rorke Avenue and Probyn Street.

The idea for the bench came after the sale of the family home, said the Freys' daughter Janice in an email.

A memorial tree and a memorial stone recognize her father's contribution, she said.

But she said nothing paid tribute to her mother, who had been active in a few charities, most notably the CNIB and the March of Dimes.

"She taught ballroom dancing well into her 70s. There are many couples that remember their lessons as a 'night out," she said.

"The bench is just a way to acknowledge the husband, wife and family together," she said.

The Frey children now live in other parts of the province – Janice and sister Carla are in Oakville, and son Steven is an optometrist in Penetanguishene.

"Since we sold the family home, we have visited Haileybury in the summer, staying at a local cottage resort. We hope to be able to spend more time there as our circumstances allow," she said. The bench is located near the bus stop at the pedestrian entrance to the park on Probyn.

Gambles hopes it will be enjoyed by both visitors to the park and the college's staff and students.

The RockWalk Park, he added, would welcome more donations of benches and tree sponsors as the arboretum component of the park develops.


Can there be a greater shame than one of the wealthiest provinces in the country spending so much money to make alcohol more accessible while people are homeless and food insecure?

Premier Doug Ford says he wants to end hallway medicine and make more health care professionals available, but he isn't going to be able to provide those essential services while incurring a massive budget deficit.

Chronic underfunding by governments has led to the thinning of social safety nets and a rising number of people living in poverty. And offering up politically motivated cheques isn't the answer to people in the north seeking a family doctor, safer highways and more homes for the homeless.

The situation of homelessness, opioid addiction deaths, dangerous highways and long wait times for surgery has gotten worse under the current Ford regime.

While Ford's \$200 rebate cheques may allow some people to buy a couple of extra cases of beer at the corner store, it falls short for the many living hand to mouth in this so-called opulent province.



New culvert first step in Harman's Road repairs

CHARLTON-DACK/EVANT-UREL TOWNSHIP - A new 110foot culvert has now been installed on Harman's Road in the Municipality of Charlton and Dack.

The project was completed at the end of September and was considered a priority for Charlton-Dack and for their neighbours in Evanturel Township.

The culvert was washed out in a torrential downpour felt across the region in early April. The loss of the culvert ended up stranding Evanturel residents living to the east of the site on Harman's Road.

The residents had no other access out of their properties because a bridge on the road, located in Evanturel, has been closed since June 2022 when an accident occurred as a farm implement was being towed across the bridge. The incident resulted in damage to the bridge which was then closed because it was unsafe.

The two municipalities have been working together to provide access for the residents, and the new culvert will now ensure the road is fully accessible by emergency vehicles when required.

Evanturel Township is now taking steps to get the bridge site shovel-ready for the possibility of finding government funding to assist with the construction of a new bridge.

STAGES

In a telephone interview, Evanturel clerk - treasurer Virginia Montminy said an engineering consultant has

been chosen to help the township to go through the stages to get ready for the construction of a new bridge.

EXP consulting firm was chosen at Evanturel's September 25 meeting.

Clerk-treasurer Vaughn Finch said in a telephone interview that the project needed to take place before the winter season.

"The culvert is just across

the geographic border between Charlton-Dack and Evanturel Township," said Montminy.

"Thankfully Charlton and Dack were very helpful in getting that put together for us."

Public Notice of Application for Consent

Clause 53(5)(a) of the Planning Act

The Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing has received Application No. 54-C-244188 for consent in the Unincorporated Township of Grenfell, District of Timiskaming. The subject property is described as PIN 61229-0307, Grenfell, UT, District of Timiskaming.

This application would transfer approximately 0.19 hectares of land from PIN 61229-0307 to PIN 61229-0298 to address an encroachment as well as an easement in favour of PIN 61229-0298. The benefitting lot will cover approximately 21 hectares while the proposed retained lot will be approximately 10.60 hectares. The proposed access easement would be approximately 31 meters deep with 22.6 meters of frontage on Kenogami Lane, with an area of 0.07 hectares.

No new development is proposed as a result of this application.

The purpose of this notice is to inform the public of the nature of the application, invite public input, advise on how to make comments on the application and advise the public of future notification and appeal rights.

Appeal Rights under the Planning Act

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Minister in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Minister at the above address. Appeal of a decision of the Minister in respect of this consent, and/or any condition imposed by the Minister, may be made by a specified person or any public body not later than 20 days after notice of the decision is given. If a person or public body has the ability to appeal the decision of the Minister in respect of the proposed consent to the Ontario Land Tribunal but does not make written submissions to the Minister before the Minister gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

Additional Appeal Rights under the Environmental Bill of Rights

The Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993 provides a separate ability to seek leave to appeal decisions on consent applications that are posted to the Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO). This appeal must be commenced within 15 days of the notice of decision being posted on the ERO. 




