Casey continuing upgrades with roads and more in '25

CASEYTOWNSHIP - Casey Township worked steadily through 2024 and has plans for 2025 to continue to upgrade and maintain its infrastructure.

Work carried out in 2024 included pulverizing on Pearson Drive on the east side of the municipality, and on Omer Street on the northwest side of the village of Belle Vallee.

Casey Township Reeve Guy Labonté said council will be looking at the 2025 budget to continue surface treatment work in those areas.

Cervical Cancer - What You Should Know

Each year in Canada, more than 1,500 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer. Every day at least 1 person will die from this disease. Almost all cases of cervical cancer are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV), which is preventable through the HPV vaccine. The publicly funded vaccine is provided to male and female students in every province and territory through school-based programs. Regular screening of adult women is also vital as cervical cancer caught at an earlier stage has a high survival rate. Most cervical cancer (67%) occurs in women aged 40-59.

Risk Factors

The main risk factor for developing cervical cancer is the sexually transmitted human papilloma virus (HPV) that infects the cervix.

Other risk factors for developing cervical cancer include:

- Becoming sexually active at a young age; having many sexual partners or having a sexual partner that has had many sexual partners.
- Smoking.
- The use of birth control pills for a long period of time.
- Giving birth to many children.
- Having taken diethylstilbestrol (DES), or being the daughter of a mother who took DES.

Who Should Be Screened:

- A Pap test is recommended every 3 years for anyone with a cervix (women, transmasculine and non-binary people) 21 years old and older who are or have been sexually active.
- Women who have had a hysterectomy (an operation to remove all or part of the uterus) should talk to their doctor or nurse practitioner to see if they need to continue getting Pap tests.

Regular screening can stop at the age of 70 if a woman has had 3 or more normal tests in the previous 10 years.

You should still get a Pap test to check for cells that could lead to cervical cancer if you:

- feel healthy and have no symptoms
- are no longer sexually active
- have only had one sexual partner
- are in a same-sex relationship
- have been through menopause
- have no family history of cervical cancer
- have received the HPV vaccine

If you are due or overdue for cervical cancer screening, call your primary care provider today to schedule an appointment. Screening is the only way to find the early changes that might lead to cervical cancer.

Smoking can kill you

We should be long past reminding people of the dangers of smoking, but here we are doing just that as it is National Non-Smoking Week (January 19-25) in Canada. Smoking can kill you. We've known this for at least 50 years or more and yet millions still smoke and many

more pick up the habit each year.

Smoking is the leading cause of preventable disease and death in Canada, says the Lung Health Foundation.

While smoking harms your health, you may not notice it at first. That is why the World Health Organization calls tobacco a "gradual killer."

Did you know that, on average, a smoker lives 10 years less than a non-smoker?

The link between tobacco and cancer is well established.

But there is good news about smoking and quitting.

Regardless of a person's smoking history or where you are in your quitting journey, there is help available to

quit smoking.

The Northeastern Ontario Public Health Unit (Timiskaming Health Unit) provides free confidential stop smoking services. This includes medications and one-on-one support for eligible individuals.

The reason people continue to smoke despite the health risks is simple - addiction.

There is a Smokers' Helpline at the Health Unit when you call 705-647-4305 or you can call Telehealth Ontario at 1-866-797-0000.

Despite the THU making numerous attempts to have the New Liskeard Fall Fair deemed a smoke-free family event, or even have designated smoking areas, it has not succeeded. This falls

in line with the reduction in exposure to second hand smoke for people.

According to the THU, Temiskaming has the highest rates of smoking in Ontario.

Tobacco is a highly addictive substance and the best way to quit smoking is to never start in the first place.

If you have someone in your life who smokes, support them, help them in their quitting journey.

The highlight of National Non-Smoking Week was Weedless Wednesday, marked on January 22, which encourages people to go a full day without smoking and to seek permanent ways to help kick the habit of smoking (tobacco and cannabis).

"My people say the birds are child spirits, the song of them is the innocent, exuberant joy of children. In this splash of late winter sunshine they're gleeful."

By the hundreds, they flew up in a medley of white, black and shimmering gold.

I spotted a large flock of snow buntings on a country road last weekend.

These beautiful birds, the size of robins, are welcome visitors from the high Arctic.

If ever a bird was built for winter, it is the snow bunting with feathers on their ankles to help them stay warm.

My friend Vic Roach has hundreds of snow buntings at his place and he generously feeds them their favourite food, cracked corn.

Maybe it doesn't happen to you, but when I see birds rise up like that my heart skips a beat.

It is so incredibly beautiful.

Nature provides us with moments of wonder against a world of fake news, violence and so much discord.

I think the thing about birding that I love the most is there is so much to learn.

I am not an expert on birding by any means but I am getting good at identifying species of birds and knowing their characteristics.

I even broke down and bought a good pair of binoculars.

Yikes, I think I am becom-

ing a bird nerd.

It has been a strange winter for bird sightings in South Temiskaming as there just aren't that many birds around these days.

I see blue jays, black capped chickadees, pine grosbeaks, evening grosbeaks, rose breasted nuthatch, downy and hairy woodpeckers, crows, ravens and pigeons but not much else.

I spotted a small flock of common red polls in the bush in Coleman Township but they aren't coming to the backyard feeders.

I have been patiently waiting for the nomads of the skies, the Bohemian waxwings, to arrive in the region.

Large flocks of American robins literally stripped the area fruit bearing trees last fall of their bounty so we may not see any Bohemi-

ans.

I was at the Hilliardton Marsh recently and a flock of 40 white-winged crossbills flew up into tall pine trees.

Marsh bird bander Jacob Lachapelle said the crossbills don't come to the feeders or nets so it makes it difficult to study their numbers.

As blue Monday (January 20), the most depressing day of the year was marked this week, I say it is impossible to feel blue when watching birds and their joyful movements.

Birding is the ultimate mindfulness activity, getting you out of your head and plugging you into nature.

We need very much to look for beauty and positivity during these challenging times.

Upgrades coming to Farr Park tennis courts

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) – Haileybury's tennis courts in Farr Park are getting a makeover.

The playing surface will be refurbished by the end of June, and one of the two courts will be converted into four pickleball courts.

Temiskaming Shores council has awarded the \$76,000 contract to Toronto Court Equipment of Scarborough.

The work is part of a \$325,660 project that will see upgrades at both Farr Park and Shaver Park in North Cobalt. The work is partially funded by the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund.

The township also did ditching and resurfacing over a mile on Belle Vallee Road, one mile west of Promenade Road.

A third coat of surface treatment was also applied to four streets in Belle Vallee in 2024.

The township upgraded its well that serves the Casey Township Volunteer Fire Department and Rendez-Vous Park.

New pumps were purchased and one will aid the fire department in filling its tanker truck, reducing the time to fill it from 20 minutes to four, said Labonté.

Money left over from one of the COVID-19 government funding sources was used for the project and the work will be completed in the spring, said the reeve.

Improvements were also made at Rendez-Vous Park, Labonté noted.

"Recreation got some trees, cleaned up the park, and planted the trees," he said.

"We had some pickleball nets in the arena and ratepayers and guests were able to use them. We had one the year before and we installed the second one this summer. There's two or three nights

where people come and play."

The township continues to work on its official plan, which will redefine zoning, residential areas and agriculture areas. Labonté noted that the provincial government is bringing some changes that will enable people to build housing.

Suzanne Boucher retired as councillor after a total of 29 years in the position.

Council advertised for a new councillor, and Jacques Fortin has been sworn in to fill the role.

Labonté gave special thanks to the council, staff and volunteers for their contributions in 2024.

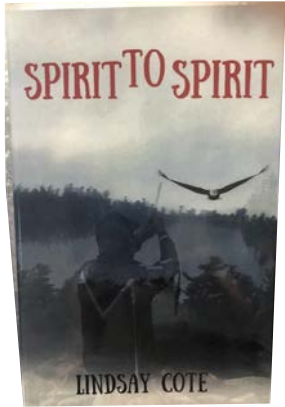

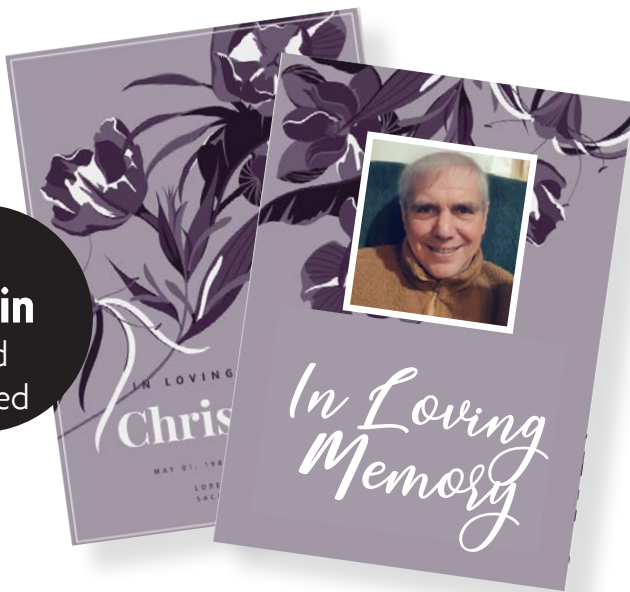

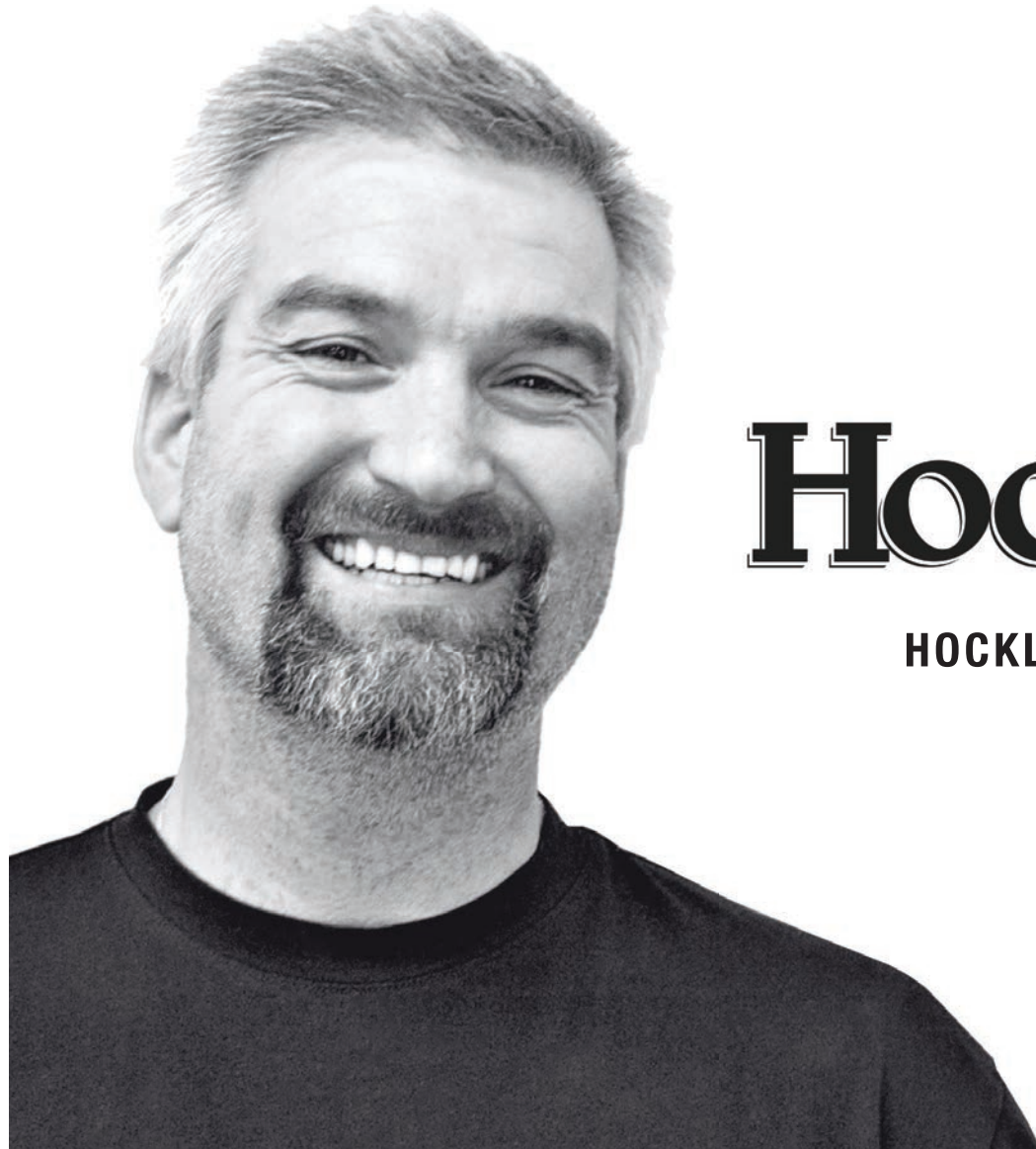
