Armstrong stepping into new recycling program

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP - Armstrong Township council has agreed to contract GFL Environmental Inc. to pick up recycling materials from all residences and non-eligible sources from April to December

Armstrong Township chief administrative officer Dan Thibeault explained in an email that "as of April 1, 2025, residential recycling will be fully covered under the province's new producer-responsibility program, meaning the Township will no longer be responsible for residential recycling services.

"For businesses, council has decided to continue the current curbside recycling pickup until the end of 2025. Businesses currently pay a recycling fee, but the cost of the service is increasing in April. Rather than passing this increase on to businesses, the township will use funds from the sale of our residential recycling bins to cover the difference for the rest of the year. This ensures businesses won't face higher costs in 2025."

Under the new provincial program for recycling, businesses and some other sites are excluded from the recycling program, and will be forced to manage their own recycling needs. However, there is a provincial push to have this exclusion amended so that these sources are included in the program.

"Unless the province changes its program to include businesses or council decides to extend the contract for curbside pickup, they (businesses) may need to arrange their own recycling services starting in 2026. The options for 2026 are still being discussed," said Thibeault. Continued on page 3



During its February 5 meeting, council approved its contract with GFL Environmental for the recycling pickup.

However, council discussed concerns that some locations may attempt to load up their recyclables at the curbside. A limit on the amount of recyclables allowed at the curbside for one pickup will be investigated.

Armstrong council also agreed to add its voice to others across the province that are calling on the provincial government to amend the blue box program so that all sources are included.

Council is sending a letter of support on that subject to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario and the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities to have businesses and other non-eligible sources folded into the program. John Vanthof, the provincial New Democratic Party incumbent candidate who has been in office since 2011, and Andrea Khanjin, provincial Progressive Conservative

candidate for Barrie-Innisfil, who has been serving as Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks, will also be included in the notice from the township about their wish for a change in the program.

Bullying happens in many different forms. It's doing, saying or acting in a way that hurts someone else or makes him or her feel bad on purpose.

Words hurt! We all seem to recognize physical bullying, but sometimes other forms of bullying are not as easy to identify. Being called names can hurt someone else's feelings. All forms of bullying are harmful, but VERBAL bullying, including name-calling, happens more often than any other kind of bullying.

Did you know:

- One in seven Canadian children aged 11 to 16 are victims of bullying
- Bullying occurs once every 7 minutes on the playground and once every 25 minutes in the classroom
- Other kids are watching 85% of the time when one kid bullies another kid. Adults like teachers or parents hardly ever see a bully being mean to someone else.
- In majority of cases, bullying stops within 10 seconds when peers intervene, or do not support the bullying behaviour

- Depression
- · Social anxiety, loneliness, isolation

But your biggest asset is your team of doctors and nurses, and technicians, who are top notch.


What was a very stressful situation for me was made much better because of the quality of care close to home.
