Lake Temiskaming neighbours hoping for federal funding

TEMISKAMING SHORES – The city is endorsing a funding application for a project that would work with communities on both sides of the border to enhance protection of Lake Temiskaming.

The project would be led by Timiskaming First Nation in partnership with Organisme de bassin versant du Témiscamingue (OBVT).

OBVT is a watershed organization, one of 40 in Quebec, and was established to improve water management in the Abitibi-Témiscamingue region. It has looked at water quality issues in the Blanche and Wabi rivers and in Dixon and Farr creeks.

The two-year project that's being proposed would be broad, and include public education, clean-up activities, and restoration of riverbanks.

The first step would be the creation of a broadbased team representing stakeholders around the lake, community members, Indigenous people, elders and youth.

Nipissing-Timiskaming **Conservatives to** choose candidate

NORTH BAY (Special/Staff) Three contestants will be running to become the Conservatives' candidate in Nipissing-Timiskaming in the coming federal election.

In a news release earlier this week, the riding's Conservative Association announced that three people had successfully completed the application process by the close of nominations March 14.

Contestants are Jordy Carr, who placed second in the 2019 election to Liberal Anthony Rota; Garry Keller; and Steven Trahan, who placed

to Rota.

The nomination race was sparked earlier this month when then-candidate Cassidy Villeneuve announced that she was stepping down.

She had won the nomination a little more than a year earlier, defeating Trahan to become the party's candidate in Nipissing-Timiskaming.

The nomination meeting will be held Saturday (March 22) in the G Wing Theatre at Canadore College in North

second in the 2021 election sociation president Gordan Rennie said, "Canadians cannot afford four more years of the Trudeau/Carney Liberal government. March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

Colorectal cancer (CRC) is the second most common cause of cancer deaths in Canadian men and women. Colorectal cancer incidence and mortality rates in Ontario are among the highest in the world.

Early Warning Signs:

If you notice any of the following, be sure to inform your doctor as soon as possible:

- · Unexplained changes in bowel habits, such as constipation or diarrhea
- · Change in size/shape of stools, such as being narrower
- The urge to have a bowel movement but nothing passes
- Rectal bleeding
- · Blood in or on the stool, ranging from bright red to dark
- Persistent abdominal pain/discomfort including bloating, fullness, cramps, gas pain
- Unexplained weight loss
- Weakness and fatigue
- · Anemia, caused by iron deficiency

Many of these signs may also be caused by other less serious gastrointestinal conditions, such as ulcers, Crohn's disease or hemorrhoids, but they should always be discussed with your doctor to receive the correct diagnosis.

The good news is that there is now a simpler colorectal screening test!! The fecal immunochemical test (FIT). FIT replaced the fecal occult blood test (FOBT) for people at average risk of getting colorectal cancer. Average risk is defined as people ages 50 to 74 with no first-degree relative who has been diagnosed with colorectal cancer. First degree relative refers to a parent, brother or sister or a child.

FIT offers several advantages over FOBT:

- FIT is a more sensitive screening test, which means it is better at detecting colorectal cancer and pre-cancerous
- There are no medication or dietary restrictions (including anticoagulants and vitamin C);
- FIT is simple to use and helps reduce contact with stool;
- · Only one stool sample is needed compared to the previous 3 sample requirement

What do You Have to Do?

Your primary care provider will fax a requisition to LifeLabs for you when you are due for this screening test and LifeLabs will mail a FIT kit to you directly. This screening test needs to be repeated every two years providing the result is normal.

Once completed, it's important to either drop it off or mail it to Lifelabs within two days of collecting it. It's that easy!

But if anyone should ask, no, Canada is not agreeable to being the 51st state.



The wings of spring

"Hope is the thing with feathers that perches on our soul," Emily Dickinson

I love it when things excite me and I learn something new.

If you are at all into birding, then you already know there is so much to learn about our feathered friends.

This is the month when the eighth wonder of the world begins.

It is the start of the spring migration when birds return to the Boreal forest to nest and raise their young.

These tiny vulnerable creatures travel thousands of miles from Central America, Mexico and the United States to our beautiful region.

Birds navigate harsh weather patterns and all kinds of hazards and it is a true miracle they arrive safely here year after year.

Can you believe a tiny hummingbird can fly all the way from Mexico to our region and back again every spring and fall?

Of the 650 species of North American birds, half of them are long distance migrators.

Birds have three different compasses that help to guide them northwards to the Boreal forest: the position of the sun, the pattern of the stars and the earth's magnetic field.

The moon also plays a part in migration as many birds migrate shortly after a full moon. And it also plays a part in the mating patterns of some birds as I have seen a pair of loons on my favourite lake mate around the time of the full June moon.

Then a month later, almost to the day, a little brown fuzzy chick cracks open its shell and it joins the natural world.

The red-winged blackbirds and trumpeter swans just arrived.

Soon the grackles, robins, purple finch, hummingbirds, red-eyed vireos, hawks and the various species of warblers will arrive.

I hope they bring their long underwear with them.

I can hardly wait to hear the full-throated chest-booming sounds of birds in early spring, otherwise known as the dawn chorus.


I am convinced of it - songbirds migrating home bring spring with them and they wake up in the natural world singing.

Birds are symbols of hope and renewal and we could all use some of that these days.

As they cross the border into Canadian air space they should be prepared to pay a 25 per cent tariff. Ha, ha.

Let us rejoice in the arrival of our avian friends. As Pulitzer Prize winning author Mary Oliver said in her poem called Wild Geese: "Tell me about your despair and I will tell you about mine. Meanwhile the world goes on."

While we focus on our daily struggles, the natural world moves on as effortlessly as the birds passing over our heads.





Chamberlain's community garden and orchard warming up

CHAMBERLAIN TOWNSHIP - Spring is coming and something good is already taking root in Chamberlain Township.

An idea to create a Chamberlain Community Garden and Orchard is well on its way to taking form.

With long-time horticultural society member Dorothy de Champlain as the president, and Chamberlain Councillor Tracey Giesen also helping with organization, the project is ready to get going.

The project is also being promoted as an intergenerational gardening project for people of all ages.

While the project is focused on the Chamberlain community, it is also open to the community at large, said Giesen in a telephone interview.

In 2024 the township circulated a survey and found there is good interest for a community garden, she said.

The project has now secured \$800 from the Planet Youth Timiskaming's activity fund, and also has been approved for a \$1,000 grant from the Temiskaming Foundation, said Giesen.

FIRST MEETING

The first meeting will be taking place Monday, March 31, at the Chamberlain community hall at 467501 Chamberlain Road 5.

The free event will include local beef on a bun with coleslaw, served at 5 p.m.

At 6 p.m. Master Gardener Charlie Warner will speak on northern gardening.

Then at 7 p.m. sign-up sheets will be provided for members of the public, from teens to seniors and everyone in between who is interested in participating in the project. The date for the second meeting will also be set.

Giesen also commented that she hopes to "open up the dialogue" for those who are planting gardens at home, and to determine whether they "would like to post what they're growing and have a vegetable exchange."

The new community garden will be planted on the west side of the community hall and will predominantly have raised beds. An orchard of trees will also be planted and Giesen thinks that hardy dwarf fruit trees will be included in the selection.







The project aligns with the community-based strategic plan that was recently adopted by council, said Mayor Jeff Laferriere when council met earlier this week.

One of the five goals in the plan is that Temiskaming Shores be an environmental steward of Lake Temiskaming and the natural environment in and around the municipality.

Councillor Nadia Pelletier-Lavigne described the proposed project as "a wonderful initiative."

"I think it's really looking to the present and the future," she said, adding it seems to be "the right partners around the table."

The application for funding is being submitted to the federal Canada Water Agency EcoAction's initiative for community-led freshwater actions.

If funding is approved, the city would provide in-kind support by offering, for example, the use of municipal facilities for community meetings and office space for project workers.

Lake Temiskaming is also the subject of this year's Building Ties session.

The gatherings bring together representatives of Temiskaming Shores, the Témiscamingue region of Quebec, and Timiskaming First Nation.

This year's get-together will be held April 24 at Riverside Place in New Liskeard.

New group sees benefits in local hospice
