"I was shaking when I got that email," said Givens, who is aquatic and youth programmer in Temiskaming Shores' recreation services.

Not all of the contestants have the biggest online followings, she said, and were instead picked on merit, "which is something you really don't see in these types of competitions anymore."

"It's a really cool dynamic," she said.

She was interviewed by representatives of Cottage Springs and Starseed Entertainment, a recording label that represents a small roster of artists including Dean Brody and The Reklaws.

The contest winner will receive a record deal with Starseed, as well as artist development sessions, songwriting workshops, and media training. There's also a \$10,000 cash prize, and the winner will open for The Reklaws at the KEE to Bala in Muskoka August 1 and 2.

Givens is a self-taught singer and guitarist.

She began playing the guitar as a 15-year-old student in preparation for a show at Timiskaming District Secondary.

"I wanted to be on the stage and I wanted to sing, but I didn't play any instruments. I was, 'if you're going to get up there, you've got to play something, too, you've got to do it all.'

Gallery receives Ontario Trillium Foundation grant

TEMISKAMING SHORES - TAG is the recipient of a \$160,000 two-year grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

During the Art After Dark evening at the Temiskaming Art Gallery (TAG) April 25, gallery fundraising coordinator Jasmine Reil, with Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP John Vanthof, acknowledged the grant with the gallery's appreciation.

The grant will help the gallery plan "well thought-out professional fundraising and programming delivery in orfinancial and organizational model," she said.

"In the past decade TAG has successfully increased its programming by 600 per cent."

She added that Open Studio Libre, operated by the gallery provides year-round workshops and programming, but she added that the gallery also recognizes the need to cut costs and increase revenue.

The Trillium grant will fund Reil's role as fundraiser over the next two-year period, and will allow it to hire consultants to assist with fundraising strategies.



Let's take the high road, act like friends and work as one nation to solve our


problems.

And she was there for my brother and sister's children as


I learned from Lena the values of generosity, hard work, fairness and to keep going no matter what.



Appeal Rights under the Planning Act






