TORONTO (Special/Staff) - The newly re-elected Progressive Conservative government's first budget has "in many ways, failed to meet the moment," says Temiskaming's MPP.


The May 15 budget offers some measures "that could help backstop sectors that are being impacted by restricted trade with the U.S.," said Timiskaming-Cochrane

New Democrat John Vanthof in a news release.

But the government's claim "that it is going to protect and strengthen Ontario largely misses the mark, especially in the North," he said.

Vanthof said Ontario is facing its highest unemployment in years, crumbling infrastructure, and the lowest housing starts in decades, "yet the government has continued to ignore these issues."

He said the budget offers no new funding for special education, school transportation, home care or respite care, and cuts more than \$200 million from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services.

He said "much more support" should be provided to municipalities for the infrastructure needed by housing.

"The province must get directly involved in the building of affordable housing. We are in a housing crisis, which will not be solved by the private sector alone. The Ford government's housing policy has

failed for the last seven years, and with this budget it will continue to fail."

He said the NDP Opposition fully supports efforts to strengthen Canada and remove trade barriers.

But he said the government fails to realize that infrastructure, especially highways like 11 and 17, are "already inadequate."

"Ontario is the only province where the TransCanada highway is still two lanes. It was very disappointing to see that there are no plans to increase the pace of highway construction in the North."

Vanthof referred to Premier Doug Ford's pledge during a campaign stop in Iroquois Falls to widen Highway 11 from Temiskaming Shores to Cochrane by extending the 2+1 highway design.

Vanthof described the February announcement as "a vague, last-minute promise."

He said the budget allocates no funding for the measure, nor a solid timeline to complete the pilot project south of Temagami.

"We will continue to advocate for vital road infrastructure," he said.



May is Bladder Cancer Awareness Month

DID YOU KNOW?

- There are more than 80,000 Canadians living with bladder cancer
- Bladder cancer is the fifth most common cancer in Canada
- 8,700 Canadians will be diagnosed with bladder cancer this year
- The biggest warning sign of bladder cancer is blood in the urine
- Smoking is a common risk factor, as are age and work related exposure to specific chemicals

SYMPTOMS:

The most common symptom of bladder cancer is blood in the urine. The colour may vary from pale yellow-red to bright or rusty red. Blood may always be in the urine, or it may come and go. Sometimes the blood can only be seen with a microscope or found with other urine tests.

Other symptoms include:

- The need to pee often (also called urinary frequency)
- An intense need to pee (also called urinary urgency)
- Trouble peeing
- A burning sensation or pain when you pee
- Back, pelvic or groin pain

Because the disease may have progressed unnoticed, it is critical to see a health care provider once you begin to experience symptoms. Since many symptoms are similar to other medical conditions, bladder cancer is often misdiagnosed as, for example, a urinary tract infection. If you are concerned, ask your health care provider for a referral to a urologist to rule out bladder cancer.

If you are having symptoms, please call to schedule an appointment with your primary care provider. It may very well not be bladder cancer, but these symptoms could be the result of a urinary tract infection which will also need to be diagnosed and treated accordingly.

Downtown situation

The Business Improvement Association (BIA), representing 150 merchants and agencies

near Armstrong Street to Whitewood Avenue, has put out a call for feedback on the situation existing in

the downtown core of New Liskeard.

The situation deals with loitering people and the perceived threat they pose to people coming to shop in the downtown core and to those merchants who wish to protect their clients.

The situation in the downtown core has to be safe for shoppers and people accessing banks and lawyers offices.

There have been incidents of vandalism, loitering, garbage strewn about and concerns being raised among people who are trying to use the downtown area as it was meant to be used and enjoyed.

Last week it was reported by observers that some inappropriate behaviour was being displayed by two individuals at the New Liskeard Cenotaph.

Temiskaming Shores is not the only community that is dealing with drug use, vandalism and criminal behaviour in its business core.

You have to empathize with the merchants who are trying to cope with these issues while wanting to keep people safe who are accessing their stores.

Some people are also sleeping in the downtown area.

It has been estimated

that Ontario's homeless population is at 234,000, just a tad shy of a quarter of a million people who are living without a home.

Certainly the 234,000 people that meet the definition of homeless are sleeping on street corners, in parks and in encampments around our province and here in our region.

The government of Ontario needs to step up to provide these people with low cost housing, mental health and addiction services and basic health care services yesterday.

This is a crisis that isn't going away and it is getting worse in our communities.

Some brave souls start wearing shorts even while there is still snow in the bush. I love it when the buds appear on trees and the crocuses, daffodils, tulips burst upwards with their bright colours replacing the grey of winter.

When the local apple trees start to blossom, especially those ones at the courthouse in Haileybury, I snap pictures of them hoping to capture the essence of their beauty.

By the time the birds arrive during the spring migration I am practically overflowing with joy.

The first signs of spring are the return of migrating birds who come to nest and raise their young in the life giving Boreal Forest.

It has been an absolute joy to see the warblers coming back, they are so full of life and they seem to sing from morning until night.

Their calls are so cheery. I

listened to a yellow warbler recently singing its "sweet, sweet, sweet" sounding song which brought such joy to me.

Spring is short and then we are into the full on heat of summer, which I don't mind at all.

I was out in my canoe the other night on a glass-like lake noticing how the water and surrounding forest smells.

The earth smells differently in springtime. It makes one want to take shoes and socks off and feel the earth caress your feet.

And that is what I did, feeling mother earth beneath me.


That would certainly be the definition of grounding.

After I got home I could smell the spring air in my hair, and my skin was softer for having been out on the lake.

I heard the distinct call of the Bobolink the other day, a bird listed on the Ontario endangered species list.

I am concerned about the Ford government's Bill 5, ironically named Protect Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act, 2025. This bill does not favour the Endangered Species Act. We should be safeguarding biodiversity and protecting natural ecosystems, not gutting them.

Manager suggests de-icer would benefit airport

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP - "It was one of the nastiest winters" airport manager James Smith said he has seen since he has been at starting to get people flying the airport.

He was speaking at the May 15 meeting of the Earlton-Timiskaming Regional Airport Authority in Armstrong Township.

Ice and heavy snow created challenges throughout the winter months, he related, and impacted flight numbers at the airport.

The numbers are now climbing

back up, which Airport Authority chair Jeff Laferriere (Temiskaming Shores mayor) commented was consistent with the seasonal highs and lows of flight numbers over the years.

"With the nicer weather we're again," said Smith.

He outlined to the Airport Authority members the reason he believes the airport needs to obtain a de-icer. Five charter flights were cancelled in one month because the airport did not have a de-icer, he said. "We would get more flights in with that ability to

Armstrong Township Councillor Dan Perreault agreed the purchase of a deicer could be something to consider if having a de-icer at the airport could bring in more revenue.

Harley Township Reeve Pauline Archambault noted that if a de-icer is obtained, it will be necessary to have trained people to carry out the de-icing of the aircraft.

Smith believes the vendor would pro-

vide training to staff to be able to operate the de-icer.

Laferriere asked Smith to prepare a wish list of things needed at the airport, and to include pricing for each of the items, as well as to indicate the level of urgency for each item.

The Airport Authority will be meeting again June 19 to finalize the airport bud-

High School, who will serve as a one-term Indigenous student


