DISTRICT (Special/Staff) – Is there an appointment you've been neglecting?

Blanche River Health (BRH) is participating in Mammothon 2025, a regional initiative designed to encourage eligible women to prioritize their breast health.

On June 25, its Kirkland Lake site will dedicate the day to providing mammograms for women aged 50 to 74 who have never been screened for breast cancer.

"The mammogram is the most effective screening tool we have for detecting breast cancer early," said Natalie Brissette, senior technologist-medical radiation technologist in diagnostic imaging at BRH.

"It can detect cancer before any symptoms appear, which is why it's so important for eligible individuals to get screened regularly," said Brissette in a media release.

"Early detection means better treatment outcomes, and the Mammothon is a great way to make that happen for as many people as pos-

The Kirkland Lake site is part of the Ontario

Breast Screening Program.

In 2021 BRH replaced its mammography machine with a state-of-the-art unit, thanks to a funding commitment from Kirkland Lake Gold. That commitment was honoured by Agnico Eagle after its acquisition of the company in 2022.

The Kirkland Lake site serves residents of Englehart, Kirkland Lake and the surrounding area.

While breast cancer continues to be the most common cancer diagnosed in Canadian women and the third leading cause of cancer deaths, BRH notes that fewer women are dying from breast cancer today than in the past.

Breast cancer deaths have decreased by more than 40 percent due to earlier detection through breast screening and improved treatments.

People aged 40 to 49 are also eligible for breast screening, and are encouraged to talk to their primary care provider to help decide if screening is right for them.

People without a primary care provider can call or visit Health811 for more information.

Mammothon runs from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. June 25. To book an appointment, contact BRH at 1-866-274-7774 or the Ontario Breast Screening Program at 1-800-668-9304.

Temiskaming Hospital is not participating in Mammothon this year.



Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

Thanks to all the volunteers, service groups and others who cultivate pride in our Temiskaming region with their generous actions.





traditional land where they come from. It is part of a protest and call to action for everyone to stand up against recent government policy such as the Ontario government's Bill 5 and the Federal government's Bill C5. You can follow their journey on Facebook at 'Here We Stand - Call to Action'

They hosted a series of gatherings in Attawapiskat leading up to their journey to allow young people to paint and share a family flag to symbolize their participation. Jeronimo and his family plan to take the flags and post them on the Attawapiskat River to show the world our people are still connected to the land. They hope to travel as far as the Muketei River, 200 km inland and connect

with allies in Neskantaga First Nation, an Ojibway First Nation, on Attawapiskat Lake, 400 km from James Bay. Their journey will also be joined by supporters from the other James Bay communities who will meet them at different points using float planes.

The Ontario government's Bill 5, according to a Chiefs of Ontario (COO) statement is described as 'It concentrates decision-making power in the hands of ministers and the Lieutenant Governor without mandating First Nations involvement, threatening sovereignty, land stewardship, and ongoing reconciliation efforts.' The federal government's Bill C5 was described by the Assembly of First Nations (AFN) as 'Chiefs raised strong concerns over the rushed legislative process, lack of meaningful consultation, narrowly defined national interest that excludes First Nations priorities and perspectives, a failure to support First Nations priorities such as closing the infrastructure gap, and the broader implications for rights and jurisdiction'.

First Nation leaders and advocates are protesting and fighting back against both sets of new government powers which essentially threaten to override First Nation rights on the land they live on. The Ontario Bill 5 allows the provincial government to designate special economic zones that would allow companies to bypass regulations and rules that are meant to protect the environment, ecology, water and rules to consult with First Nations on development. The Ontario government is focusing its attention on the Ring of Fire mining zone west of James Bay and right at the head waters of the Attawapiskat River.

During their first video


posting, the group stopped at the confluence of the Attawapiskat and Lawashi River at a place called Mahkehshekamik, or the Fox Channel. I was happy to see them there as it was one of the places I had visited with James and my dad Marius and brothers many years ago in the summer to fish and gather logs. It felt good to see the pictures of the majestic red hued water in this part of river as the channel can narrow down to wild rapids between the rocks and then open up to wide open expanses of water lined with endless pristine forests. I felt happy when James and Monique spoke Ininewmoon (Cree language) to share how they spotted moose, geese and even a set of giant pelicans. This is the magic of the land as the time they spend there means that both Jeronimo and Jonathan get to hear the stories, legends, history and culture of our people from their parents.

Every mile of this great river has a story of how it fed people, saved people from starvation, where adventures happened and also stories of people that had been lost to the land. Many locations tell a story of travel by canoe, by portage and in the winter about people moving by dog sled, snowshoe and snowmobile to travel to and from their fishing areas, hunting camps, traditional family trap lines, birth places and burial grounds. These lands are not merely some place for resource developers to invade and tear apart to make money. This land is our home and has been since the dawn of time. It is who we are as a people.

I was deeply moved by Jeronimo's direct action to spend time on the land he and his family want to de-

About 100 adults, seniors and youth walked along waving rainbow flags, with their faces painted in rainbows united in a mission to promote diversity, inclusion and acceptance of LGBTQ2Plus people living in South Temiskaming.

"We are so grateful for the continued support that this community gives us, whether it's sharing our Facebook posts, showing up to events, helping with sponsorships, volunteering and more," said Pride Temiskaming founder Kailey Kennedy in an online message. She said the numbers of walkers in the Pride Parade were down slightly this year, but acknowledged there were several events happening in the region on the day.






