

Four school boards launching new busing consortium in '26

TIMMINS (Special/Staff) – The four school boards serving Temiskaming students will be launching a new student busing transportation consortium, beginning in September 2026.

The move was announced last week by the Conseil scolaire catholique des Grandes Rivières, District School Board Ontario North East (DSB1), Northeastern Catholic District School Board, and Conseil scolaire public du Nord-Est.

In a joint statement, the boards said the new model reflects the most commonly used student transportation approach in Ontario, and aims to increase efficiency, improve service, and address the regional shortage of bus drivers.

At one time, the four boards had shared transportation services. But in 2005, the Grandes Rivières board opted to run its own busing service.

In the recent media release, Jérémie Lepage, director of education with the Grandes Rivières board, said the board "is pleased to collaborate with neighbouring school boards to establish a new transportation service with an entirely new governance model, to meet the needs of our families.

"By coordinating this approach, we can ensure

that our students continue to be transported to school safely, as we always have, by dedicated and caring staff."

The area's other three boards are currently part of North East Tri-Board Student Transportation.

In a joint statement, the directors of the three boards said:

"Bringing our four school boards together under a new independent student transportation consortium will allow us to move forward with a shared vision.

"As equal partners, we're thrilled to work together to improve efficiencies and address bus driver shortages, while striving to better serve students and families across Northeastern Ontario."

Existing transportation services will continue for the upcoming 2025-26 school year.

The new consortium will begin serving students and families in the fall of 2026.

At that time, the four boards will have the same school calendar, said Andréanne Denis, DSB1's communications manager, in an email.

Outdoor classroom a natural school extension

TEMISKAMING SHORES – Learning outside is in at a Haileybury school.

École catholique Ste-Croix has transformed an unused space at the rear of the school into an outdoor classroom, complete with a gazebo, container gardens, benches and picnic tables, and houses for butterflies and birds.

There's a giant chess set, and little covered kiosks for books, craft supplies and other materials. Paths are lined with stones painted by students to resemble ladybugs.

It's a marvellous project, said Jérémie Lepage, director of education at the Conseil scolaire catholique des Grandes Rivières, at the venue's official unveiling June 17.

PLANTING THE SEED

And like any garden, it took some time to come to fruition.

A committee was formed in 2019 to work on the project.

"I knew we had an empty space here that wasn't really utilized for anything," said Julie Grégoire, a parent who was instrumental in launching the initiative.

It offered an opportunity to get kids outside "and just to connect with nature," she said.

Planning was in the initial stages when the pandemic struck, cancelling school and fundraising opportunities.

At the same time, the pandemic heightened awareness of the benefits of outdoor activity for everyone, including young people.

When restrictions lifted, supporters began raising funds at a variety of events, including Haileybury's Night of Lights at Christmas and

the North on Tap craft beer festival.

The project was a beneficiary of \$7,000 from the 2024 North on Tap event and received a \$10,000 grant from TC Energy. It also received a school garden grant in 2023 from Whole Kids, a project of the non-profit Whole Foods Market Foundation based in Austin, Texas.

The project cost at least \$50,000, said principal Mélina Walkingshaw.

Much of the funding went to clearing and levelling the space at the rear of the school and to the construction of the covered gazebo.

Raised gardens have been installed, with plans to open them to the community for use.

The new space is to be used for education in a wide variety of subjects for the school's 120 students in junior kindergarten through Grade 8. It offers students the chance "to be creative, without the boundaries of four walls," said resource teacher Francine Brazeau-Kellar.

It allows students to use all their senses, away from screens, she said.

The outdoor space also recognizes Camille Chenier, the daughter of Grégoire and David Chenier. The Ste-Croix student died late last year, at the age of 10.

Camille had been involved with the project and its fundraising, Grégoire said.

"That's why it's even more important," said Grégoire, that the classroom is unveiled this year.

A tree has been planted in Camille's memory, and a butterfly-themed area, with benches and a mini garden, also pay tribute to her. Donors contributed to the project in her memory.

HERITAGE

The space also recognizes the area's Indigenous com-

munity.

A giant mural on a wall of the school facing the garden is dominated by an image of a giant turtle surrounded by strawberries and feathers. On a chimney overlooking the space are the Seven Grandfather Teachings in French.

Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP John Vanthof congratulated the designers of the space on the work they've done "to honour all our cultures."

Vanthof was on hand for the classroom's official unveiling June 17.

Prayers and well wishes were offered by Père Luc Landu Nzita of Paroisse Ste-Croix, Marilyn Chevrier-Wills of Timiskaming First Nation, Lorette McKnight of the Temiskaming Métis Community Council, and the Grandes Rivières school board.

Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

And equally, American tourists can easily cross the border from Minnesota, Michigan and New York to come to the pristine wilderness of Northern Ontario.


I don't tend to camp in provincial parks, but rather prefer a more backcountry camping experience minus the barking dogs, the screaming kids and the high price of those camp







Rochefort named to new posts

OTTAWA (Special/Staff) – Nipissing-Timiskaming's rookie MP has new duties in Ottawa.

Liberal Pauline Rochefort was recently sworn in as Parliamentary Secretary to the Secretary of State (Rural Development).

"The Canadian government is working to help rural communities grow and succeed, recognizing how important they are to the country's economy and society," said Rochefort in a media release.

"This appointment is an opportunity to support the many rural communities and businesses in Nipissing-Timiskaming and across Canada."

Rochefort said a parliamentary sectary is appointed by the prime minister to assist a cabinet minister or secretary of state in their parliamentary duties.

Liberal MP Buckley Belanger, who represents the sprawling riding of Desnethé-Missinippi-Churchill River in northern Saskatchewan, is the Secretary of State (Rural Development).

Rochefort was also named to the Standing Committee on Government Operations and Finance which reviews the process for considering estimates and supply, as well as the format and content of all budget estimates.

Rochefort said the committee "plays a crucial role in ensuring government operations are effective, efficient, and transparent, with a particular focus on the financial aspects of government activities, including those of the Privy Council, Treasury Board Secretariat, and Public Services and Procurement Canada."

The multi-party committee has nine members – four Liberals, four Conservatives, and one from the Bloc Québécois.

After nearly 50 years of providing emergency food services to eligible residents and operating for last 18 months providing 'interim food voucher' support while searching for a new home and assessing the future viability of its operations, the Cobalt Coleman Latchford and Area Food Bank will close it's doors on Wednesday September 10th, 2025.

A food bank exists to provide emergency food to those in need. No longer able to meet its core purpose, with no suitable physical spaces, an aging volunteer base, increasing operational demands and an unsustainable interim option, the leadership team has made the very difficult decision to sunset the Food Bank.

The Cobalt Coleman Latchford and Area Food Bank is 100% funded by donors and 100% operated by volunteers. It was incepted in 1974 and revived in 1997 by the United Church in Cobalt then established as an independent charity in 2004. Close to closing in 2013, it changed leadership, affiliated itself with Feed Ontario and operated out of the Town of Cobalt Fire Museum building on Earl Street. In 2022, the Team was advised that the building was unsound, then after attending a Town of Cobalt Council meeting to raise awareness and seek answers, the team was given 30 days to vacate the building October 2023.

With help from many kind individuals, equipment and effects were moved, service suspended and operations adjusted while the team sought options. In November 2023, food donations were redirected to the Haileybury Food Bank and the Team began providing food voucher support as an interim solution from the St. James Anglican Church. Fifteen locations were considered and many operational solutions implemented from November 2023 through April 2025. After exhausting all avenues, assessing numerous options, and shedding many tears, the leadership team reached a decision to close and seek alternative ways to support those in need in the community.

Communications and steps are well in progress and we are committed to ensuring a smooth transition over the next 3 months.

Please note that the CCLFB will no longer accept donations effective immediately however service will continue from the St James Anglican Church in Cobalt every Wednesday between the hours of 10 am to 12 pm through 10 September 2025 for eligible residents.

Team members will continue to look for new ways to support those in need including the St James Anglican Church's Soup's On and St Patrick's Student Breakfast Program.

We would like to take this moment to express our deep and sincere gratitude to all of our generous donors, our municipalities, volunteers, affiliated network members, vendors, supporters and all those who have been a part of our journey.







ing campaign in early April to purchase two new pieces of equipment.

Councillors Mike Cole and Shelly Church have spearheaded the fundraising campaign, geared to installing playground equipment for older children living in Latchford.

At that time, Cole said the town doesn't have money in the budget for the new equipment so the idea was to rely on the generosity of residents and friends of Latchford to help with the upgrades.

Donation boxes have been placed at locations across town, and flyers went out in mailboxes explaining the fundraiser to the residents.

Gray-Wilks said the branch has about 55 members, which she noted is significant for a town with a population of 400 to 500 people.

People have been supporting the Legion fundraising events, horseshoe, darts, shuffleboard tournaments, dinners, and Nevada ticket sales. Gray-Wilks commented that she feels the Legion's donation to the playground fundraiser sends a ripple of kindness across the community, and that quite often has come back to the Legion in generous ways.

The playground fundraising campaign now sits at \$8,727.
