

Building dedicated to memory of Jim Runnalls

TEMISKAMING SHORES - The board of the Little Claybelt Homesteaders Museum, family, friends and local history enthusiasts gathered on the museum grounds Saturday, June 21, to celebrate the opening of a new display and storage

The new building will be used primarily to house the museum's agriculture artifacts, explained museum board secretary and treasurer Elizabeth Pahkala.

The new building was the dream of the museum's late director Jim Runnalls, and has been dedicated in his memory.

Pahkala said the board decided to pursue Jim Runnalls' dream. After many letters, grant applications, and local advertising the funding rolled in, she related. Many area people donated personally; local businesses donated; Caisse Desjardins Ontario surprised the board with a \$10,000 donation; and a Northern Ontario Heritage Fund grant was approved.

Among the larger artifacts on display in the new building are two sleighs and a seed drill.

Formerly located inside the museum, the relocation of the large items opens up a little space in the museum, Pahkala commented.

Members of Jim Runnalls' family were present including sons Steven and Kevin, as well as daughter Kathy who flew out from Richmond, British Columbia. Brother Morley of Manitoulin Island (the youngest of the family at 80 years) where Jim and his siblings grew up, was also present. Two sisters, Darlene Orford and Elva Lloyd, and sister-in-law Mary Armstrong Gibson attended as well.

Kevin Runnalls commented that his father became fond of antiques when his farming career was winding down. He began to gather collectibles and fix them, Kevin remembered of his father.

Steven Runnalls added that when his father started attending the museum and working with the volunteers there, "it was like he found a second home."

It kept him active both physically and mentally, he said.

Kathy Runnalls commented, "I think Dad would have been very proud to see this."

Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

> The three most common types of tent caterpillars we see in Ontario are eastern, western and forest tent caterpillars.

> These little insects feed on trees' foliage, stripping trees of all their leaves and blossoms.

> They don't seem to discriminate against any tree species in their voracious appetites, other than perhaps the red maple.

> Their presence in certain regions varies from

we saw the cocoons from last year's invasion, we hoped they would not invade us again this spring.

The good thing about these bugs is that they are harmless to people and pets.

Sure, these caterpillars can send a chill down your spine or make the hair on your arms stand up with their repulsive appearance, but these creatures, for the most part, are harmless. That said, they can become a nuisance if they choose to populate near your home.

If there is enough of the

caterpillars together in one place they can cause what's called a "slick" and driving or walking over them can be a potential hazard.

They say the blackbilled cuckoo bird, that has been spotted and banded at the Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre, loves to eat them.

Instead of us all going cuckoo over these creepy crawlies, let us remember, they aren't here for a long time and soon the summer heat will get them.



On that trip we had a package with a spade, a roll of toilet paper and hand sanitizer.


It was called "the Goddess" and you had to ask the guide for it.

Pied Piper Kidshows receives show help

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special/Staff) – A children's performing arts series has received \$7,500 to help it present four shows and outreach activities.

Pied Piper Kidshows is one of 34 organizations receiving support from the Ontario Arts Presenters Projects program and the Ontario Arts Council.

The grant will help the local group provide four professional performing arts presentations at the Classic Theatre in Cobalt aimed at young audiences, said Candy Keith, Pied Piper president, in a media release.

"Alongside each presentation, and with support from our community partners, we will aim to coordinate five professional arts workshops in regional schools prior to the shows, as well as other outreach activities," Keith said.

The goals are to maximize the impact of Pied Piper activities, boost attendance at the shows, and "ensure an effective extended experience in our community for the visiting artists," she said.

"Workshops will take place in both official languages in elementary and high schools in each of our four school boards as well as in our neighbouring First Nations communities," she said.

"While organizing outreach activities with our existing community partners, we'll also strive to create new partnerships too."

The funding was announced by Nipissing MPP Vic Fedeli.

"Our government understands the important role that the arts play in fostering dynamic and thriving communities across Ontario," said the Progressive Conservative MPP in the release.

"This support will help Temiskaming's artists and arts organizations continue to make a positive impact on our economy, create good jobs and draw more visitors to our community."

The Ontario Arts Council is an agency of the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Gaming, and supports a wide range of Ontario-based artists, professionals in the field, and organizations.

In 2023-24, the province notes the council invested \$53 million in 219 communities in all ridings across Ontario.

Province announces disaster relief for 2024 flooding

TORONTO (Special) - More than \$680,000 is coming to five Temiskaming municipalities that suffered infrastructure damage from flooding more than a year ago.

In a recent bulletin, the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing announced they'll receive up to \$684,000 through the Municipal Disaster Recovery Assistance (MDRA) program.

It noted that heavy rainfall combined with frozen ground conditions in April 2024 led to flooding in the townships of Armstrong, Chamberlain, Kerns and McGarry and the Municipality of Charlton and Dack.

The storm caused damage to municipal infrastructure, including culverts and roads.

"Our government is stepping up to support our municipalities suffering from extensive damage due to unexpected natural disasters," said Municipal Affairs and Housing Minister Rob Flack in the bulletin.

The MDRA program helps municipalities pay for extraordinary emergency response costs and damage to essential property or infrastructure that are due to a natural disaster.

The province also announced \$46,000 for the Township of Pelee, the southernmost point in Ontario. Heavy rainfall in the summer of 2023 left the municipality facing costs to repair flood-damaged roads and purchase fuel to operate pumps.

Eligible expenses under the MDRA program may include operating and capital costs that are over and above regular municipal budgets and are directly linked to the disaster.

A municipality may be eligible for assistance if its disaster-related costs are at least three per cent of its taxation levy for its own purposes.


