



Window close to closing on wind turbine project

KERNS/HUDSON TOWNSHIP - Horizon New Energy, the company that wants to submit a wind turbine proposal in Kerns and Hudson townships, encountered a delay earlier this month when neither of the councils proceeded with a Municipal Support Resolution (MSR) for the project.

An MSR is required from the host municipality in order for a bid to be made by Horizon New Energy to the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO).

That means the company must now wait until early October to see if the councils will vote to approve an MSR then.

A bid to IESO must be made no later than October 16 if it is going to be considered.

At Kerns council on September 2, Councillor Mark Lenover proposed an amendment to the council agenda so that a vote could be taken on whether to approve an MSR. However, Councillor Clayton Seymour did not agree with the suggestion, and Reeve Terry Phillips said since no motion was previously presented to amend the agenda so the vote could be included, an amendment to the

agenda would not be considered. Council members Dennis Jibb and Loren Runnalls have declared a conflict of interest on the topic.

At the Hudson council meeting the following evening, Councillor Crystal Gauthier did get the question on the vote added to the agenda, but clerk-treasurer Krystle Gauthier advised council that she was worried that information disclosed in the in-camera portion of the meeting could influence council's decision on that vote. Council was advised the topic of the closed session was a potential litigation matter.

Hudson's council agenda was then rearranged to allow the in camera discussion to take place before the vote on whether to approve an MSR. After absenting themselves from the council chambers where approximately 40 onlookers were gathered, council took approximately 20 minutes to discuss the potential litigation matter and then returned to the council chambers and advised that they had decided to defer the item of a vote to their next public meeting on October 1.

Horizon New Energy representative Shannon Wever commented at the Kerns council meeting that she has heard "a lot of misinformation" about the project. She added that representatives of her

Cervical Cancer — What You Should Know

Each year in Canada, more than 1,300 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and over 400 die from the disease. Almost all cases of cervical cancer are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV), which is preventable through the HPV vaccine. The publicly funded vaccine is provided to male and female students in every province and territory through schoolbased programs. Regular screening of adult women is also vital as cervical cancer caught at an earlier stage has a high survival rate. Most cervical cancer (67%) occurs in women aged 30-59.

The main risk factor for developing cervical cancer is the sexually transmitted human papilloma virus (HPV) that infects the cervix.

Other risk factors for developing cervical cancer include:

- Becoming sexually active at a young age; having many sexual partners or having a sexual partner that has had many sexual partners.
- Smoking.
- The use of birth control pills for a long period of time.
- Giving birth to many children.
- Having taken diethylstilbestrol (DES), or being the daughter of a mother who took DES.

Who Should Be Screened:

- Cervical screening is recommended every 5 years for anyone with a cervix (women, transmasculine and non-binary people) 25 years old and older who are or have been sexually active.
- Women who have had a hysterectomy (an operation to remove all or part of the uterus) should talk to their doctor or nurse practitioner to see if they need to continue having cervical screening.

Regular screening can stop between the ages of 65 and 69 for individuals with a history of negative results.

You should still have cervical screening to check for cells that could lead to cervical cancer if you:

- feel healthy and have no symptoms
- are no longer sexually active
- have only had one sexual partner
- are in a same-sex relationship
- have been through menopause
- have no family history of cervical cancer
- have received the HPV vaccine

If you are due or overdue for cervical cancer screening, call your primary care provider today to schedule an appointment. Screening is the only way to find the early changes that might lead to cervical cancer.

Why not join your family and friends at this year's New Liskeard Fall Fair?







company "haven't seen this level of misinformation before," and have developed numerous projects in other locations in Canada.

Gordon Verok, also representing Horizon New Energy, said the delay in the vote prevented families from signing up if they had wanted to be included in the project. He explained that IESO needs to be advised where the wind turbines would be located.

At Hudson council it was evident that stresses are arising between members of the public and also between members of the public and council.

A petition has been circulated by opponents of the wind turbine proposal with results showing 56 per cent of the entire population of Kerns Township, and 55 per cent of the population of Hudson Township, are opposed.

TEMISKAMING SHORES - A day to reflect and perhaps come together to celebrate the efforts of a curly-haired man who wanted to raise awareness about cancer and raise funds for research will take place on Sunday.

That's when the Temiskaming Shores Terry Fox Run returns on two local fronts.

In Temiskaming Shores the organizer of the event is Jessica Paterson.

The theme of the 2025 Terry Fox Run is "Just Finish It" as Fox didn't finish his cross-Canada run due to the return of his cancer.

His Marathon of Hope

against cancer in 1980 ended in Thunder Bay as he was running from coast-to-coast. One way to continue his efforts is to take part in the annual walk/run, raising important funds for cancer research through the Terry Fox Foundation.

The Temiskaming Shores event begins at the Waterfront Pool and Fitness Centre with Sunday morning registration, a fun warm-up takes place at 9:45 a.m. and then the walk/run sets out at 10 a.m.

There are two-, five- and 10-kilometre routes to chose from.




