"Normally we do cataract surgeries here but there is a big need for glaucoma so that the goal is to get the equipment to help facilitate that."




He expressed thanks to the New Liskeard Lions Club for the donation.

He added that "donations like this help us to try to bring new procedures, but also helps in keeping things local for the community."





Cobalt backs NORDS program

COBALT – The town of Cobalt is strongly urging the government of Ontario to make the NORDS program a permanent fixture to support northern municipalities.

As well, council passed a resolution at its September 16 meeting calling for the province to consider expanding the Northern Ontario Resource Development Support (NORDS) program eligibility to recognize the significant impact that agricultural equipment and operations have on municipal infrastruc-

ture, particularly in rural communities.

The motion was passed after a letter of support from North Bay was received by

This letter says the program has been well-received and has allowed municipalities, such as North Bay, to strategically accumulate multi-year allocations in order to support large-scale infrastructure initiatives critical to community development and economic growth. Modern, safe, and efficient infrastructure is needed to support economic growth and industrial competitiveness, it says.

However, the price tag on some of these projects requires funding from multiple programs such as NORDS and the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund (OCIF). It cites a road widening project, including a signalized intersection, as an example, calling it a critical continuation of the intersection improvement at Highway 11/17.

The Cobalt motion says it also needs to strategically accumulate multi-year allocations in order to support larger-scale infrastructure initiatives critical to community development and economic growth.

Osteoporosis and Bone Mineral Density Testing

Osteoporosis is a condition that causes bones to become thin and porous, decreasing bone strength and leading to broken bones, especially the hip, spine, wrist and shoulder. Osteoporosis is sometimes confused with osteoarthritis. Just to be clear, osteoporosis is a bone disease and osteoarthritis is a disease of the joints and surrounding tissue.

Fast Facts:

- Osteoporosis can strike at any age and affects both men and women
- Building strong bones during childhood and adolescence can be the best defence against developing osteoporosis later in life
- Both men and women begin to lose bone in their mid 30s.
 As they approach menopause, women lose bone at a greater rate, from 2-3% per year
- At least 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will suffer from an osteoporotic fracture during their lifetime
- Over 80% of all fractures in people 50+ are caused by osteoporosis

Testing

Bone Mineral Density (BMD) testing is very important. This test is safe, painless and accurately measures the density of your bones. A BMD test can tell you whether or not you have osteoporosis and how likely you are to develop it in the future. It can help you to make decisions that may prevent fractures or further bone loss.

Who Should Get a BMD test?

- all women and men 65 years or older
- postmenopausal women and men 50-64 with risk factors for fracture including:
- low bone mass identified on x-ray
- parental hip fracture
- high alcohol intake
- current smoker
- low body weight, i.e. less than 132 lbs or 60 kg
- rheumatoid arthritis
- younger men or women (under 50) with a disease or condition associated with low bone mass or bone loss:
- high risk medication (steroid use, aromatase inhibitors, androgen deprivation therapy)
- uncontrolled hyperthyroidism
- early menopause (younger than 45)

In less than one year the Canada. Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) has gone on strike twice here and across

They walked off the job last week to protest the government announcement that letter carrier mail would be eliminated, some rural post offices would be closed and more mail will be sent via land rather than air.

With Amazon and e-transfer technology, how many people use the post office is a question on the minds of

The government said they cannot justify Canada Post losing upwards of \$10 million per day and no one should accept that as a business model.

Canada Post workers, un-

like Air Canada workers, have not fallen far behind in wage benefits. The government offered a 14 per cent raise over four years but CUPW wants 19 per cent over the same time frame.

Postal workers are in a tough spot when it comes to justifying home mail delivery, which amounts to just 25 per cent of the population receiving such a service.

The national president of CUPW went on record as saying he was appalled at how the government is attacking Canada Post and its workers.


It has been said that many small businesses rely on Canada Post, what are they to do without delivery service?

It is a difficult situation to be in, but hopefully it will work out that the management of the post office improves the Crown corporation to ensure profitability and save jobs.







1. WHAT CAN I EXPECT DURING THE PROCEDURE?
