\$33 million budget proposed for Temiskaming Shores

TEMISKAMING SHORES - City council was presented with various scenarios for a \$33 million municipal budget during its special Committee of the Whole meeting on November 19.

Based on the presentation by treasurer Stephanie Leveille, a home assessed at \$193.000 could see a total tax bill increase ranging from \$52 to \$149, depending on whether council approves a levy increase between zero to four per cent. Even if council freezes the levy at last year's rates, there will be a four per cent increase in water/ wastewater rates which alone would mean an extra \$52 on the median

"For 2026, the City is proposing a total combined budget close to \$33 million, representing minimal net change in general operations, a three per cent increase in environmental operations, and capital expenditures that are just over three times higher than in 2025," Leveille said in her presentation to council.

"While the increase in capital spending appears significant, it is primarily driven by three major projects, of approximately 92 per cent are funded through external sources. These projects reflect the City's continued success in leveraging funding programs to support housing-enabling infrastructure and strategic community investment."

The capital budget, she said, continues to

prioritize infrastructure renewal and housing-enabling projects "that position the city for long-term growth."

"In 2026, 40 per cent of the total municipal budget is dedicated to capital investment - an increase of approxi-\$8.8 million mately over the previous year as the City moves forward with several major housing-enabling and other priority projects. Approximately 75 per cent of the 2026 capital program is funded through government grants, partnerships, and donations, with the remaining balance supported by reserves and the tax levy."

Capital projects budgeted include \$1.6 million for Dawson Point and Peters Road, with the city responsible for about \$615,500. Work on the second phase of Golf Course Road

bridge is also budgeted at \$750,000, with the municipal cost \$50,000. The budget also proposes \$1 million to improve pool/fitness centre energy efficiency, with the municipal share forecast for \$204,000.

Replacement of the Don Shepherdson Memorial Arena roof is also budgeted for \$764,000, with the city's share projected to be \$182,000.

"In summary, the preliminary 2026 budget reflects a balanced approach - maintaining service levels, advancing housing-enabling infrastructure, and managing inflationary pressures through careful prioritization and strategic use of external funding," Leveille said.

City council will continue deliberations before the budget is finalized.

A review by the Pan American Health Organization and

the World Health Organization has deemed the measles virus has regained a foothold in Canada.

1998, when Canada eliminated measles, that the disease is now circulating enough that we have lost this important designation.

The WHO has said that vaccine hesitancy is to blame for eroding one of public health's greatest triumphs - control of the measles virus.

While many of us trust the science surrounding vaccines mass immunization, and there are too many who have stopped trusting it.

The online influencers who peddle anti-vaccine propaganda have helped to erode public confidence in immunization programs.

This should be of concern to all Canadians as measles is not a harmless childhood illness.

It can and does kill.


Misinformation about the effectiveness of vaccines is a public health threat in its own right.



It wasn't even the deadliest time of year, the winter months when the highways are ice and snow covered and you literally take your life in your hands leaving the re-

I tip my hat to Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP John Vanthof, who recently stood up in the legislature asking the provincial government to do something about the dangers of Highways 11 and 17.

What if we move Queen's Park to Timmins and have the premier and the MPPs drive up Highway 11 to see for themselves the dangers of our roadways?

These aren't roadways we can avoid travel on either, they are the main arteries in and out of the north.

It feels like there is a serious accident on our highway between North Bay and the Tri-Towns on a daily basis, which means the only route in and out of the north becomes blocked.

And people are being seriously injured and killed in these incidents.

I daresay, if the people of Southern Ontario had to risk their lives like we do on their roadways, things would

The lives of northerners matter and it's long overdue that the Ford government take the unsafe condition of our roads and the heavy traffic seriously.

Carney wants a build project, how about four-laning Highway 11?

Highway 11 can be a death trap and it needs better winter maintenance, truck drivers who are licensed properly, more passing lanes and rest areas and lower speed limits.

Crohn's and Colitis Awareness

Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis are diseases that inflame the lining of the gastrointestinal tract and disrupt your body's ability to digest food, absorb nutrition and eliminate waste in a healthy way. One in every 150 Canadians is living with Crohn's or colitis. What causes Crohn's and Colitis?

The causes are not well understood. Diet and stress may aggravate the disease, but they do not cause the disease on their own. Currently, it is believed that a genetic tendency and a trigger in the environment combined set off inflammation in the gut. The chronic (life-long) result is Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis.

What are the symptoms?

- Abdominal pain, cramping, gas
- Bloating
- Diarrhea (possibly bloody)
- Rectal bleeding
- Nausea and vomiting
- Reduced appetite and weight loss
- Fever
- Anemia
- Fatigue

- Crohn's and colitis can be diagnosed at any age, but people are more often diagnosed before the age of 30.
- The number of new cases of Crohn's disease in Canadian children has almost doubled since 1995.
- Males and females are equally affected.
- Crohn's and colitis can affect any race or ethnic group
- There is no special diet for people with Crohn's or colitis.

It's not always possible to tell from symptoms alone whether you have Crohn's disease or colitis. That's why it's important to visit your health care provider for a diagnosis. If you're experiencing symptoms and think you may have Crohn's or colitis, schedule an appointment with your health care provider to find out for sure.







ORIGINS

was, but we never thought that just a few months later my mother would be diagnosed with cancer herself," said Melissa Major.

"She was diagnosed on February 4, she turned 63 on February 11. She left us on February 14. This year's auction definitely brings up a lot of emotions. My husband and children have gifted me a Cubs Hockey Fights Cancer jersey with MOM and 2025 the year my mom passed away on the back of the jersey in her memory. I will be wearing the jersey to the games and invite others to wear purple as well."

Major also encourages people to find out more about the services offered by the Community Cancer Care program by visiting their website.

Last year the fundraiser scored \$7,165 for the program and this year the Cubs are hoping to match or exceed that goal.

"I am really hoping that we can match or surpass last year's amount raised," said Major in an email interview.
