Rock Walk feature reflects on Laurentian Glacier

TEMISKAMING SHORES - There is a new exhibit in the Rock Walk Park on the grounds of the Haileybury campus of Northern College.

The new exhibit is a small version of an existing moraine on the south side of the West Road running out of Haileybury toward Highway 11.

The moraine has provided geologists with evidence of the passage of a glacier 20,000 years ago, which carved its way from northeastern Quebec over the Val d'Or area and to the Haileybury waterfront and up over Haileybury.

Graham Gambles, a local geology enthusiast, has managed the Rock Walk Park since its beginning along with the help of people like Mike Werner and Haileybury college campus manager Tammy Mackey. Gambles has created a feature which helps people visualize what happened in the Hailey-

The project has been supported with a \$3,000 grant from the Temiskaming Foundation.

Gambles, working on the site on a bright, midfall afternoon, stopped to explain the project.

He said that he first became aware of the Laurentian Glacier's impact on Haileybury through the guidance of his 1970s Haileybury School of Mines instructor Dan Atchison who took his class to the college's upper floor and had them look northeast across Lake Temiskaming to the narrows leading to Notre-Dame-du-Nord in neighbouring Quebec.

That was the path of the glacier whose passage from the northeast to the southwest impacted Haileybury and is now depicted in a small bed of sand and rocks located in the park.

Miles of ice had built up and was flowing from the northeast to the southwest.

"It had come across through Quebec and

bury area 20,000 years was pushing everything ahead of it that it could pick up, which was mostly stones. Every now and again we find a big boulder such as a huge erratic," said Gambles.

HITTING HAILEYBURY

The glacier hit soft limestone at the waterfront and then hit hard limestone as it progressed up the hill.

"When it hit it was going at a fair speed and a fair amount of strength."

The limestone along the waterfront was soft, deposited 150,000 years ago, but the glacier had little impact on Devil's Rock, which has a hard quartzite base, explained Gambles.

Another glacier came along 5,000 years later but it was travelling mainly from Hudson's Bay southward. The ridge to the south of the West Road angles in a southwest direction. showing that it was laid down by a different glacier - the one that had come out of the northwest 20,000 years ago, explained Gambles.

Gambles said the Ma-

tabanick Trail, used by First Nations people, runs through that area and he speculates that they might have used the mound the Laurentian Glacier created to avoid walking through the gully along its edge.

The glacier that followed came along 5,000 years after and wiped out most of the evidence of the passage of the Laurentian Glacier, but this mound by the West Road survived, Gambles explained.

The geological features of the area are evident to the trained eye and include features such as the boulder pavement at Devil's Rock, the limestone deposit on top of the bedrock exposed on the side of Lakeshore Road at the driveway of John's Tackle Box, and even just the fact that there is limestone in the area at all which shows that Canada was once further south in a warmer climate where that could occur.

with time.

That's why it was such an honour and a privilege to have written stories for our anthology Survivor Diaries, a collection of compelling stories told to us by our men and women veterans living in this region at the time of publication by The Temiskaming Speaker.

It was mind boggling to me that the female war veterans, a great many from Englehart, were shy to tell their wartime stories.

They believed they were not important but when those stories spilled out they were fascinating.

Women enlisted in the Canadian Armed Forces serving as truck drivers, secret agents, meteorologists, parachute packers and so on.

When I interviewed those women they did not have the medals their male counterparts had on their uniforms

and I think that is a narrative that needs changing.

I regret the fact I did not get to interview my uncles, the five Smith brothers from Cobalt - Alfred, Eric, Eddy, Gordon and Douglas - who enlisted and served their country.

Two of those brothers were sent overseas in tours of duty suffering massive injuries. Gordon broke his back in the war and was sent home to convalesce, Eric was badly injured during his tours of duty in Africa, Italy and then in the Korean War.

Perhaps the physical scars will never reveal the emotional scars of the war as men and women returning from the front lines had at that time a condition referred to as being "shell shocked." The modern term we use is they suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder or PTSD.

What makes me so proud

of my uncles is the fact their group photo currently hangs in the Branch 44 Legion in Cobalt, serving as a visual reminder of their sacrifices and bravery.


Moored like a boat, a port in a storm, the Legion has stood tall for its veterans.

When our veterans returned home after the war, they were literally dumped on the streets of Canada with little or no support and no jobs.

The Legion was then formed to advocate for government services and benefits for our veterans.

Today the Legion continues to provide support to our veterans, promote Remembrance Day ceremonies and serve the community.

All our Legion branches in this region encourage people to mark Remembrance Day 2025 on Tuesday, November 11.

Symptoms of pancreatic cancer

Pancreatic cancer may not cause any signs or symptoms in its early stages. Signs and symptoms often appear as the tumor grows and causes changes in the body. Other health conditions can cause the same symptoms as pancreatic cancer.

See your health care provider if you have these signs or symptoms:

- vellowing of the skin and the whites of the eyes (called jaundice)
- pain in the upper abdomen or upper back
- fatty stools that are light colored, bulky and float in the toilet
- unexplained weight loss
- loss of appetite
- fatigue
- nausea and vomiting
- indigestion
- feeling full after a small meal
- bloating
- gas
- diarrhea or constipation
- itching
- dark urine
- fever and shivering
- swelling of the legs



These infections are usually caused by viruses (germs) like COVID-19, Influenza, RSV, and colds. Other germs such as bacteria can cause infections in the lungs (pneumonia).
