TEMISKAMING SHORES - The Algonquin Regiment Memorial Beach Park may once again have a food concession this summer, with the city of Temiskaming Shores providing space near the centre ball diamond.

A city bylaw has been proposed to lease concession space at the park from June 1 to Sept. 30. During Temiskaming Shores council's recent Committee of the Whole meeting, recreation director Mathew Bahm reported that the city owns multiple outdoor concessions including Farr Park, Dy-

mond Sports Park, at the Spurline and at Hailybury Beach. "Staff regularly offer these spaces to potential operators through a competitive (bid) process," he said. "Upon receiving community feedback, staff developed a new space for concession operations at Algonquin Beach Park near the New Liskeard

Centre ball diamond. The space is suitable for a food truck operation, similar to the successful operation at Farr Park." If approved, this will mark the return of food and drink at the beach park for the first time in decades, since the former shoreline concession stand near the pavilion. *Continued on Page 6.*

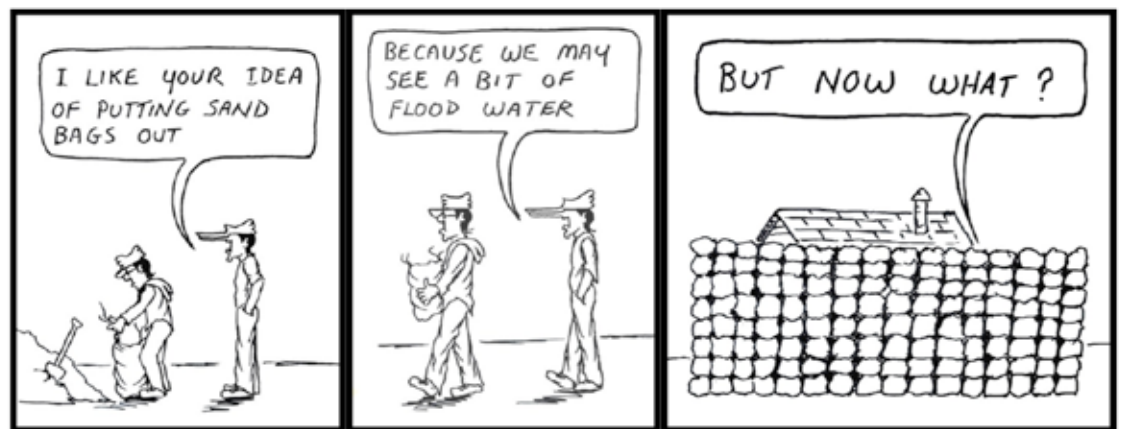

# Road trauma

I got brave and took a drive to North Bay recently.

I could not help but be a little paranoid during the trip seeing all those 18 wheelers on the road passing me on corners, on double lines and with great speed.

I thought those trucks had speed governors on them? If they don't, they should, as we know speed kills.

According to Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) data released in March 2026, there were 13 fatal collisions on Highway 11 in Northern Ontario in 2025, resulting in 20 deaths.

For both highways 11 and 17, according to OPP statistics, we know there have been a combined total of 242 deaths between 2020 and 2025.

Isn't it time we start understanding that the deaths we hear about on Highway 11 and 17 involve countless more trauma for individuals and families and the health care system?

The number of deaths on

our highways doesn't tell the entire story of the numbers injured. For every death on our roads there are many serious injuries that require hospitalization, often involving intensive care units.

Those people may have internal bleeding, brain injuries or broken bones.

I think we need a Major Trauma Audit that collects data on severely injured patients and the costs to the individual in terms of recovery time, lost wages and the costs to the health care system overall.

I think that data would be staggering to be quite honest.

We are underestimating the true impact of our dangerous roads. It is not just deaths, it's injuries that are flying below the radar when we speak about road safety.

And how about the trauma experienced by our EMS workers, police and fire departments who are first responders on the scene?

How many lost days of work

have they encountered, not to mention the ugly things they have seen when attending to mishaps?

Let's not accept danger on our roads as inevitable. We need to improve enforcement on our roads, we need more speed cameras not fewer Premier Doug Ford, better trained drivers, more truck inspections and we need to change our attitude about road safety.

When is the trucking industry overall going to take responsibility for what is happening on our roads?

Demanding accountability and holding our government to account for making our roads safer is a matter of dire urgency that our MPP, John Vanthof, has been working on for years now.

And he's done good work for us all at Queen's Park on the subject of road safety.

Thank you!

I for one am sick of driving white-knuckled on Highway 11.

The city currently has existing agreements with operators at Farr Park and at the Spurline building, but the concession spaces at the Haileybury Beach, Algonquin Beach Park and Dymond Sports Park were put up for bid.

"An agreement with the Dymond Dugout was completed and signed by the Di-

rector of Recreation on behalf of the City," Bahm said in his written report. The three-year deal will see classic concession foods and drinks offered primarily during ball games.

A draft bylaw has been pre-

pared for council's consideration for a two-year contract with a vendor for the park.

"The location at Algonquin Beach Park is newly created and has been modelled from the success at Farr Park," Bahm

said in his report to council.

"Northern Fields will provide service to the various ball diamond users who attend games at the park and the numerous members of the public who frequent this

area throughout the day."

Northern Fields is a Northern Ontario-based artisan food business focusing on herb-inspired products.

# MP announces summer jobs funding

NORTH BAY (Staff) – Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Pauline Rochefort has announced funding for the Summer Jobs Program for students aged 15-30 in her riding.

“This funding means more students can find paid work close to home this summer,” said Rochefort in a news release.

For the riding it means \$1.6 million for summer student employment: \$621,700 in Timiskaming and \$985,000 in Nipissing.

“The Canada Summer Jobs program is supporting 382 positions across Nipissing and Timiskaming, with 125 local employers taking part,”

said the MP. “For students, it is a chance to build skills and earn an income. For community organizations and small businesses, it helps meet real staffing needs during a busy season,” said Rochefort, who’s also the Parliamentary Secretary to the Secretary of State (Rural Development).

Patty Hajdu, Minister of Jobs and Families and Minister responsible for the Federal Economic Development Agency for Northern Ontario, announced the launch of the hiring period for Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) 2026. From now until July 20, young job seekers from across Canada

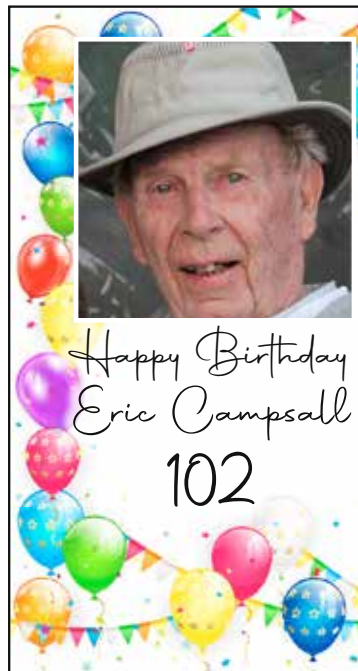
can find local job opportunities on the Job Bank website and mobile app.

“This summer, more work opportunities will be available program-wide compared to last year,” said Rochefort.

“Up to 100,000 CSJ open-

ings will be available in Canada for young people between the ages of 15 and 30. Youth can apply for summer jobs in fields that interest them, such as the recreation sector, the food industry, marketing or tourism. Jobs are also available in high-demand and

growing fields, including construction, and in fields related to environmental protection, technology and digital skills. Youth are encouraged to check Job Bank regularly for updates and to share exciting job opportunities with their friends.”

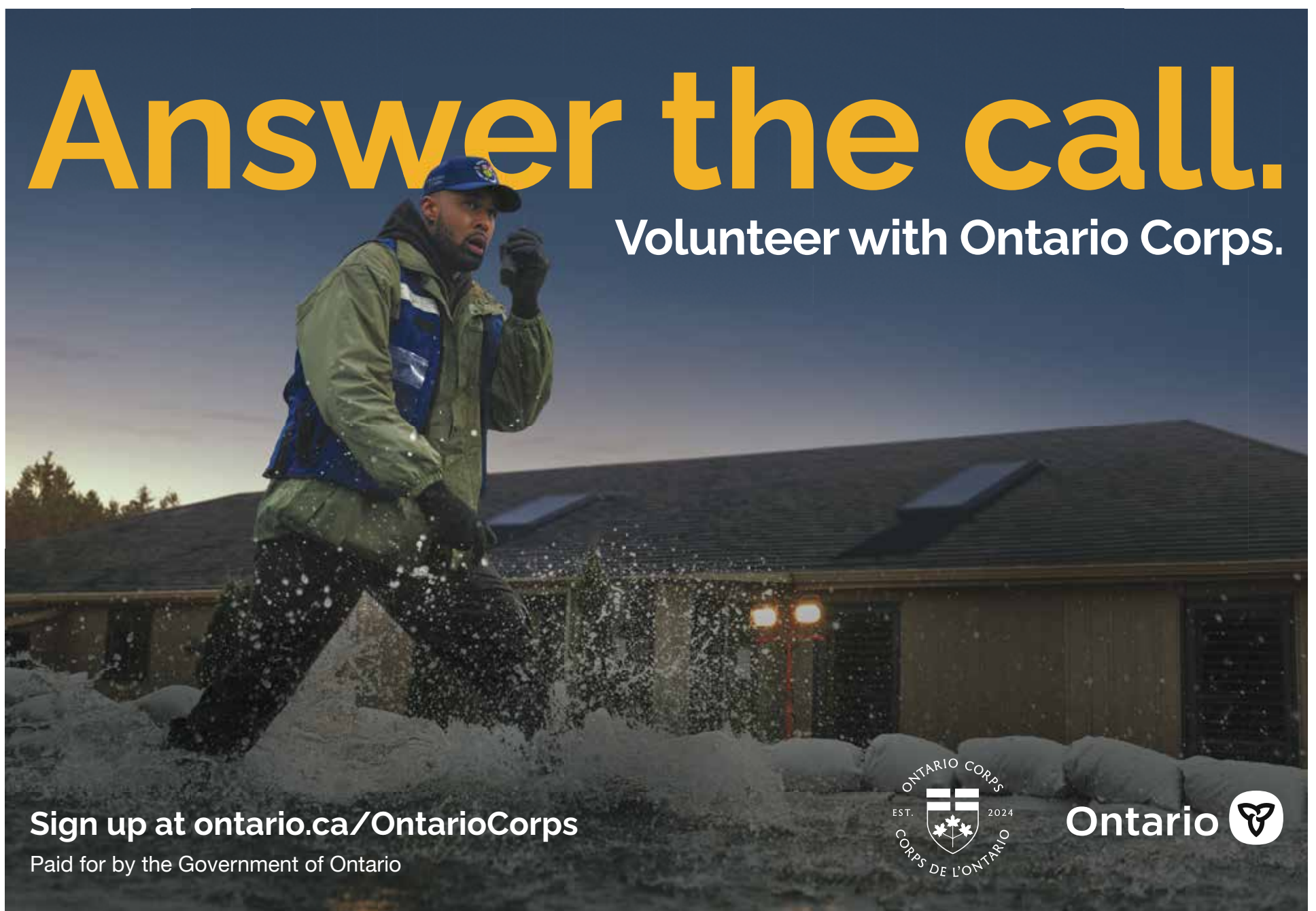

**James Morgan Grant**  
**September 9, 1945 –**  
**May 7, 2026**

Jim, known as Jimmy to family and friends, passed away peacefully at Temiskaming Hospital on May 7, with family by his side. He was 80 years old.

He will be deeply missed by his son Jason (Allisha, Gabe and Drew), his daughter Jennifer (Luke, Kate) and his grandson Will, who brought a sparkle to Grandpa’s eye. Jim also leaves behind a clan of brothers and sisters, cousins, nephews, nieces, and friends.

Born in New Liskeard to John and Gertrude (Newton) Grant, Jim was the second of 10 siblings and carried the humble values and strong work ethic of his father. A determined athlete, Jim was known for his aggression on the ice, making a defensive difference for the New Liskeard Cubs and the Kirkland Lake Legion Hockey Club, which won the 1964 All-Ontario Juvenile Championship. Jim played varsity alongside Hall of Famer Tony Esposito with the Huskies at Michigan Tech. These years produced legendary stories that be-

came part of Grant family lore. It was also during this time that Jim’s sister introduced him to her nursing school roommate, Marlene. Jim and Marlene soon married and began their family. They were married for more than 30 years.

After helping manage the family businesses after his father’s death, Jim took over JM Grant Contractors Ltd., a flourishing employer that constructed roads, bridges and highways throughout Northeastern Ontario.

In the early ‘90s, Jim travelled between the Fort Lauderdale Intracoastal and his cottage in Bala, Ont. Jim filled those years hosting friends and family, touring boats along the Atlantic coast and the Muskoka lakes and riding his motorcycle from Ontario’s rock cuts down to the Florida Keys on U.S. Route 1.

Jim returned to New Liskeard to co-own another family business, Grant’s Transport, dedicating his life to his work, his cottage, and his family.

Jim will be remembered for his crushing handshake and unwavering sweet tooth. He was proud of his community and generous in ways that left a mark. He supplied equipment for development of the New Liskeard Golf Course and Tri-Town Ski Village, provided rubberized asphalt for the ESSM school track, bid on steers at the Fall Fair, and coached his son’s minor hockey team, among other charitable acts.

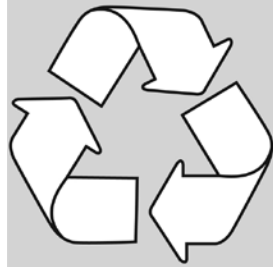

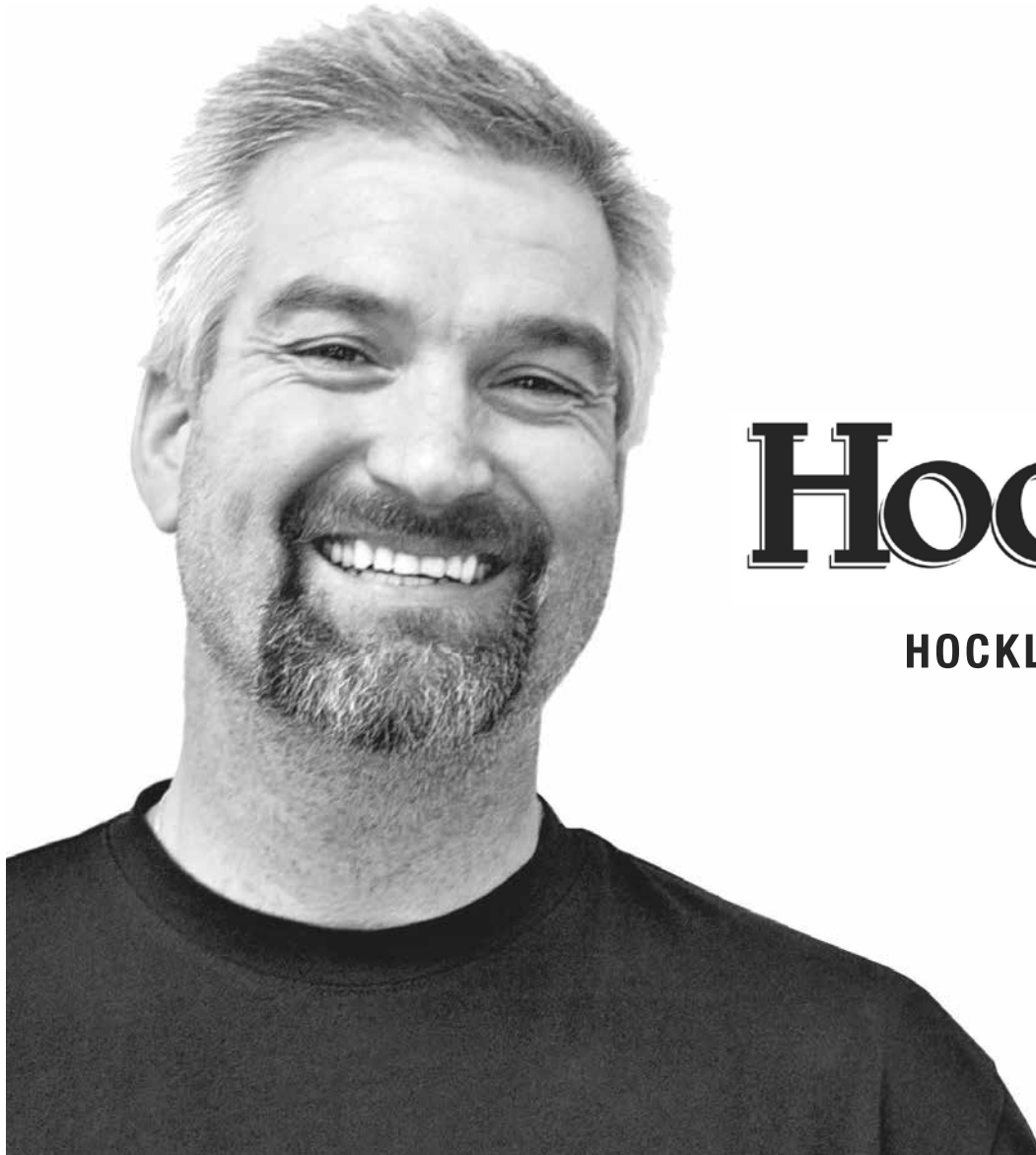
