## Coleman hears breakdown of FoodCycler program benefits

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP — Coleman Township heard a presentation about the municipality's FoodCycler program at the April 27 council meeting, which touted the benefits of the program to Coleman.

FoodCycler program manager Brittany Clarke, through a Zoom link, explained to the township the benefits of the recycling food waste program.

The township began its food waste diversion pilot program in January of 2025.

"It was very impressive," said Mayor Dan Cleroux in a telephone interview after the meeting.

"So now we have to discuss it as a council, do we want to continue with this particular program with the same costs as before. We will put something on our website to find out if there is interest, if we can get the same amount of people let's go for it."

The mayor said the FoodCycler he and his

wife are using provides nutrient material used in their gardens.

The program is a municipal pilot program, a 12-week initiative where residents purchase a subsidized in-home electric food waste recycler to dry and grind food scraps into nutrient-rich, odour-free soil amendment.

The program reduces food waste going to a municipal landfill by up to 90 per cent leading to less greenhouse gas emissions, less trips to the landfill and the kicker - an extended life for municipal landfills.

Clarke said Coleman township FoodCycler users diverted 78 kilograms per household, equalling 766 garbage bags, from their landfill.

### HIGH APPROVAL

The company then sent out a survey to FoodCycler users in the township with an approval rating of 4.5 out of 5 from the users.

The survey also indicated the households were 100 per cent in favour of continuing to use the FoodCycler units at their homes.

"We would like to build on your success and a community-wide solution is to have 25 per cent of households in the township, which equals 50 homes, using the FoodCycler."

She recommended Coleman Township take the next step which is Phase One of the program to continue to use the food recycling program.

She said if the municipality continued with the program they would absorb the costs of the units, which range in price from \$150 to \$200.

"You have seen good results, the Phase One would see more units deployed in homes and then we would do a 12-week survey to determine the program's effectiveness," said Clarke.

She mentioned the carbon refills needed for the units could be purchased in bulk saving users money. And also access to high quality carbon filters reduces food odours.

She maintained the company would provide 24 hour staff support including trouble shooting with a five year warranty on the units, which could drive up participation rates in the township.

The FoodCycler units are used by 200 municipalities across Canada, with 100 in Ontario alone.

"To maximize landfill diversion you need to plan ahead, Phase One would be the next step for the township," said Clarke.

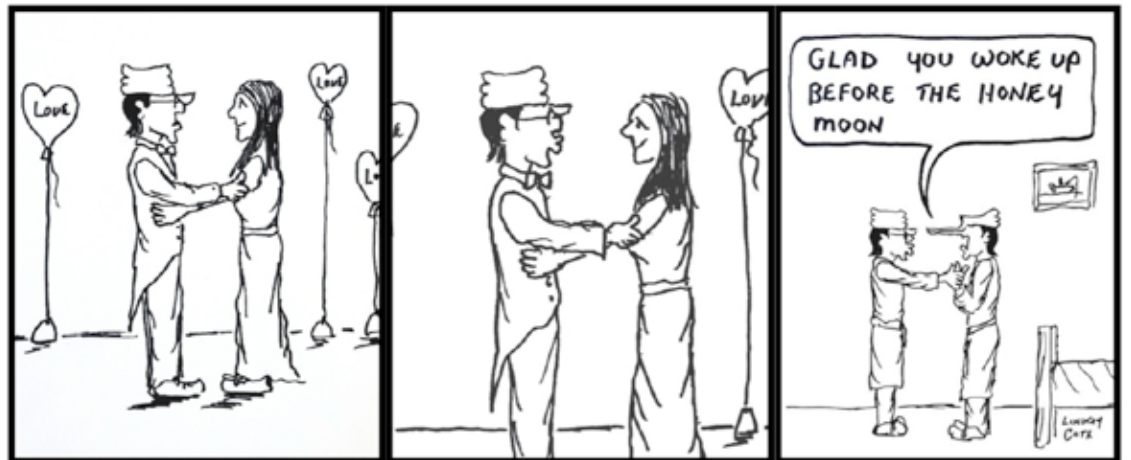

She was the foundation upon which our family was built, solid as a rock.

Lena was one of the most resilient people I know having survived several major health scares in her lifetime. But she bounced back each time with such a positive attitude on life.

### Step into Spring! Walking for health

With the anticipation of warmer weather arriving, many of us are looking to get outside and walk more. The health benefits of walking are endless, and experts agree that by adding walking to your routine, you can improve not only your physical health, but your mental health as well!

The key is to walk, ideally, for at least 30 minutes per day. Walking has tremendous benefits, from supporting a healthy immune system to boosting your metabolism to strengthening your joints, muscles, and bones. It's also amazing for stress relief!

1. Walking will improve your mood  
Research shows that just 10 minutes of walking can lift your spirits. It will help you burn calories and maintain a healthy weight
2. Regular walking can help reduce belly fat and, as a result, improve your body's response to insulin. Daily walking increases metabolism by burning extra calories and by preventing muscle loss, which is especially important as we get older.
3. Walking can alleviate joint pain  
Contrary to what you might think, walking can help improve your range of motion and mobility because it helps strengthen the muscles surrounding your joints. Research shows that walking for at least 10 minutes a day, or about an hour every week, can reduce arthritis pain in older adults.

# Latchford council seeking high resolution photos for new website

LATCHFORD — Municipalities are increasingly offering services online and information for their residents via websites.

Latchford council met April 14 to approve the purchase of a new municipal website provider, using the Govstack

CMS platform, at a one time cost of \$13,190 and an annual subscription fee of \$4,697.

Latchford CAO and clerk treasurer Malorie Robinson said staff will be busy in the coming weeks and months uploading content to the website.

She is looking for high-resolution photos of the town for residents to share for the website.

The purpose of the new

and upgraded website is to improve communication, service delivery and resident engagement.

Robinson noted in a staff report that the Town of Latchford had limited digital capacity to provide residents with timely information, online services and centralized communication.

She said Govstack is a platform designed specifically for municipalities with content

tools such as event calendars, alerts and online forms.

The estimated time to have the new website up and functioning is four months from the time of kick-off.

The new website is also going to make the job of staff more efficient due to reduced phone and in-person inquiries, a streamlined internal work flow and centralized information management.

The Govstack website will

allow staff to maintain Latchford's site internally without ongoing reliance on external developers.

Council unanimously approved the Govstack website application for service.

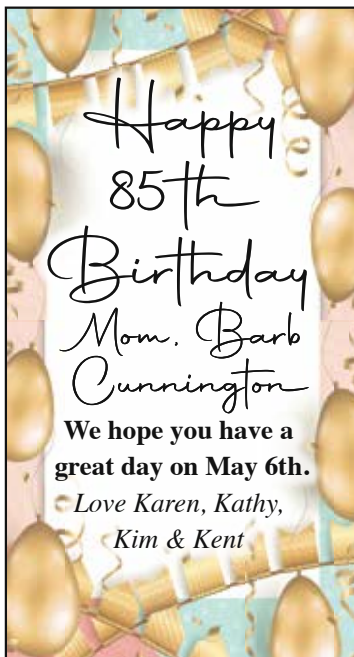

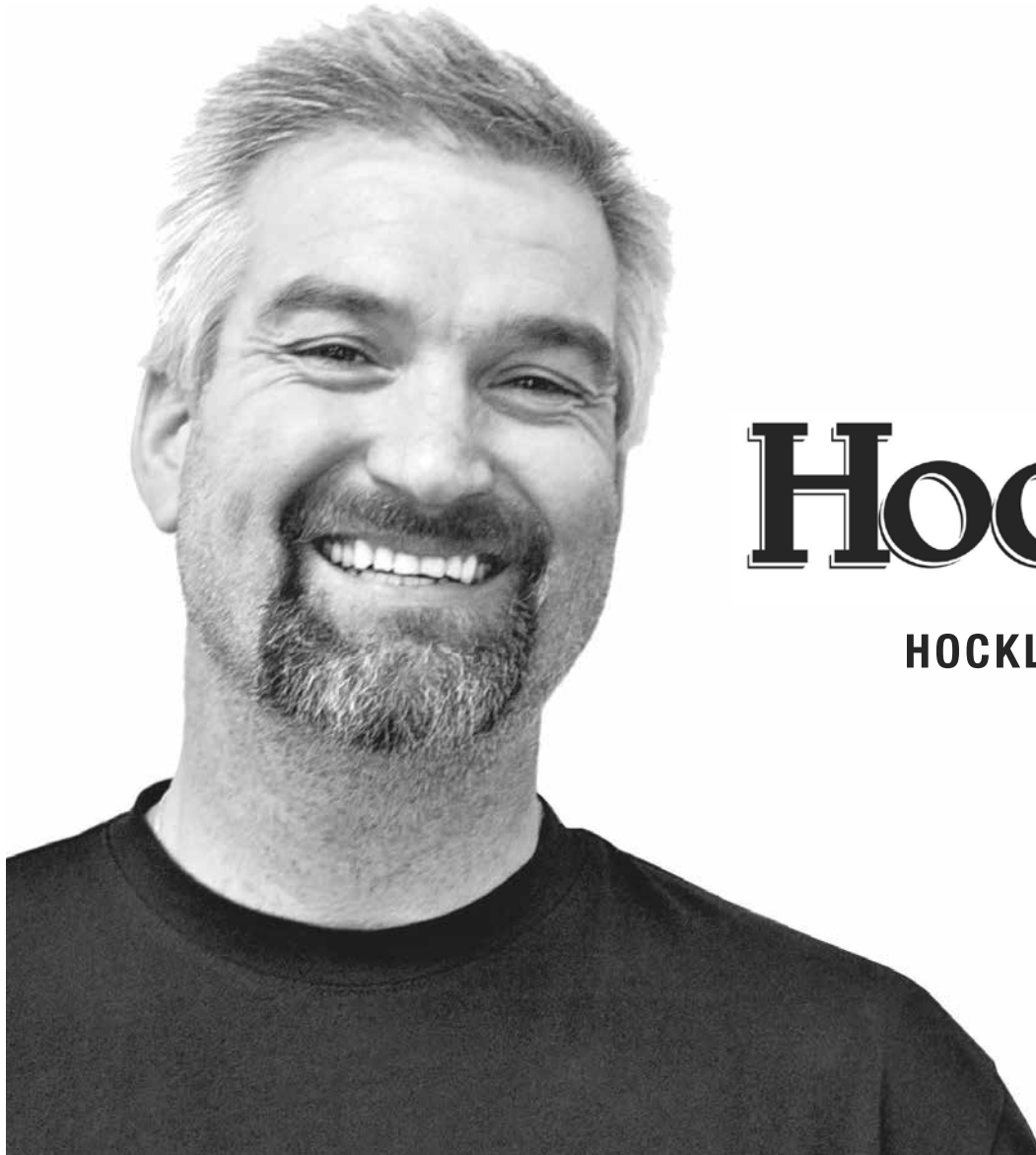
