City ponders dilemma of declining commercial space

TEMISKAMING SHORES - Sacrificing empty commercial space to allow for needed housing developments is a conundrum on the minds of Temiskaming Shores city councillors, as they consider a request to convert a disused former storefront in downtown Haileybury into apartments.

During council's Committee of the Whole meeting June 2, a proposed zoning amendment was tabled to convert property at 517 Ferguson Avenue in Haileybury into residential space. The owners are proposing to convert the bottom floor into two apartment units to complement two existing upstairs apartments. The property is located near the intersection of Ferguson Avenue and Browning Street, and neighbours the Leisure

Inn on its south side.

Council was told the vacant ground-floor space is still zoned for commercial use, although no businesses have been located there for many years.

Temiskaming Shores Councillor Mark Wilson noted there is a trend across the province where "brick and mortar stores are becoming less and less common" especially with the advent of online shopping. While not necessarily opposed to this specific request, Wilson said the municipality should give some thought to the potential impact "if all our downtown commercial spaces become residential," he said.

"I don't disagree that we need more housing and we need more apartments. I'm just thinking it's a concern when we look at our downtown core, are we taking space business could operate in? But then on the other hand, I understand that it's very difficult for those



businesses to operate in an environment with online shopping and all those kind of things."

Councillor Melanie Ducharme said she shares Wilson's concern, suggesting it has "gone quite badly for downtown cores" without enough commercial space to make the collective business community viable.

"I'm just trying to wrap my head around, sort of sacrificing this commercial building to residential, when we could end up with a really hard decision in the downtown core, where there just isn't enough

commercial space," she said.

Ben Krul, the city's director of community development, said the property owners have indicated "there is no demand" for the commercial space, but there is a demand for housing. He also noted there has been no public feedback on the proposal after official notices were posted inviting comment.

Acting Mayor Danny Whalen said city officials will now prepare a report on the request for consideration at an upcoming meeting of council.

Armstrong working on zoning by-law modernization

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP – With the objective of making its zoning by-law easier for staff, council and the public to read and understand, Armstrong Township staff and council, with the assistance of the township’s planner, are undertaking a modernization of the zoning by-law this summer.

The project is being carried out in-house to save an estimated \$60,000 to \$100,000 in consultant fees, explained chief administrative officer Dan Thibeault to council at the May 20 meeting of Armstrong Township council.

He explained that “the overall goal of the modernization project is to create a clearer, easier-to-use zoning by-law that better reflects current development patterns, reduces the need for minor zoning amendments, and improves consistency for staff, council and residents.”

A phased-in approach is being taken over the summer so that council members will be able to review the work in sections, Thibeault also explained, noting the size and complexity of the zoning by-law.

“We are hoping you could look at suggestions and see if there is anything that should not be permitted,” he told council. He asked council to also flag any “really contentious stuff that might jump out.”

Topics which will be re-

viewed will include: additional dwelling units, storage on vacant lots, driveway requirements, storage containers, setbacks, building heights, lot coverage, and other zoning standards.

The objective is to have the process completed by Sep-

tember, with the public also being given a chance to review the changes before the updated zoning by-law is adopted.

Council gave its approval to the process for “staff to continue working with the township planner to consolidate

council feedback into a final draft zoning by-law for future public consultation and adoption.”

Council initiated the process with a direction to staff in 2025 “to proceed with a comprehensive review and modernization of the town-

ship’s zoning by-law, address changing provincial planning requirements, simplify administration, and reduce the number of zoning amendment applications required from residents and businesses.”

AEDs save lives

With more and more people adopting active lifestyles, having Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) units in place around communities is

a wise idea. **AED units save lives.**

Because Northern Ontario is geographically huge, response times for ambulances

to get to people experiencing heart attacks are long and having an AED unit located close by in various community spaces is a good safety measure.

AED units should be placed at golf courses, libraries, beaches, churches, sport facilities, businesses, and anywhere people gather.

According to the Heart and Stroke Foundation, 35,000 to 45,000 people die of cardiac

arrest each year in Canada. Every minute counts when it comes to survival rates and

with the help of placing AED units around communities, we can change the number of lives lost from cardiac arrest in our neighbourhoods and in the places we gather.

That's why it is important to have an AED location map for your community and even the region where emergency response ambulance workers, police, fire fighters and average citizens know the location of these units.

Municipal leaders should look at mandating that AED units are prominently dis-

played with uniform signage to ensure they are immediately recognizable.

Then place that registry in as many formats as possible and shared with as many people as possible.

The ability to provide CPR prior to the arrival of a paramedic is crucial to saving lives.

Drama on the lake

Nature can be incredibly beautiful and yet equally cruel.

I was overjoyed to write in last week's column about a loon I saw on my favourite lake protecting her nest and two eggs.

That joy quickly turned into sorrow as I paddled past the nest a couple of nights later and the eggs were gone, the nest was empty.

I heard her wailing and wailing in a distant bay and I felt a sense of sadness overtake me.

When I first saw the nest and eggs at that particular location I had a bad feeling about it.

Three otters live on the northwest side of the lake in an abandoned beaver lodge.

I have come upon them several times and they have growled and hissed at me.

I do believe they love the taste of loon eggs.

And that's where the cruelty of nature comes into play. I thought this was going to be the year the lake would see a successful hatching and raising of the two chicks.

No wonder loon populations are taking a dive as egg predation is a leading cause of loon nest failure.

Now if the pair of loons mate again there may still be time for the chicks to hatch and grow mature feathers so they can fly off this coming fall.

The later in the season loon chicks are hatched, the longer the juveniles have to stay in the north waiting for their feathers to mature.

This week when I spotted the nest, I saw the mother loon's head covered in blackflies. I believe she was forced off the nest because of the flies and this left her eggs vulnerable to predation.

The predators (otters, racoons, eagles, fishers, great blue heron and others) are only following their natural survival instincts.

Higher water levels this spring have challenged loons to find suitable nesting sites on area lakes and with a great deal of the shoreline covered in water, it won't be easy for the loons to nest again.

Loons have been gifting us with their hauntingly beautiful song since the age of the

dinosaurs.

I would love to see loons with sharpened beaks, large claws and the ability to move quickly on land to protect themselves and their nests from predators.

They have so very few natural abilities to protect their nests and the chicks once they are born.

Perhaps they could hire me to be their loony security guard with a large paddle in hand. I would put the run on anything that threatened their safety and security.

It is indeed precious to see brown fuzzy loon chicks riding on momma's back on a northern lake.

A loon nest raid is a heart-breaking reality I have become all too familiar with.

Hot Weather Safety for Physical Activity

We look forward to this time of year, but too much heat is not good for anyone. It can be riskier as we get older. When we are active, our muscles produce heat. This causes a rise in body temperature.

Our bodies do two things to manage the increase in body heat:

- Our heart rate increases to help deliver blood to the surface of the skin for heat release
- We start to sweat, which helps with cooling

Both of these functions are reduced as we get older. That raises the risk of heat-related illness when we are physically active in the heat, either outdoors or in hot conditions indoors.

Heat-related illness includes cramps, dizziness, edema (water retention and swelling) and exhaustion. There is also a more severe condition known as heat stroke.

Should we stop being active when it gets hot?

Older Canadians do tend to be less active when the weather gets hot and humid. But it is important to stay physically active all year round. In fact, older adults who are more physically fit can adapt better during exercise in the heat.

Hot weather tips

- Older adults should not participate in strenuous physical activities in hot/humid conditions outdoors, especially if they are not used to the conditions or are not used to being physically active.
- Take it easier when you exercise and be active during the cooler times of the day -- early morning or late evening, if you are not able to be active in an air-conditioned environment.
- Wear loose fitting, lightweight, moisture-wicking clothing. Cotton clothing can be cooler.
- Stay hydrated. As we get older, we do not notice thirst as much. That increases the risk for dehydration. Don't wait until you feel thirsty. Drink lots of fluids, especially during exercise.

If you are taking medication or have a health condition, ask your doctor or pharmacist if it increases your health risk in the heat and follow their recommendations.

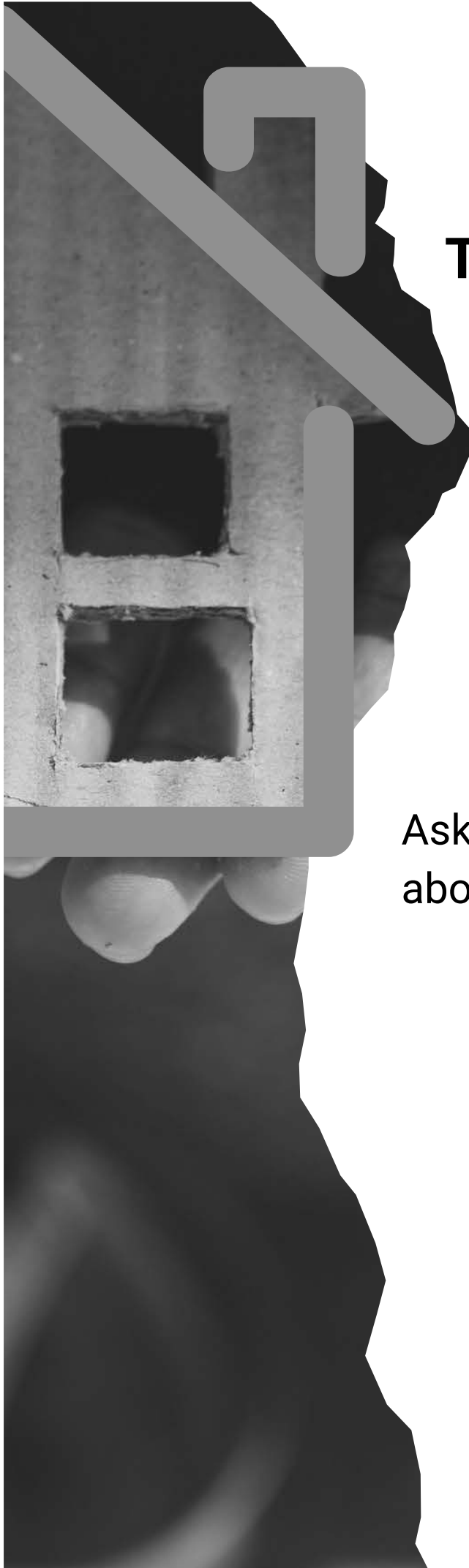

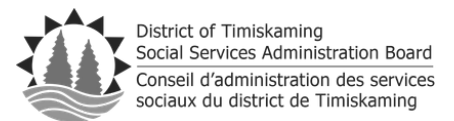

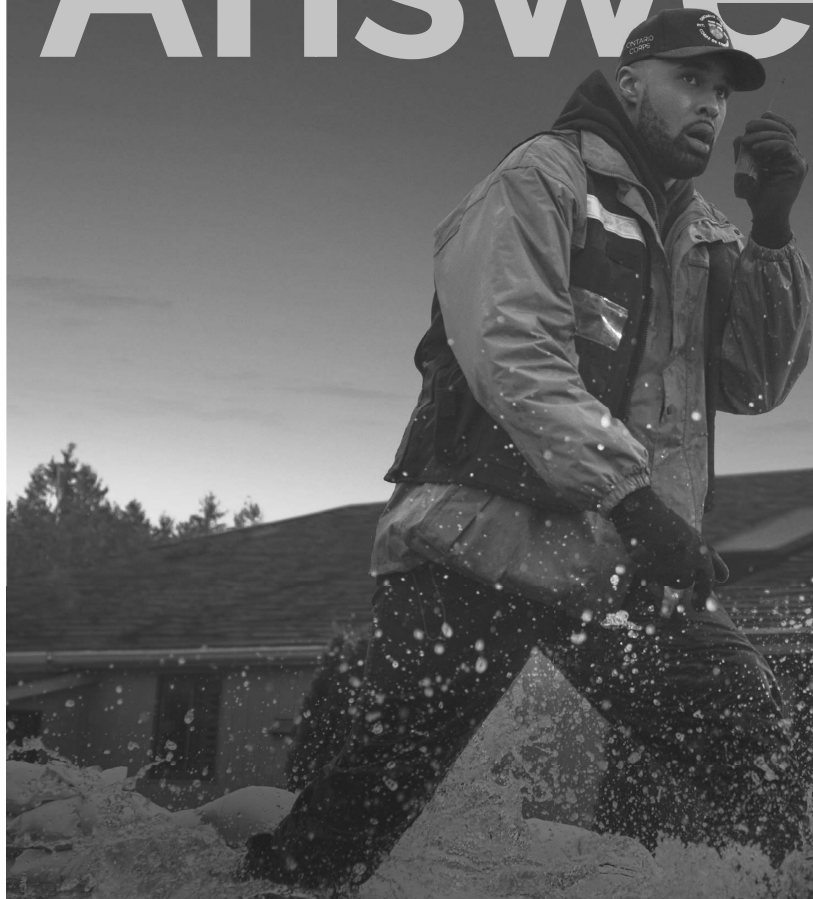
