Concerned Citizens ask Coleman for action on refinery property

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP— The Citizens for a Clean Coleman Township (CCCT) group, which is lobbying for a cleanup of the former Cobalt Refinery property, presented council with an update on their concerns at the June 15 council meeting.

CCCT chairperson Jim O'Brien wanted to update the township on the discussions that had taken place at a public information session held on May 20 at the township municipal hall.

"Most of the concerns centred on actions taken by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) and the lack of action taken by council," he said in his statement.

At the May 20 meeting the CCCT group was concerned with haz-

ardous materials at the refinery property and those chemicals leaching off the property into area waterways and a lack of action from the Northeastern Public Health Unit and they were concerned about an active landfill site located on the property.

O'Brien said the CCCT had seven requests for the township regarding the refinery property:

- They wanted the township to challenge the MECP about the certificate of approval on a section of private property in the township with no coordinates and no description of boundaries.

"How is it on private property land was not registered on title?"

Challenge the MECP about the certificate of approval about all non-compliance issues over the years and their lack of boundary definition.

Challenge MECP about nothing (chemi-

cals and hazardous materials) leaving the site when they themselves have been testing on other people's private property and "we have produced elevated results of tests done on Loon Creek."

Send letters to all the original ministries involved with the refinery and include a detailed mention of all violations by the refinery owners over the years as well as proof that the contamination is not contained on the refinery property.

Put together a history of the refinery issues including all the violations and a record of the ministry's actions and present it to the Auditor General of Ontario.

Bring the Northeastern Public Health Unit to a public meeting to discuss the health and safety issues of the refinery property and specifically contamination in Loon Creek and other private property.

Get a high-level offi-

cial from MECP to address all of the refinery issues.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Coleman Mayor Dan Cleroux commented on the CCCT presentation after the meeting had ended. He said he had read some of O'Brien's comments in a Temiskaming Speaker Weekender article about the public meeting they had hosted.

"Nothing has changed, this is more of council bashing and trying to speed up the process," said Cleroux.

"We are going to continue to work diplomatically with the (MECP) and other agencies as such. It has proven that diplomacy works and we had the director of the Ministry of the Environment talking with us and that is a big step forward. We are going to continue to use that strategy moving forward."

Cobalt meeting scrapped over Sharpe Lake sale

COBALT - Town council's June 23 regular meeting ended abruptly as one councillor rejected a bid to add two contentious issues to the meeting agenda.

Councillor Doug Wilcox left the meeting after expressing concern about late additions to the agenda to consider the proposed sale of Sharpe Lake Park, and support for the Classic Theatre. He said the additions to the agenda were

"if not illegal, certainly inappropriate" without notice to the public. He then rose from his chair to depart the meeting, advising Mayor Angela Adshead to "count quorum." With two other councillors absent, the meeting could not continue as they were left without a required majority.

Adshead said Wilcox's move was "sour grapes" and suggested additions to agendas are common at councils. Town staff also expressed confidence that the proposed amendments to the agenda followed procedure.

Prior to leaving, Wilcox told council he was especially concerned about the proposed sale of Sharpe Lake Park, which he said was initially posted for sale with a \$400,000 price tag and then dropped to \$250,000.

"I find that extremely untenable," Wilcox said.

The councillor also complained a notice of motion he filed at a previous meeting was not added to the agenda and concluded "for these reasons, I cannot support this agenda."

Wilcox has previously spo-

ken out against the sale of Sharpe Lake Park, a scenic space that is technically within the boundaries of neighbouring Coleman Township. Formerly operated as a park, the site has been the source of friction between the municipalities over the years, with Coleman's zoning regulations having prevented a proposed commercial gravel pit for the site. Wilcox had expressed hope that Cobalt could find a partner - even Coleman Township itself - to develop the site to create a perpetual stream of revenue

for both municipalities.

Despite his objections, Cobalt council previously proceeded with a resolution to declare the park surplus allowing it to be put up for sale.

Speaking to Wilcox's agenda item not being added, Adshead said it was her prerogative as mayor.

"These meetings are my meetings," she said. "It's my choice (as head of council)."

Following Wilcox's departure, the remaining members of council made tentative plans to call a new regular meeting for Monday.

I was sitting observing Sue's marsh and an American bittern flew up from the tightly woven reeds directly at me.

It veered away at the last minute but it was thrilling as they are one of the most elusive mystics of the marsh you rarely see with the weirdest call in the bird world.

Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder

Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

DISTRICT (Special) - To celebrate Canada Day and encourage more people to enjoy Ontario's world-class outdoors, Canadian residents can fish for free across the province from June 27 to July 5 without purchasing a fishing licence or Outdoors Card.

"Whether you're a lifelong angler or casting a line for the very first time ... enjoy all that Ontario's world-class fishing has to offer," said Mike Harris, Minister of Natural Resources.

"With free fishing available across the province, Canada Day week is the perfect time to get outdoors, spend time with family and friends, and create lasting memories on the water."

Recreational fishing is a key part of Ontario's economy, supporting local tourism and jobs in communities across the province. Free fishing opportunities like Canada Day week provide a chance for people to learn more about fishing on Ontario's lakes and rivers.

For families participating in free fishing from June 27 to July 5, all conservation licence catch and size limits, fishing sanctuaries and other fishing regulations still apply.

Quick Facts

- Canadian residents participating in free fishing periods must carry identification issued by the provincial or federal government, showing their name and date of birth.
- For beginners, Ontario offers loans of rods and reels for free through the TackleShare program, in-person Learn to Fish programs as well as an online Learn to Fish Guide to help new anglers get started.
- 1.16 million anglers spend \$2.4 billion per year on recreational fishing in Ontario.
- Outside of free fishing periods, most people between the ages of 18 and 64 must have an Outdoors Card and a licence to fish. All veterans and active Canadian Armed Forces members residing in Ontario can enjoy free recreational fishing in the province, whenever and wherever fishing is allowed.
- Ontario fishing licences can be purchased online at HuntAndFishOntario.com. If buying online, always look for the Ontario logo. Licences can also be purchased in person at participating ServiceOntario or authorized licence issuer locations.

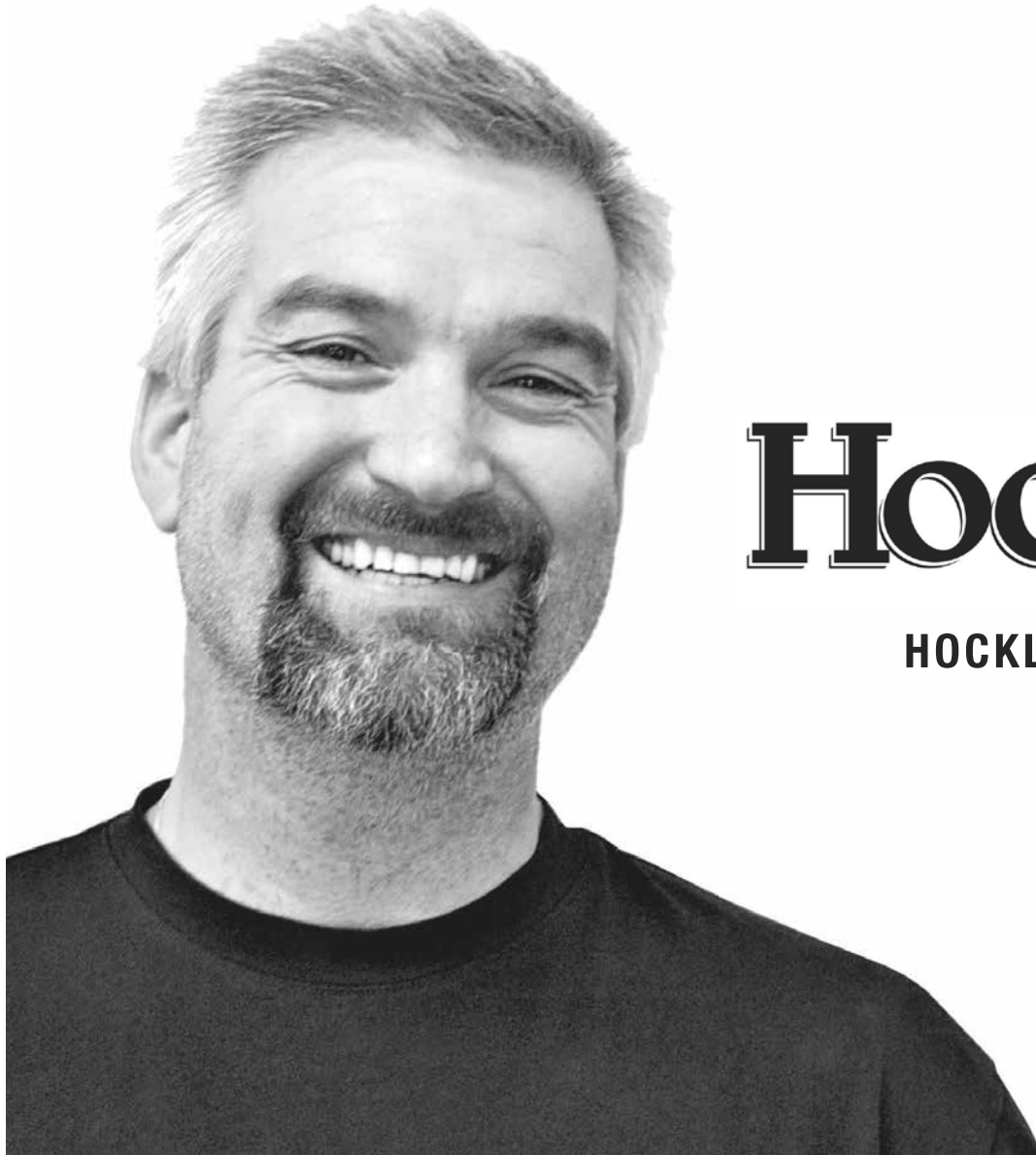
