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Privacy pod now available at NL branch of Public Library

TEMISKAMING SHORES — Do you want to shut out the noise, the clamour and the busyness of the world for a private space?

Everyone knows that libraries are supposed to be quiet places but with a busy clientele, foot traffic and discussions, this may not always be the case.

For enhanced privacy and quietness the New Liskeard branch of the Temiskaming Shores Public Library has a newly installed sound-dampened privacy pod available for usage.

"We have had a few people using the pod and someone came into the library and used the pod for the first time and they said they felt such an immediate calm come over them," said library CEO Rebecca Hunt.

She said she first began seeing the privacy pods about ten years ago at the Toronto reference library and thought it was such a cool idea and she always wanted one for the Temiskaming Shores library.

"It is getting loud in our libraries these days and that's what we wanted, a quiet space for people to go. We are trying to make this

a low-barrier place so people don't have to book it ahead of time. In the last few days more and more people are using the pod."

The privacy pod was funded by an \$8,535 Health Equity Grant from the Timiskaming Ontario Health Team.

The sound dampening accessible booth easily seats a single user. It's perfect for meeting online or in person, for taking or giving an online class or taking part in telehealth meetings or for a quiet working space.

The pod features built in ventilation and motion-activated lighting with plug-ins for laptops, phones and other devices.

This project helps the library support the needs of both the local community and visitors, offering new opportunities to connect, learn, and work.

Those interested in using the spaces do not require a library card to book them.

The privacy pod is open during regular library operating hours and can be booked ahead of time if desired.

Wash your watercraft

How many people know that canoes, kayaks and boats of all kinds - literally anything that floats on water - can spread invasive species

between waterways?

Under the Invasive Species Act, all watercraft are regulated as carriers of invasive species.

What are invasive species that people should be aware of?

The spiny water flea, the water spider plants, zebra mussels and European frog-bit are some invasive species affect-

ing the health of northern waterways.

The invasive plant phragmites is also another invasive species that can be spread by watercraft. It chokes out native species and can quickly invade a shoreline.

Regulations are in place in Ontario to prevent the spread of invasive species.

Always clean, drain and dry your watercraft, trailers and equipment like paddles and motors before entering another waterway.

Avoid dumping bait
into local waterways.

Melanoma Skin Cancer Awareness

Melanoma skin cancer often starts as an abnormal mole on the skin. A mole is a common non-cancerous growth. It's normally a small, round, or oval spot that is usually brown, tan or pink. It may be raised or flat. Melanoma is most frequently found on the back of men and on the back and legs of women. It is the least common, but most serious, type of skin cancer.

Risk Factors:

- Personal or family history of melanoma.
- Presence of moles--especially if there are many, or if they are unusual or large.
- Sun sensitivity--sun burning easily, or difficulty tanning.
- Light colored skin, eyes, and hair.
- History of excessive sun exposure.
- Diseases that suppress the immune system.
- Occupational exposure to coal tar, pitch, creosote, arsenic compounds, or radium.

The ABCDE rule below can help you look for the common signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer:

A is for asymmetry – one half of a mole does not have the same shape as the other half.

B is for border – the edge of a mole is uneven (irregular). It can look jagged, notched, or blurry. The colour may spread into the area around the mole.

C is for colour – the colour of a mole is not the same throughout. It could have shades of tan, brown and black. Sometimes areas of blue, grey, red, pink, or white are also seen.

D is for diameter – the size of a mole is larger than 6mm (1/4 inch) across, which is about the size of a pencil eraser.

E is for evolving – there is a change in the colour, size, shape or feel of the mole. The mole may become itchy or you may have a burning or tingling feeling.

Other signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer include:

- an area that does not heal
- a mole or sore that oozes or bleeds
- broken skin with an open wound (ulceration)

Melanoma is an aggressive form of cancer that can be life-threatening. Schedule an appointment with your primary care provider if you have any of these skin changes.

Mayor denounces online personal attacks

COBALT - Local municipal elected officials are “basically volunteers” who should be spared vindictive, personal attacks online. That was the message from

Cobalt Mayor Angela Adshead during the most recent meeting of council, as she took social media posters to task for online personal attacks against members of town council. In her monthly mayor’s address as part of the council agenda, Adshead expressed dismay over disparaging re-

marks about members of council and their motivations. “I would like to remind the public that when they are putting stuff out on social media, every person around this table is a human being,” said Adshead, who has since announced her resignation as mayor effective July 11. “They have children, they

have families. And when you are speaking so derogatorily about this council, their families and children are seeing that.” Some online posts from potential candidates for council in this fall’s municipal elections were particularly upsetting to the mayor. “I’ve seen this every elec-

tion,” she said. “It’s vicious (and) it’s unfounded, because half of it is not based on fact. And it’s unfair. We’re human just like everybody else. Put yourself in our shoes and how would you feel if it was done to you?” “It’s just a reminder that I would like to put out there.

We're not here for the money, trust me on that. We're basically volunteers and we're here for the same reason anybody who's going to put their name in for nomination. We're trying to do what we feel is right and best, just like you're going to do. So we ask for that consideration that you would expect in return."

The town has been dealing with a number of contentious issues in recent months, including the controversial sale of Sharpe Lake Park, main-

tenance costs for the Classic Theatre and the planned demolition of an aging downtown headframe that is part of the Cobalt Heritage Silver Trail.
