Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid Disorder

Awareness

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, maybe due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

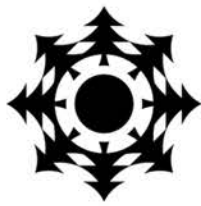

Reduce your risk of Lyme disease and tick-borne illnesses

DISTRICT (Special) - As outdoor activity increases during the summer season, the Ontario government is encouraging people across the province to take precautions to prevent tick bites and reduce the risk of Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses when enjoying the outdoors.

Lyme disease is a potentially serious infection that comes from being bitten by an infected blacklegged tick, commonly known as a deer tick. If you have any symptoms such as fever, headache, chills, muscle and joint pain, fatigue and an expanding circular rash that resembles a bulls-eye, consult a health-care provider as soon as possible.

“As we head outside to enjoy the warmer weather, it is important to protect ourselves from Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses,” said Sylvia Jones, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health.

“By taking simple precautions, Ontarians can protect themselves and their families while enjoying the outdoors in our beautiful province.”

You can protect yourself from tick bites by:

- Wearing light coloured clothing so it’s easier to spot ticks
- Wearing long-sleeved shirts, long pants tucked into your socks and closed-toed shoes
- Using insect repellent with DEET or icaridin in it
- Checking yourself, your children and your pets for ticks after being outdoors

- Removing any found ticks promptly

- Putting clothes on high heat in the dryer for at least 10 minutes before washing clothing after spending time outdoors

- Staying on marked trails and avoiding tall grass, brush, leaf litter and along trail edges, where ticks are commonly found

“As cases of Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses rise and ticks continue to expand into new areas, more Ontarians may be at risk of tick bites,” said Dr. Kieran Moore, Chief Medical Officer of Health.

“Simple precautions can help reduce that risk, including being vigilant in wooded and grassy areas, even close to home, wearing appropriate clothing and doing routine tick checks after spending time outdoors.”

Ticks are very small and hard to see. When a tick is found, it should be removed immediately using fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin as possible without crushing it. Once you have removed the tick, wash the area and your hands with soap and water, and then disinfect the area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or an iodine swab. Before disposing of the tick, call or check the website of your local public health unit to get advice on how to identify the tick. You can also submit a photo of the tick to etick.ca for identification.

If you have any health con-

cerns after a tick bite, consult a health-care provider as soon as possible. Most cases of Lyme disease can be treated successfully with antibiotics. In Ontario, pharmacists can assess tick bites and provide medication, where appropriate, to help prevent Lyme disease, making it easier for people to access timely care.

Quick Facts

- To make it easier for people to access care closer to home, Ontario pharmacists are able to treat and prescribe medications for 19 common ailments, including tick bites

- Infected blacklegged ticks can be found almost anywhere in the province. Since 2021, there have been over 10,000 cases of Lyme disease in Ontario. Since 2023 there have been over 300 cases of anaplasmosis, approximately 20 cases of Powassan virus and 30 cases of babesiosis in Ontario.

- While ticks are most active in spring and summer, they can be found during any time of the year when the temperature is above freezing (0 C)

- Laboratory testing is conducted only on ticks collected by the local public health unit using a method called tick dragging. The test results are used to monitor where infected and uninfected ticks live

- The method for removing a tick is the same for humans and animals

Ontario launching new fishing and hunting licensing service

DISTRICT (Special) - To make it easier for anglers and hunters to purchase licences and tags, the Ontario government is creating a new licensing system, FishHuntON.

Launching in early 2027, FishHuntON will provide residents with more convenient and flexible ways to access licensing services, including a new easy-to-use mobile app. The new system will operate alongside existing service channels, ensuring residents can continue to access licensing services that work best for them.

“Whether you’re a lifelong angler or casting a line for the very first time, our government is making it easier and more convenient to enjoy all that Ontario’s world-class fishing has to offer,” said Mike Harris, Minister of Natural Resources.

“Our new FishHuntON platform will make accessing licences and tags easier than ever, so people can spend more time doing what they love and exploring the great outdoors.”

Launching in early 2027, FishHuntON will provide approximately 1.5 million an-

glers and hunters with new ways to conveniently keep track of fishing and hunting licences and tags. Highlights of the new licensing system include:

- a free mobile app to purchase and renew fishing and hunting products
- digital storage through the mobile app of licences and tags, which can be accessed with or without cellu-

lar service

- the ability to submit proof of Ontario hunter accreditation documents digitally

- an easier way to submit hunter reports

“FishHuntON will streamline access to Outdoors Cards, licences and tags while expanding convenient digital options, making it easier for anglers and hunters to access the services they need,” said

Stephen Crawford, Minister of Public and Business Service Delivery and Procurement.

Alongside these new features, FishHuntON will continue to deliver core services such as the sale of Ontario Outdoors Cards, licences, tags and big game draw applications online and in-person at participating ServiceOntario locations.

Anglers and hunters are a vital part of Ontario’s resource-based economy, contributing an estimated \$3.37 billion annually. Anglers fishing for free until July 5 must follow all conservation licence catch and size limits, respect fishing sanctuaries and obey all other fishing regulations.
