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Cost-conscious Cobalt to negotiate lease with theatre

COBALT - Silver Town is looking to raise the curtain on lease discussions with the Classic Theatre to prevent the venue from being a financial burden on Cobalt's taxpayers.

At a recent regular public meeting, town council approved a resolution to enter into lease negotiations with the theatre for ongoing use of the town-owned facility. The move comes after the town was forced to shoulder almost \$50,000 in costs to repair the foundation of the historic building.

Councillor Pat Anderson expressed frustration over the ongoing upkeep costs for the theatre, which is used by a not-for-profit corporation to host live entertainment and special events.

"Why should we pay all these extra costs?" she asked her fellow councillors. "Why should the taxpayers have to pay them, instead of the theatre making the money and paying them. The theatre costs and costs and

costs and we need to do something."

Councillor Doug Wilcox said the theatre is an important part of the town whose value can't be measured in dollars

alone.

"It's part of what makes the town worth living in," he said. "If you get rid of the attractions, people have less and less interest in

coming to town. (Then) you've got a series of houses with people not really particularly happy to be here." *Continued on Page 3.*

Then-Mayor Angela Adshead yielded the chair to Deputy Mayor Anderson so that she could speak freely about the situation as a member of council and a ratepayer.

“The lease would be covering all of these costs and they would be paying the taxes,” she said, explaining the

town’s rationale for entering into lease negotiations with the theatre corporation.

“The only reason that’s not happening right now is because it is a not-for-profit and under the rules for not-for-profit, they do not pay property taxes.

“I am a ratepayer in town and I know the struggles

some of the other ratepayers in town have with rising taxes and trying to mitigate that. I don’t feel it’s fair for our residents to continue to be paying costs and giving things away when they can ill afford it.

Adshead said the theatre is making money, “whether they call it profit or not,” and

“they do have a substantial bank account,” and are quite willing to talk.

“They have said ... more than once that they are more than willing to negotiate a lease,” she said.

The theatre’s roots in the community go back to 1926, when it opened as a vaudeville theatre during the wan-

ing years of the Cobalt silver rush. It continued on until 1973, mainly as a community stage and movie theatre, before closing its doors.

Sitting idle for 20 years, it was revitalized in 1993, and the refurbished facility opened its doors a year later with a modern 250-seat venue.

MP addresses affordability issue facing towns and individuals

COBALT – Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Pauline Rochefort was in Cobalt recently where she commended council for its work on an official plan and went on to talk about issues, like affordability, facing citizens in her riding.

Rochefort lauded the municipality for its work in preparing its official plan and offered her help in guiding Cobalt through the myriad federal funding programs available.

“I did review your official plan that was recently approved last year and I must admit I was very impressed,” she said.

“I felt that it was a very, very well done official plan. Sometimes I find that communities don’t realize all the work that goes into preparing an official plan and so I want to publicly say it’s an excellent piece of work. I was impressed as

well by the vision, recognizing the past, and embracing the future,” said the MP.

“I look forward to seeing how I might support you and carrying out this plan as we move forward.”

Rochefort said housing stands out as an issue for many municipalities, including Cobalt, as well as the need for economic growth, from a workforce perspective and also dealing with an aging population.

“You certainly cover the economy very well in your plan,” she said. “Like every community, there is aging infrastructure, and with the limited tax base, it’s a challenge. But I can say that, in my view, Cobalt has a bigger challenge than maybe some of the other communities because at the same time, you’re trying to preserve the past. So I raise my hat to all of you, and the work that you’re doing and trying to preserve the heritage of this community, the mining history of this community, at the same time help

this community to grow.”

AFFORDABILITY

Rochefort said affordability is a huge economic concern nationally, as well as locally. The federal government, she said, “can never quite do enough” while dealing with the difficulties of tariffs and trade issues south of the border.

“It’s a complex world, as we all know, and at every level of government, it’s a complex world.”

Rochefort said statistics show Nipissing-Timiskaming as a region has taken strong advantage of federal initiatives such as the dental plan, the new grocery rebate and child care benefits.

“There’s so many different benefits that are essential and they all need to be protected,” she said. “That is very much front and centre with our government and with my role is how do we protect that for our community, for our citizens.”

Rochefort said she ap-

plauds the federal government’s steps to ease reliance on the American market and promote cross-provincial trade.

“My personal belief is that we need to grow our economy and with what’s occurred to us in the United States, we need to become more sovereign, more independent,” she said. “So there’s been tremendous amount of work in that respect and work will continue in that regard. I find some of the strategies will have an impact on us in the North.”

The new national electricity strategy, she said, is also “very important” for municipalities to support industry, especially with rising demand.

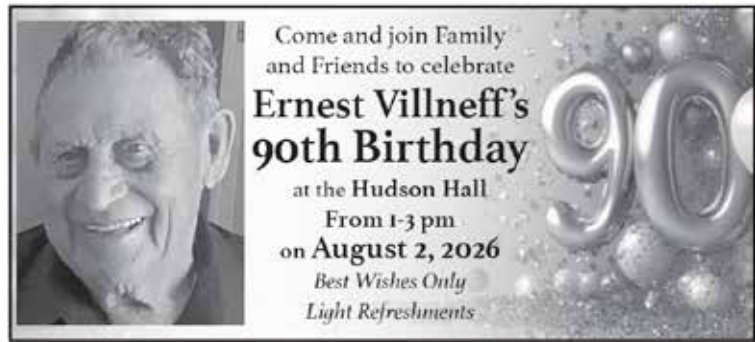
“It’s significant ... they’re talking about (demand) dou-

bling,” she said.

“We need, as a country, to take action on that. It is essential.”

From gas to nuclear to renewables to hydroelectric power and geothermal pumps, all technologies come into play, she said.

“But more important is the fact that we’re going to be connecting all of our provinces. I mean, it’s incredible to believe that we evolved as a country, where each province more or less has our own energy system, they connect north-south, but they don’t connect east-west. And so part of this work will be on how do we connect them so that we can assure that in 20 years from now we have reliable, affordable energy.”

Melanoma Skin Cancer Awareness

Melanoma skin cancer often starts as an abnormal mole on the skin. A mole is a common non-cancerous growth. It's normally a small, round, or oval spot that is usually brown, tan or pink. It may be raised or flat. Melanoma is most frequently found on the back of men and on the back and legs of women. It is the least common, but most serious, type of skin cancer.

Risk Factors:

- Personal or family history of melanoma.
- Presence of moles--especially if there are many, or if they are unusual or large.
- Sun sensitivity--sun burning easily, or difficulty tanning.
- Light colored skin, eyes, and hair.
- History of excessive sun exposure.
- Diseases that suppress the immune system.
- Occupational exposure to coal tar, pitch, creosote, arsenic compounds, or radium.

The ABCDE rule below can help you look for the common signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer:

A is for asymmetry – one half of a mole does not have the same shape as the other half.

B is for border – the edge of a mole is uneven (irregular). It can look jagged, notched, or blurry. The colour may spread into the area around the mole.

C is for colour – the colour of a mole is not the same throughout. It could have shades of tan, brown and black. Sometimes areas of blue, grey, red, pink, or white are also seen.

D is for diameter – the size of a mole is larger than 6mm (1/4 inch) across, which is about the size of a pencil eraser.

E is for evolving – there is a change in the colour, size, shape or feel of the mole. The mole may become itchy or you may have a burning or tingling feeling.

Other signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer include:

- an area that does not heal
- a mole or sore that oozes or bleeds
- broken skin with an open wound (ulceration)

Melanoma is an aggressive form of cancer that can be life-threatening. Schedule an appointment with your primary care provider if you have any of these skin changes.
