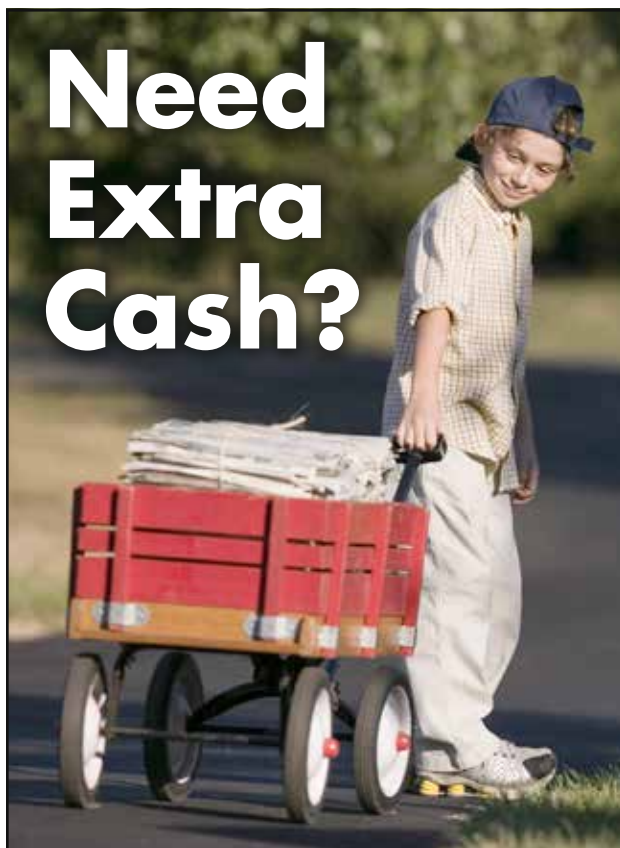

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City rolls out the mats for improved accessibility

TEMISKAMING SHORES — Lake Temiskaming is now accessible for everyone, especially people using wheelchairs. With accessibility being a major priority for the City of Temiskaming Shores, the city now has three mobi mats at its beaches for improved access.

There are three installed in Temiskaming Shores - one at the Haileybury beach and two in New Liskeard along the boardwalk on the lake side.

A mobi mat is a lightweight, resistant, non-slip mat for creating temporary access to beaches and waterways.

It is paired with a water wheel chair, which is lightweight and can be rolled along the mat to the shoreline and into

the water.

The mobi mat is light blue in colour and pairs with a water wheelchair that can be sourced from the Waterfront Pool Fitness Centre or from lifeguards at the Haileybury beach.

Age Friendly Coordi-

nator Alex Leveille said the mobi mats in New Liskeard were installed in the summer and people seem to be in favour of using them, along with the water accessible wheelchairs.

They have been welcomed and used at the

Haileybury beach since last summer.

"All people have to do in New Liskeard is come to the Pool Fitness Centre, get the key for the shed and take the water wheelchairs out and use them on the mobi mats to access the lake."

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Canadian Cancer Society needs volunteer drivers

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) - Cancer patients across the Northeast region of Ontario and closer to home in Temiskaming Shores and area have relied on volunteer drivers to take them to distant hospitals for important cancer treatments and appointments.

Volunteer drivers are currently being sought in the Temiskaming region by the Canadian Cancer Society (CCS).

"We need four more drivers in Temiskaming Shores to meet the current demand," said CCS volunteer driver for the Wheels of Hope (WOH) transportation program Steve Watson in a press release.

"Sometimes patients don't have family or friends who can drive them long distances to North Bay for chemotherapy or to Sudbury for radiation and or chemotherapy, which means they either miss treatments or pay a lot for

transportation if a WOH driver is not available."

The Wheels of Hope transportation program is affordable, costing patients registered with the program \$100 annually.

"However, the program needs more volunteer drivers to provide this affordable and reliable transportation to everyone who needs it," said Watson.

If you or someone you know would like to volunteer to be a driver and support people with cancer, you can give the gift of a ride to their life-saving cancer treatments and other appointments.

Mileage reimbursements and tax receipts are provided to drivers.

The Wheels of Hope program is not affiliated with the Community Cancer Care program in New Liskeard.

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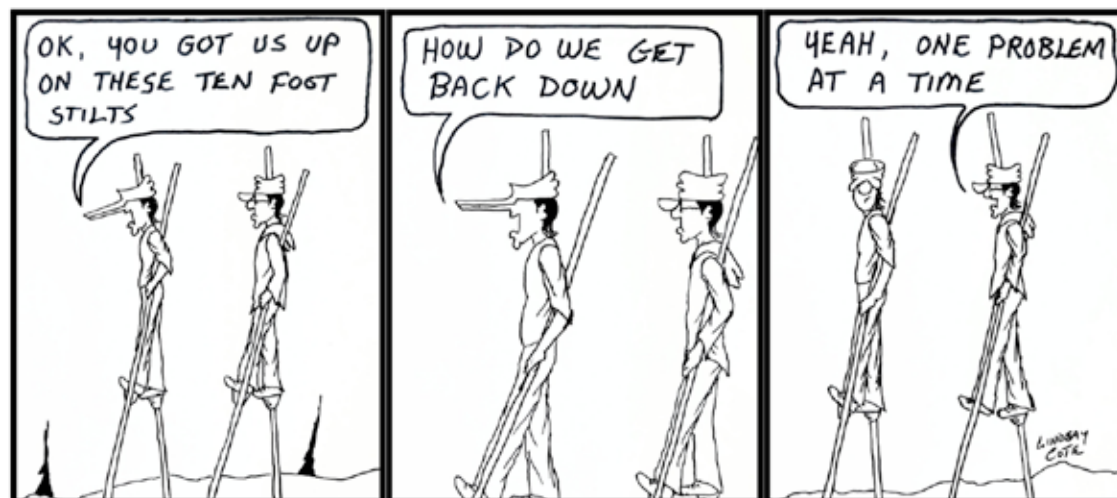
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Awash in memories

It was no secret to us kids and to the neighbourhood that my mother, Lena Margaret Brydges, had a fondness for doing laundry.

Mom was the type of person who loved the sight of clothes drying in the wind.

She loved the smell of the washing when it came back into the house.

There was very little that mom would not hang on her clothesline - our underwear, socks, sheets, rugs, her dresses, coats, and more.

My father used to say that before his pants hit the floor she had them in the washing machine.

Cold winter days did not deter our mother from hanging our clothes on the line either.

She would often bring in our jeans, shirts and sheets from the line stiff as a board.

She would drape them over every available space in the house to take the dampness out of them and heaven forbid any of us dare put them in the dryer.

Her domestic life involved

washing the family's clothes and she made the task beautiful and comforting in her own way.

Let me tell you, Lena's whites were like no other, they were brilliant white. She took great pride in the cleanliness of our clothes and her laundry soap had to be Tide, nothing else would do.

On one cold January morning when it was about -30 C she went outside to hang clothes on the line.

We were all getting ready for school, all of us kids were in high school at that time and we were rushing around trying to get our breakfast into us.

Mom came into the kitchen from that cold exterior and collapsed on the floor in front of us with her arms full of clean, white sheets.

Oh my god, what was happening to mom?

I looked at my mother's face and it was twisting into shapes I did not recognize.

She was in the throes of a massive stroke and could not speak.

The stroke left her partially paralyzed on her left side and with the inability to speak.

She was immediately flown from the Earlton Airport to Toronto General Hospital where she underwent heart surgery.

Mom was a fighter and to her credit she regained her speech and overcame her paralysis to come back home to her family and her beloved clothesline.

If it's said that cleanliness is next to godliness, then my mother was a saint.

This week is mom's birthday week (September 7) and it was over 20 years ago I began working here at The Speaker on mom's birthday.

I moved home to care for my mother after my father died and to have spent that quality time with mom was truly a blessing.

Happy birthday in heaven Lena.

I am sure she has my dad's pants hanging on the big clothesline in the sky while she chats it up with Saint Peter.

Prostate Cancer Awareness

Did you know?

- Prostate cancer is the most common cancer to affect Canadian men;
- One in eight men will be diagnosed with the disease in their lifetime;
- Over 90% of prostate cancer cases are curable if detected and treated in their earliest stages

Signs and Symptoms of Prostate Cancer

- Difficulty urinating
- Urgent need to urinate
- Frequent urination, especially at night
- Burning or pain when urinating
- Inability to urinate or difficulty starting or stopping urine flow
- Painful ejaculation
- Blood in the urine or semen

Risk Factors

While any man can develop prostate cancer, you may be at a higher risk if you are...

- Over 50: Age is the strongest risk factor for prostate cancer. Your risk increases starting at age 50, and most cases are diagnosed in men over age 65. Depending on your risk, your health care provider may recommend that you think about testing at an earlier age – as young as 40.
- Have a family history of prostate cancer: Your risk is higher if a first-degree relative (father or brother) has had prostate cancer. Your risk increases with each additional first-degree relative who has the disease.
- African or Caribbean: Prostate cancer is more common among men in these ethnic groups. (Men of Asian descent have lower risk.)

Don't Ignore Symptoms

The sooner symptoms are reported to your health care provider, the sooner testing to help diagnose and treat the problem can begin. Symptoms may be caused by prostate cancer or by another health problem.

Symptoms are not always present especially in the early stages of prostate cancer. If detected and treated in its earliest stages, the chances of survival are greatly increased. If you have questions about whether or not you should have a PSA test, talk to your doctor or nurse practitioner. Early detection is key!
