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Funding sought for local youth centre at The Bun

TEMISKAMING SHORES - City staff have their fingers crossed the provincial government will come through with funding to create a community youth centre at the Lawrence “Bun” Eckensviller Community Hall.

Temiskaming Shores recreation director Matt Bahm said staff have made a submission to the Ontario Trillium Foundation Seed Grant program for funding to implement an after-school program for teens.

“The plan would be to operate from 3-6 p.m. on school days and offer a free space for teens to hang out and be active.”

“We should receive a response from our application before the end of the year and hope to be operating in January,” Bahm told The Speaker.

“The seed funding would support staff to run the program for 12 months as well as cover some of our start-up costs including equipment, furnishings, etc.”

New Age Criteria for Colon Cancer Screening

As of July 1, 2026, Ontario has lowered the age range for free colon cancer testing from 50 to:

- ➔ Age 45 for average risk individuals
- ➔ Age 40 for those at increased risk



If you are considered “average risk,” you can do an easy-to-use at-home free test (Fecal Immunochemical Test- FIT) to screen. The at-home test only takes a few minutes to do and only requires a small stool (poop) sample.

Talk to your family doctor or nurse practitioner about getting tested. If you do not have one, you can order a FIT kit by calling 8-1-1.

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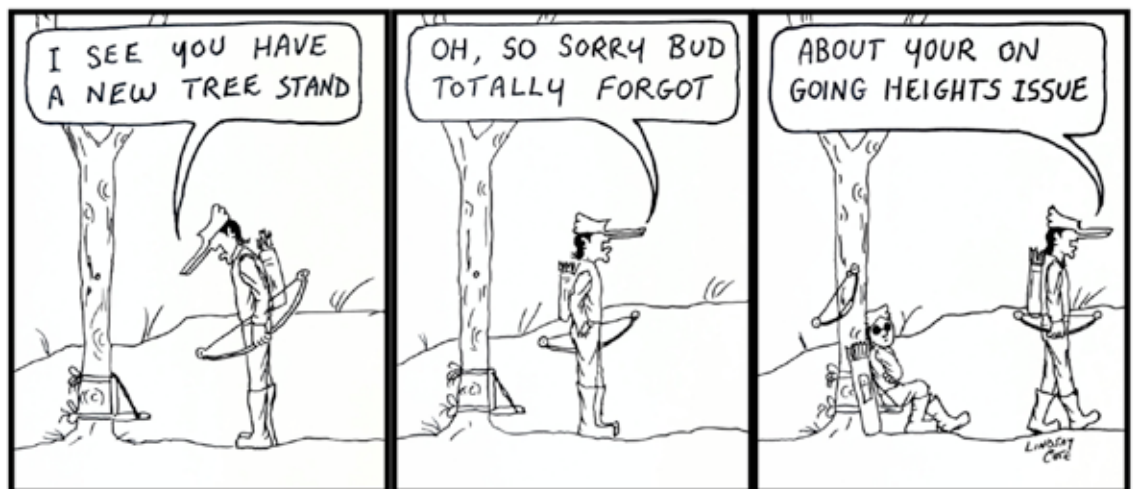

I can still picture the red tailed hawk that sat on a fence post as I drove to work one morning.

I heard the unusual and weird call of the American bittern as it flew straight up from the marsh at me one spring day.

When I saw the moose swimming in the lake a mere 20 yards from me early one morning, I never forgot how wild and beautiful that experience was.

I drove past a culvert near Sharp Lake and saw otters playing on the ice.

I stopped, grabbed my camera and telephoto lens and proceeded to be amazed at the playfulness of these creatures.

On a spring morning I spotted a large snapping turtle laying her eggs near the shoreline of Gillies Lake.

I helped her cross the road and she was gone, never to see her baby turtles again.

I photographed three fox kits in Latchford, their den was built under a roadway,

and it was a pleasure to see how mamma fox took care of her family and the unusual place she had built her den.

I can still hear the dinosaur-like call of the sand hill cranes as a small flock passed over my head one day during the spring migration.

To my utmost surprise they landed on a slightly frozen lake, close enough to me that I could photograph their beauty.

The largest bears I have ever seen came out of the bush close to my vehicle while I was near the Haileybury landfill. They had to be over 500 pounds.

The dominant scream of a bald eagle sitting high atop a white pine tree still resonates with me to this day.

I noticed that flock of beautifully coloured bohemian waxwings feasting on the mountain ash berries in the middle of winter, when things are dull and cold.

That loon family that magically popped up beside my canoe seeming to say to me

“hey, we love this lake,” is a summer gift.

The two loon chicks who pay no heed to my presence as if I was part of their lake family makes me incredibly grateful for this wild Temiskaming region.

Those nature moments have all imprinted on my brain how wonderful and fortunate we are to live in this wild Temiskaming region.

I feel I have a philosophical and spiritual connection to nature that has enriched my life.

The wilds of this region serve as my constant companion, healer and spiritual guide in a world filled with the fake, the digital and the hateful.

Being outside gives me a childlike wonder that I crave.

Wildlife are messengers acting as indicators of what is off with our environment.

It is important to get outside and fall in love with nature, because when you love something, you will stop at nothing to protect it.

Arthritis Awareness

Arthritis is Canada's most prevalent chronic health condition – for which there is no cure

Fast Facts:

- Arthritis strikes people of every age, from infants to adults, and stays for life.
- Arthritis is a complex disease with over 100 different types. Major types are inflammatory arthritis (like rheumatoid arthritis, childhood arthritis, ankylosing spondylitis, psoriatic arthritis, and gout), and the most common form, osteoarthritis. Fibromyalgia has similar symptoms to arthritis.
- Arthritis results in painful inflammation and stiffness in joints, limiting the ability to move.
- Left untreated, arthritis can cause permanent joint damage and/or changes.
- A significant proportion of people with arthritis are overweight or obese and are physically inactive, adding undue stress to their joints.
- Some types of arthritis can affect the heart, eyes, lungs, kidneys and even the skin.
- A significant proportion of people with arthritis also have other serious diseases like heart disease or diabetes.

Warning Signs of Inflammatory Arthritis

There are many forms of inflammatory arthritis; signs that are typical for most include:

- Pain, swelling and stiffness in one or multiple joints
- Morning stiffness in and around the affected joints lasting at least one hour
- Pain and stiffness that worsens with inactivity and improves with physical activity
- Reduced range of motion
- Sometimes fever, weight loss, fatigue and/or anemia

Treatment

Arthritis affects everyone differently so treatment planning should be tailored to individual needs with guidance from members of your healthcare team (e.g. family doctor, rheumatologist, surgeon, physiotherapist, occupational therapist etc.).

For the over 6 million Canadians living with arthritis, pain is one of the many challenges they face on a daily basis. And though medication is only one option in terms of arthritis treatment, it can provide pain relief (and slow joint damage in many cases of inflammatory forms of arthritis). Keep in mind that many lifestyle changes, such as healthy eating, exercise and treatments such as physical therapy, should also be explored.

Bahm said the program will fill a need identified in the Planet Youth Timiskaming student surveys completed in 2023 and 2026.

Initially, teens were given a one-page information sheet

to inform them of the project and get their feedback on what they think of the project, Bahm said.

“The feedback we got was very positive and have been moving forward since then.”

RELAX AND LEARN

The information sheet describes the proposed centre as “a safe, welcoming, and inclusive space for youth ages 12-18 to connect, relax, learn and participate in positive activities after school.”

It would provide supervised drop-in space focused on recreation, wellness, creativity and social connection. Proposed features would include recreation and games, music and performance, and

area for homework help, workshops and life skills programs, a lounge, kitchen and snack area and mental wellness support.

Bahm said the Youth Centre would initially be based in the gym and upstairs meeting room at the community hall.

“The plan would be to operate from 3-6 p.m. on school days and offer a free space for teens to hang out and be active,” he said. “It’s based on other successful models from around Ontario and was identified in the Planet Youth surveys as a need in the community.”

The Ontario Trillium Foundation offers seed grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$100,000 to help cover up to one year of operations for programs that meet an identified community need.
