City turns down accommodations study

TEMISKAMING SHORES - The city won't fund a study into the potential for new visitor accommodations.

On June 21, Temiskaming Shores council discussed commissioning a \$10,000 accommodation development potential study that would be available to prospective developers.

In a report to council, economdevelopment officer James Franks said the sentiment has been expressed several times in the past that an apparent lack of reasonably

under discussion in the municipality, he continued.

"For the City to support or discourage these investors, it would be prudent to understand the need in the community for such developments rather than relying on anecdotal information," he wrote.

He said a study would also suggest the most suitable locations for developments.

But if they don't, and the munici-Two developments are currently pality has its own study, it would be able to provide the information to other potential investors, he said.

Mayor Carman Kidd said other municipalities have conducted such studies and are actively pursuing hotel and motel developers.

But council members objected to the idea.

"I'm not sure why we're doing the proponent's business plan," said Councillor Danny Whalen.

DEVELOPERS

Councillor Doug Jelly said developers would have to do their own studies in order to qualify for financing.

"I don't see why we would spend this right now," he said.

Councillor Jeff Laferriere said the council has discussed conducting an economic development study, which would be funded by senior levels of government.

The potential for new visitor accommodations could figure into the larger study, he said.

In the end, council turned down commissioning an accommodations study.
