Proceeds will go to the Community Cancer Care program, which assists local families who face cancer-related expenses.

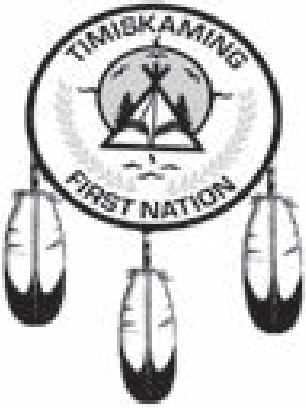
It’s not the first time that emergency responders have raised money for the cause, said Temiskaming Shores Fire Chief Tim Uttley.

# Eagle statue heist reported in Cobalt

COBALT (Staff) – A statue of an eagle weighing several hundred pounds is missing.

The metre-tall statue was stolen from the front yard of a Third Street residence in Cobalt sometime between 9 a.m. August 18 and 8:30 a.m. August 22.

The cement statue depicts an eagle atop a globe and with a fish in one set of talons.

Temiskaming Ontario Provincial Police are appealing to the public for information about the theft.

Police say information can be

passed on anonymously through Crime Stoppers, at 1-800-310-1122, or on-line or by cell-phone.

Information that leads to an arrest may be eligible for a reward of up to \$2,000

Police say anonymity is assured. The information is passed to an investigative unit, which then reports to the Crime Stoppers board whether the tip was helpful in preventing or solving a crime.

## Temagami Family Health Team

### Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)

**What is FASD?**  
FASD is a brain injury that can occur when an unborn baby is exposed to alcohol. It's a lifelong disorder with effects that include physical, mental, behavioural and learning disabilities that can vary from mild to severe. FASD is the leading known cause of preventable developmental disability in Canada.

**Signs and Symptoms**  
Every unborn baby will be affected by alcohol differently. FASD is often called an invisible disorder because the majority of people with it have no obvious signs of disability. Their learning and behavioural challenges are often mistaken for other problems. Some babies are born with facial features that are characteristic of FASD. These features are only evident when a fetus is affected by alcohol at a specific stage in pregnancy. Only a small number of people with FASD will have these features. The features include:

- thin upper lip
- little or no groove or ridge between the nose and upper lip
- small eyes or shorter distance between one corner of the eye to the other

**For all people with FASD, there will be different degrees of brain damage. These may include problems with:**

- learning
- memory
- attention
- language
- social skills
- motor skills
- controlling behaviour
- reasoning and judgement
- academics like math and reading

**In everyday life, problems with behaviours may look like:**

- being impulsive
- acting out from frustration
- not understanding consequences
- being unfocused and easily distracted
- difficulties with keeping up with classroom learning
- forgetting how to do something they've done before
- a hard time with handling money or learning how to tell time

An early diagnosis followed by appropriate interventions and support help to minimize the disabilities associated with FASD. If you are a patient of the Temagami Family Health Team and are concerned about the possibility of FASD, please call the office at (705) 569-3244 to schedule an appointment with your primary care provider.

The recent flooding in Houston, Texas, and Windsor, Ontario, and in South Asia have revealed how vulnerable we are to the weather and climate of this planet.

Hurricanes, wild fires, tsunami, earthquakes, floods and famine are becoming a common thread on the six o'clock news.

And what has become a common thread is the incredible ways people are responding to natural disasters.

Hundreds of people drove thousand of miles with their boats and goodwill to help the flood victims of Houston.

The photograph of the seniors sitting in waist-high contaminated water waiting to be rescued was heartbreaking.

One of the richest men in Houston, Jim “Mattress Mack” McIngvale of Gallery Furniture, opened two of his huge stores as a shelter and gave out his personal cell phone number to those in need.

We saw ordinary people standing side-by-side in a human chain in chest-high water searching for survivors and risking their own lives doing it.

I admire all those wonderful people who didn't have to be asked or paid to dig in and help - they just did it out of the goodness of their hearts.

What galled a good many people were the actions of a wealthy televangelist pastor who refused to get his 16,500-seat church dirty from the floodwaters until he was shamed on

social media.

And for those who have a bone to pick with organized religion, this was a watershed moment.

A ridiculously wealthy, self-serving man-of-god pastor hesitated to help the needy when they needed it the most.

Yet he has his hand out taking money through his televised ministries.

You don't wait to receive an invitation when disaster strikes, you react swiftly and with the goodness of your heart.

And that is exactly what has happened in this region, most notably when the 1977 fire swept through Cobalt and destroyed over half the homes in town.

People from across the country did not wait to be asked to respond, they stepped up and helped out. They sent money, food and clothing to the emergency depot set up at the Cobalt Arena at that time.

The same goes for the Great Fire of 1922 and other mega disasters in the region.

And on a different scale from a natural disaster, it warmed my heart when compassionate people here opened up their hearts and wallets to help a Syrian refugee family in need.

We are each other's keepers and we are all just walking each other home aren't we?

In the wake of Hurricane Harvey, it's the ordinary citizens making the hero honour role.

We need that kindness everyday.

## Stop for flashing red lights

If a driver fails to stop for the flashing red lights of a school bus, a child or children could be killed or seriously injured.

This is true.

A little over 15 years has gone by since five-year-old Adam Ranger was struck and killed by a truck on February 11, 2000, just east of Mattawa, Ontario.

Adam was attempting to cross the road as the flashing red lights of his school bus were activated that fateful day.

Two years later a verdict was returned of manslaughter and criminal negligence causing death against the driver of the truck that hit Adam Ranger.

It was a precedent setting judgment at the time.

School buses have returned to the streets of the South Temiskaming region and it is incumbent on drivers to be

aware of the flashing red lights when buses are stopped to pick up and drop off children.

There are several large billboards placed around the region with Adam Ranger's face on them reminding people to stop for the flashing lights of a school bus.

Hopefully the precedent setting judgment against the driver who killed a five-year-old boy, plus the billboard campaign and the messages from law enforcement, result in one driver making the decision to not drive through flashing red lights of a school bus, then children will be that much safer when exiting or getting onto their school buses.

Please be alert and aware of school buses and children riding and walking to and from school.

According to Tourism Northern

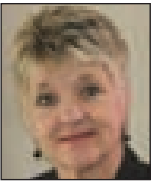
Ontario, travel to Canada from overseas hit its highest May on record with 544,000 trips to Canada.

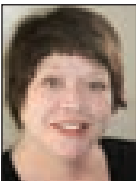

# Board ONE seeking new Kap-Hearst trustee

**TIMMINS (Staff/Special)** – The region’s English public school board is looking for a new trustee to finish out the term.

The newcomer will represent the Kapuskasing and Hearst areas on District School Board Ontario North East until the end of the current term November 30, 2018.

Eligible applicants must be English public school supporters who live within the board’s jurisdiction.

But the board has said that preference will be given to applicants from the Kapuskasing and Hearst areas.

The deadline to submit an application is September 14.

In a news release, board chair Doug Shearer said the board hopes to select a new trustee when it meets September 19.

The successful applicant will replace Wayne Major who, after seven years as a trustee, is stepping down because his family is moving out of the board’s jurisdiction.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### Open Letter to Transportation Minister Del Duca

Dear Minister Del Duca,

Over the course of the last few weeks, my constituency staff and I have fielded numerous calls regarding the condition of Highway 11 between the communities of Iroquois Falls and Cochrane. At this time, this portion of Highway 11 is under construction (Contract 2017-5105 - Highway 11 - Iroquois Falls).

While people generally understand the nature of road construction and its accompanying delays, many of my constituents have expressed real concern regarding their safety when using this road. Several have also suffered damage to their vehicles, due to the condition of the road.

We have contacted your Ministry’s liaison, and have received a reply. While I appreciate the clarifying comments, it is hard to understand why the road has been allowed to deteriorate so badly during construction. As Highway 11 forms a portion of the Trans-Canada Highway, it is reasonable for travellers to expect a consistent quality of road surface across the country. The contract information posted on the Ministry’s Traveller’s Road Information Service website as of August 25, 2017, states that there will be no reduced speed limits, but the Ministry’s response dated August 22, 2017, states that reduced speed limits have been posted. Could you clarify whether all conditions of the contract are being met at this time, particularly those pertaining to driver safety during construction?

We appreciate that the weather has been challenging, but it is vital that the road remain in good condition for travellers, regardless of the weather. Our office has been assured that paving will commence this week. It is my sincere hope that it does, and that on-going maintenance is brought to a higher standard during the remainder of the construction phase. It is imperative that people feel safe on our main public transportation route in the North.

I trust that you will look into this matter. I look forward to your response.

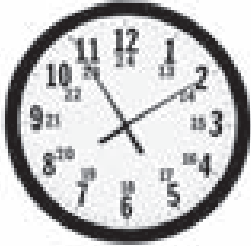

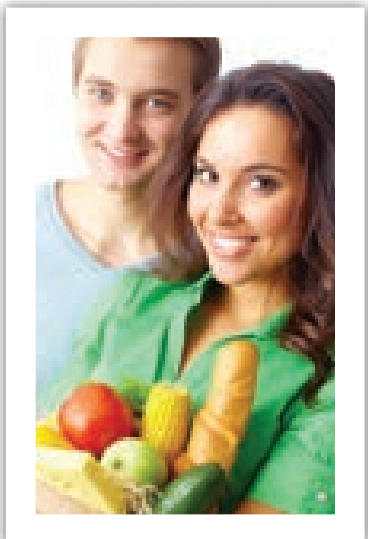

# Art in Park returning for '18

TEMISKAMING SHORES – They danced and dined at the final Art in the Park gathering. Country foursome Just Fiddlin' Around provided the live music at the eighth Wednesday night event on the Haileybury waterfront August 23. Couples took a break from waltzing around the pavilion to share in Canada 150 cake. But while the summer series is now done, its return next year is “guaranteed,” said Kirsten Hill, interim manager of the Temiskaming Art Gallery and a coordinator of the event. “I really believe it has this incredible energy that’s been building.”

Crowds have turned out for each event, regardless of the weather, said Réjeanne Bélisle-Massie, a member of the boards of the gallery and Centre culturel ARTEM. The francophone cultural organization was also a partner in Art in the Park. Bélisle-Massie took advantage of the gatherings to promote a new Lake Temiskaming circle tour of heritage attractions. This year’s series was also unique in that it tied into Canada 150 celebrations. Historical figures dropped by, making a return appearance after a gala in late May. Art in the Park was launched in the summer of 2015. Admission is free to the gatherings, which provide a stage

for local musicians and a venue where artists can show and sell their work. Art-related activities, which change weekly, are offered to children. Owners of classic cars have also dropped by to show off their vehicles as part of the Cars and Coffee group. Businesses, government funders and the City of Temiskaming Shores have lent a hand with the '17 series. This year, Hill said organizers estimated that events drew on average 300 visitors. Crowds have been “an incredible mix” of children, young adults and seniors, she said. She heard comments that people also appreciated the opportunity to attend a special

event mid-week. She sees the potential to expand the weekly offerings to offer art in action. That could take the form, she said, of an artist working on a piece that evolves over the weeks. Community participation could also be enhanced by individuals working on personal pieces or having a hand in a communal work of art, she said.

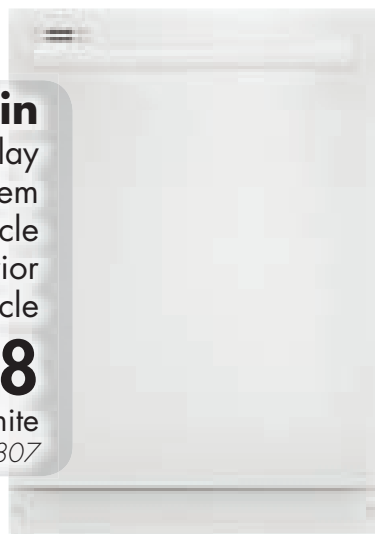

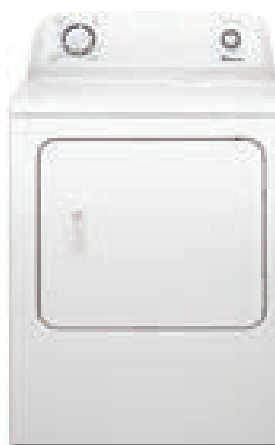

An afternoon concert featured the music of the 1920s and earlier, courtesy of the Sean Stanley Sextet and vocalist Miss Dior of Toronto.

The ghost of William Finlayson, who as Ontario's minister of Lands and Forests oversaw construction of the highway, addressed visitors.

Actor Roger Sumner delivered excerpts of a speech made by Finlayson to the Empire Club of Canada in Toronto in late 1927 that expounded on Northern Ontario's potential.

**TOUR**

As part of the celebrations, a detailed map has been produced of the Ferguson Highway and its successor, Highway 11, between North Bay and the Timiskaming-Cochrane boundary.

It identifies, by kilometre markings on Highway 11, the location of attractions, historical points of interest, and significant geological sites.

It also locates original stretches of the Ferguson Highway.

They include the former Highway 11B through Cobalt, Haileybury and New Liskeard and the Tonomo and Wilson Lake roads south of Temagami.

Gambles is also advocating for the Temiskaming Rift Valley to become a UNESCO-recognized geopark.

He hoped that the recent event will also raise the profile of the Rockwalk Park, which displays samples of geological history from Temiskaming and beyond.

He sees the park as a potential venue for concerts and other community events.

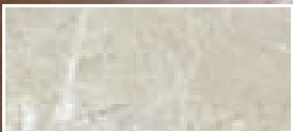

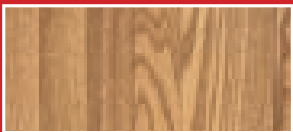
